## **From the Pastors**

Dear Parish Family,

In his First Apology, Justin Martyr, a Christian teacher in Rome of the Second Century, explains that Christians gather for the Eucharist on the first day of the week; because, God created the universe by "transforming darkness and matter" on it; and, on the first day of the week, Christ rose from the dead. "When the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb." (Mark 16: 1-2 ESV) Instead of the Sabbath, the seventh day, Sunday, the first day of the week, has been our day of worship. In his excellent book, *Introduction to* Liturgical Theology, Alexander Schmemann, to whom I (Pastor Mike) am indebted for inspiring this article and the poem which it includes, explains that early Christians called the Lord's Day, the Eighth Day. He elaborates the idea that the Eighth Day represents both our Eucharistic celebrations on the first day of the week and the Day when the Kingdom will come in its fullness. (See Alexander Schmemann, Introduction to Liturgical Theology, Chapter Two, especially the subchapter "The Lord's Day and the Sabbath," Saint Vladimir's Seminary Press, Crestwood New Jersey, Translation Copyright by Ashleigh Moorehouse, 1966).

Easter is celebrated on a Sunday, the first day, the Lord's Day and the Eighth Day. The *Book of Common Prayer 1928* under "Tables and Rules for the Movable and Immovable Feasts" tells us how Easter is calculated. "Easter Day, on which the rest depend, is always the First Sunday after the Full Moon, which happens upon or next after the Twenty-first day of March; and if the Full Moon happen upon a Sunday, Easter Day is the Sunday after." The rubric (instruction on how and when to conduct worship services) in the *Lutheran Book of Worship* pertaining to the date of Easter reads, "Easter Day is always the first Sunday after the full moon that falls on or after March 21. Easter cannot occur before March 22 or after April 25." *(Lutheran Book of Worship Ministers Desk Edition, p. 13).* Easter is the Feast of Feasts and the Queen of Feasts. Our faith centers on the redemption won for us by Jesus Christ our Lord in His death and resurrection, called the Paschal Mystery.

We prepare for Easter by a Lenten observance that developed in the early Christian centuries. Lent is a special time of penitence and renewal in preparation for the feast day of the Resurrection of Our Lord. During this time we are called to fasting, prayer, and the giving of alms. It is a time of spiritual warfare against the world, the flesh, and the devil. (See *Lutheran Book of Worship Ministers Desk Edition*, p. 129) We do the same at other times; but, Lent has served as a special time to focus on these practices and this struggle. It is a special time to return to the Lord in repentance. "Return

to the Lord, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love." (Liturgy of Holy Communion, *Lutheran Book of Worship*, text from Joel 2: 13) External practice should be a concomitant to a renewed heart in the believer.

Every Sunday, the Lord's Day or Eighth Day, is a weekly festive observance of the Resurrection of our Lord. For this reason, Sundays are "in Lent," not "of Lent." The Sundays from Easter to Pentecost, however, are "of Easter." Every Sunday is a little Easter. Sunday is a festival, not a fast. However, Western Christians have varied in their Lenten observance on Sunday. Some fast; some feast on Sundays. The liturgy during Lent indicates that Sundays are set within a penitential season. Alleluias and the canticle, *Gloria in excelsis*, are not sung during the five Sundays of Lent and the Sunday of the Passion (Palm Sunday). The liturgical color is the penitential color of purple. Lent is forty days long. Add the Sundays, and there are forty-six days in the period between Ash Wednesday and Easter.

We celebrate the Lord's Day, the great Eighth Day, in Lent and outside of Lent, anticipating and praying for the return of the Lord. The Eighth Day will come in fullness with the passing of the Old Aeon (THE OLD AGE) of sin and death and the coming of the New Aeon (THE NEW AGE), brought about by Christ's return. (see Schmemann)

"Come, Lord Jesus," the Church prays.

The poem/song takes us from creation to final redemption. The Sabbath, or Seventh Day, the day of rest, mentioned in the second stanza, takes up the eschatological (pertaining to the End) theme of the final rest of the people of God described in Hebrews 4. Stanzas three and four focus on the Eighth Day, the day of our weekly Eucharistic celebrations on Sunday, the Lord's Day, and of eschatological fulfillment when Jesus Christ our Lord returns. Both Sacraments are mentioned: Baptism in verse three and the Eucharist in verse four. We are a people awaiting the fulfillment of the Eighth Day through Jesus Christ.

