From the Pastors

Dear Parish Family,

The Temple was a building in Jerusalem where God's glory dwelt in the midst of Israel. It was a place of sacrifice to God, administered by the high priest and the entire priesthood. Today, this great building, first constructed by Solomon, rebuilt after the Exile, and enlarged and elaborated by King Herod, is gone. On the site now stand two Mosques of Islam, Al Aqsa and the Dome of the Rock.

In his great prayer at the dedication of the Temple in Jerusalem, King Solomon recognized that God cannot be confined to a Temple. "But will God indeed dwell on the earth? Behold, heaven and the highest heaven cannot contain you; how much less this house that I have built!" (I Kings 8: 27 ESV)

Saint Stephen, the first Christian martyr, in his address to the Council in Jerusalem said, "... it was Solomon who built a house for him. Yet the Most High does not dwell in houses made by hands ..." (Acts 7: 47-48 ESV)

Jesus told the Samaritan woman that worship in the future would not take place on the mountain where her people worship or in Jerusalem. "But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and in truth, for the Father is seeking such people to worship him. God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth." (John 4: 23-4 ESV) Earlier in the Gospel of John, Jesus cleansed the Temple. In John the cleansing of the Temple is placed near the beginning of the Gospel after the wedding at Cana, rather than after Jesus' entry into Jerusalem before His death. Jesus said to His opponents when they demanded a sign after the cleansing, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." They misunderstood what Jesus said, thinking that he was referring to the Temple built with human hands. What Jesus meant was that the Temple was His own body, which after three days would be raised from the dead. It is in Christ that the glory of God is to be found. It is Christ who is the Word and the Son of the Father who is to be worshipped.

We too are called the Temple of God. Paul writes in the Corinthian correspondence. "Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy him. For God's temple is holy, and you are that temple." (I Corinthians 3: 16-17 ESV) The Church is the temple of God in which the Holy Spirit dwells. It is the indwelling Spirit who makes us holy. Later Paul warns against sexual immorality. He asks the Corinthians, "... do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body." (I Corinthians 6: 19-20 ESV) In II Corinthians, Paul admonishes the Church against being yoked with unbelievers: "Do not be unequally yoked with unbelievers. For what partnership has righteousness with lawlessness? Or what fellowship has light with darkness? What accord has Christ with Belial? Or what portion does a believer share with an unbeliever? What agreement has the temple of God with idols? For we are the temple of the living God; ... " (II Corinthians 6: 14-16a ESV) Then Paul quotes a passage from Leviticus where it is stated that God dwells among His people. The covenant formula follows: "... I will be their God, and they shall be my people." The passage appeals to the people to separate from the idolaters.

The heavenly temple appears in Revelation; yet at the end of the book, the prophet John writes, "And I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gives it light, and its lamp is the Lamb." (Revelation 21: 22-23 ESV)

Christ is tried on the Day of Preparation for the Passover. At the time of the judgment of Jesus by Pilate, the narrator notes that it was the Day of Preparation for Passover around noon. The Passover lambs are being slaughtered in the Temple for the observance. The Lamb who takes away the sin of the world is the same as the "... Lamb standing, as though it had been slain, with seven horns and with seven eyes, ..." (Revelation 5: 6 ESV)

In this Easter season, may we raise our thanksgiving and praise to God for our salvation in Christ, the Lamb of God, and remember our identity as the temple of the living God who worships the Temple, Jesus Christ, Word of God and Son of God, in whom the glory of God shines.

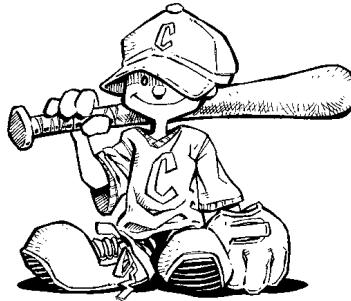

Joseph: How God Builds Character by Paul Borthwick.
May Topic:
Perseverance

Finishing the race is a major theme in the Bible, especially in the New Testament. The book of Hebrews was written primarily to encourage people not to quit their faith. The book of Revelation came to early Christians as an encouragement to persevere through the horrors of persecution by reminding them that God was the ultimate victor in human history. Jesus himself urged us to "endure to the end" and reminded us that the ultimate measure of success is faithfulness. Joseph exemplifies faithfulness and endurance, but it takes some digging into the text to discover this message.

The purpose of this last chapter is to encourage faithful endurance in following God toward his purposes for our lives. In the opening chapter of the book of Daniel, the Bible reads, "Daniel remained there," referring to his captivity. Another translation states, "Daniel *lasted* there." He demonstrated staying power. As a slave in three empires under four kings, Daniel lasted as a godly man until he died, well into his eighties. William Carey, the so-called father of modern missions, was asked the secret of his success in serving over forty years in India. He answered, "I can plod."