We celebrate a little Easter every Sunday in Lent and in all seasons, and we practice a penitential discipline during the Forty Days as we look to the celebration of Easter, the Queen of Feasts, on April 20 and beyond to the fulfillment of the Eighth Day in the Kingdom of God.

During your Lenten devotions, stop by the library book cart in Fellowship Hall for a book to help you prepare for Easter. Don't forget to bring your children — we have books for every age.



# **Forgiveness and Release**

The texts covered in Genesis 42; 45:1-15; and 50:15-21 reveal the multiple emotions that Joseph and his family encountered as they moved toward forgiveness and reconciliation. The story of Joseph's reconciliation with his family fills most of the remaining chapters of Genesis 42-50. Because we do not study the account in detail, you might benefit from reading through the remaining chapters in order to assist you in grasping the intensity of the process.

Jesus came not only to restore the relationship between God and us but also to reconcile us to each other. The biblical concept of reconciliation carries with it the need for healed relationships. The purpose of this chapter is to put Joseph forward as an example of releasing his bitterness toward those who betrayed him and giving them --and himself-- a fresh start.

In preparation for your circle, think about whom in your life and past do you need to forgive? Ask God what steps you need to take toward inner healing and, if possible, healing the relationship.

# Why are Lilies the Flower of Easter?

More than any other flower, the Easter lily is the traditional, time-honored flower of Easter. Symbolic of the resurrection, Easter Lilies rise from earthly

graves as scaly bulbs, and bloom into majestic flowers that embody the purity, virtue, innocence, hope and resurrection they symbolize.

Dating back to Biblical times, the lily is mentioned numerous times in the Bible. One of the most famous Biblical references is in the Sermon on the Mount, when Christ told His listeners: "Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they toil not, neither do they spin; and yet ... Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these."

Tradition has it that when Eve left the Garden of Eden, she shed real tears of repentance, and from those remorseful tears sprang up the lilies of Easter. These lilies sprang up to remind Eve that God would never forget that He had promised Adam and Eve that He would send the Messiah to defeat "that ancient serpent" who had deceived them into disobedience.

The pure white lily has long been associated with the baby Jesus and Mary, his mother. In ancient paintings, the Angel Gabriel is pictured extending to the Virgin Mary a branch of pure white lilies, announcing that she is to be the mother of the Christ Child. In other paintings, saints are pictured bringing vases full of white lilies to Mary and the infant Jesus, prefiguring His resurrection.

Often called the "white-robed apostles of hope," lilies were found growing in the Garden of Gethsemane after Christ's agony. Tradition has it that the beautiful white lilies sprang up where drops of Christ's sweat fell to the ground in His final hours of sorrow and deep distress. Churches continue this tradition at Easter time by banking their altars and surrounding their crosses with masses of Easter Lilies, to commemorate the resurrection of Jesus Christ and hope of eternal life.

The majestic white flower has so thoroughly come to symbolize the Resurrection of Christ, that the phrase "to gild the lily" has come into common usage meaning "a foolish attempt to improve on perfection." To many artists and poets it has seemed that, if any flower could have one, the Easter lily would have a soul.

#### **Enjoy Your Lilies for Years to Come!**

Once all danger of frost has passed, you can move your lilies to a sunny location outside.

To plant your Easter lilies, prepare a well-drained garden bed in a sunny location with rich organic matter (one part soil, one part peat moss, one part perlite). Good drainage is the key for success with lilies. Plant your bulbs 3 inches below ground level, and at least 12-18 inches apart in a hole sufficiently deep that the bulbs can be placed in it with the roots spread out and down. Spread the roots and work the prepared soil around the bulbs and roots, leaving no air pockets. Water immediately and thoroughly after planting.

As the original plants die back, cut the stems back to the soil surface. New growth will soon emerge. Your lilies will bloom again **NEXT YEAR IN JULY**. It is possible that they could bloom again later this summer, but most likely you will have to wait until the summer after this one to see your lilies bloom again. (It is only under controlled greenhouse conditions that these bulbs can be forced to bloom in March or April.)

The Easter Lily is surprisingly hardy, even in cold climates. Just be sure to provide winter protection for your bulbs by mulching them generously. Remember: Lilies like their roots in the shade t