This month we will read selections from chapters 37 through 50 of Genesis and from Acts 7: 9-16. If you read the entire story of Joseph, it's easy to see his life as compressed into short bursts of serving, leading and forgiving. But Joseph's story spreads out over decades, thus teaching us something about Joseph's stick-to-it-iveness.

In preparation for the completion of our bible study on the story of Joseph, think about what disciplines of the spiritual life do you have the most difficulty maintaining because you don't see their impact on your daily life.

Social Ministry Committee

- 12,000 children are born into poverty in the Delaware Valley each year.
- Often, these children are raised by caregivers who are not their mothers, which means they must purchase expensive formula. If they cannot afford this formula, the babies may receive watered-down formula or sugar water. They might also receive solid food before their bodies can process it.
- Young children, too may receive “junk” foods that are less expensive, and less nutritious, when they are hungry. This puts them at risk for malnutrition.

The effects of childhood malnutrition can be lifelong and may include:

- Depression
 - Slowed cognitive development
 - Delayed physical development
 - Anemia
 - Weakened immune system
 - Delay in growth milestones like first words, first steps
 - Diminished focus in school
 - Heightened rate of childhood mortality

- Baby Manna has been collecting money to support these babies and children for 13 years, and has raised over half a million dollars to help them succeed in the early years of life.
 - Philabundance can provide formula and kid-friendly healthy foods at a fraction of the cost our clients would pay at the supermarket. Earl & Judi Reeder's Road to Estonia – Part 1

Like a river, our road to Estonia this August has many tributaries, some we took separately and some we have done together.

When Earl was growing up in Bordentown, NJ, his parents invited visiting missionaries to the house for dinner and discussions.

Earl graduated from Eastern Baptist College (now Eastern University) where he came in contact with several students who intended to enter the mission field.

Judi's initial interest in mission began when she attended a 'work camp' in ND one summer, painting a conference center and spending weekends on local Indian reservations. One of the chaperones was on his way to Honduras as a Missionary that fall. In later years in high school the idea of being a missionary was researched and subsequently abandoned as she wanted a family and felt that the mission field was no place to raise children.

Fast forward to the early 2000's in NJ. Judi accompanied a group of teens and adults to WV on a one week Mission Trip working with folks whose houses had been damaged by recent flooding, running a vacation Bible School and writing a program to keep track of lenders and books in a local library.

In 2005 we both accompanied our Korean pastor and several of his Paraguayan congregants on a trip to Asuncion Paraguay to work with orphans, run medical and dental clinics and prepare a field where some local Korean missionaries were going to construct a church. Earl returned in 2006.

Also in 2005, Earl accompanied our then pastor to Pristina, Kosovo for a week of visiting Kosovar families and worshiping with them while accompanied by translators and Missouri Synod Mission directors from USA, England and mainland Europe. Our mission team also visited mission sites and met with political leaders to clear the way for more mission projects in Kosovo. This was the first time Earl came in contact with people who had lived under communism for more than a generation and fought in the Balkan wars in the 1990's against the Serbs. The next summer, we both spent several days in Pristina getting to know several families as well as you can when there is a large language gap.

In 2006, we took a river-boat trip from Budapest to Bucharest on the Danube, traveling through parts of Croatia, Serbia, Bulgaria and Romania. We stayed on in Bucharest and spent three days with a friend of a friend who knew English. We were able to talk to him about some of the challenges of self-government again.

In 2010 at the Convocation in Columbus Ohio, there were several mission groups presenting workshops. We attended the one given by Bill Moberly, who is the president of Eastern European Mission Network (EEMN). We were impressed with the work Bill was doing in Ukraine, Latvia, Estonia and Russia. He was able to help us understand better some of the things we had seen and heard in the Eastern European countries we had visited.

We have since toured Slovenia, Croatia, Albania and Montenegro and continue to be fascinated with the people and the struggle they are going through. While under Communism, the people are trained to do what they are told, so the ability to imagine another life is denied them. When Communism goes away, the communists don't, and when there are elections, it is the communists that have the imagination and presence to run for office – in the Labor Party or the Socialist Party. Encouraging the current generation to rediscover the ability to imagine is hugely important. Our 50th anniversary is this July and we decided last summer that we would celebrate it with a mission trip to Estonia with EEMN if they would accept us. They did and we are now looking forward to starting the training that comes with such a commitment. Please pray for us and the people of Estonia as we undertake this journey.
