#### From the Pastors

Dear Parish Family,

When we pray, the Spirit is praying deep within our hearts. Paul says that because we are sons and daughters of God and heirs, not slaves, we possess the Spirit of the Son, crying in our hearts "Abba, Father." (Galatians 4: 6-7) In his letter to the Romans, Paul expresses the same thought. We are not slaves; but, sons and daughters, who by the Spirit of God cry out "Abba! Father!" (Romans 8:15 ff) Abba is an intimate Aramaic form of address to one's father. We Christians are called to regard the Lord of the universe as our Father. Jesus commands us to pray, "Our Father, who art in heaven..."

The Holy Spirit is in the heart of every Christian. We receive the gift of the Spirit in our Baptism. In this Sacrament, "God forgives sin, delivers from death and the devil, and gives everlasting salvation to all who believe what He has promised." (Martin Luther, *The Small Catechism.* Fortress, Philadelphia, 1979, p. 23) Paul writes that to live according to the flesh (sinful nature) is death, but to live according to the Spirit is life and peace. (Romans 8:6 ff)

God, the Holy Spirit, who proceeds from the Father through the Son, is our constant companion in our struggle against the flesh. Paul reminds us that the Spirit bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God and heirs with Christ (Romans 8: 16-17). We receive wonderful encouragement from the workings of the Holy Spirit.

#### New Directions for the "Diane Throws" Rectangles

- Rectangles will measure 8 inches by 55 inches
- Each row uses a knit stitch
- Please make sure that the length is measured on a flat surface to ensure its size
- Use size 8 knitting needles
- Use 2 ply yarn
- Cast on 40 stitches
- Adjust # of stitches so the 40 stitches=8 inches

## Panzo in Mission

#### Activities during home assignment

We are now safely back in Ecuador and are resuming the work but from March to June we were on 'home assignment.' Since this was our first such experience, we didn't know exactly what to expect. We only knew that we would be visiting churches that sponsored us or churches who were willing to hear about our mission experiences. What follows is a summary of our visits where we met many amazing people of God.

We visited Lord of life Lutheran Church in Memphis, Tennessee. Pastor Bill White was very instrumental in organizing this visit and we were able to share about the mission work and what God is doing in own personal lives.



We were invited to the potluck on Friday evening and we shared with a significant group of adults.

We received good feedback from the participants and they prayed with us at the end. On Saturday we were invited to be a part of the barbecue picnic organized by the leadership of BFLC. In the afternoon Serafina shared with BFLC women about how she and Paz y Esperanza work with women.

On Sunday I preached in two services and shared between services over the Sunday School hour. That afternoon we gathered with young adults from 8th to 12th grades. Was very interesting to see how young people can catch the mission vision. The visit at BFLC was a blessing for all of us.

After Colorado we visited the office of 'One in Mission' – a group that is established in many parts Africa – to see if we can build relationship with them if ever we return to Africa on a permanent basis. After this we returned to the WMPL Minneapolis office for debriefing and evaluation.

During the first week of June, we had the opportunity to participate in the WMPL missionary retreat at Hunky Dory Farms Resort near Balsam Lake, Wisconsin. It is a WMPL tradition to meet there for teaching, encouragement, and fellowship with our colleagues from different fields, retired missionaries and the incoming missionaries who are preparing for missionary service. Was a joyful, empowering and blessed moment. We spent time all together for the glory of our God and for the sake of His Gospel.

We were so encouraged to see that we aren't alone in the field, but yes it is people who never fail to pray for us for God's protection and provision. Thank be to God.

Our last visit was with St Paul Lutheran Church, our Minnesota home church. We shared during Sunday School and individually as people wanted to find out about us and the mission. On Sunday, June 29th, at the end of the service the Pastors and the elders of the congregation prayed for us and encouraged us to go to begin our new assignment. Again praise be to our God.

Crusades Course: You don't have to don armor and cross deserts to learn about the

Crusades! Come join Pastor Mandy's class and learn why these wars began, why they continued so long, and how their impact on the world still resonates. Pastor Mandy will lead a 10-Week course on the Crusades on Tuesdays, Sept 2 – Nov 4, 2014 at 1:00 pm with repeat at 7:00 pm.

Participants will look at the long war between Christianity and Islam, with focus on the issues and the "major players" (Richard the Lion Heart, Louis IX, Frederick II, Saladin, Zengi and Nur ed-Din). We will look at the campaigns and conditions of this centuries-long conflict. In this course, you will learn about an era when chivalry and brutality reigned side by side. You will learn about the creation of such items as chastity belts, razors, stained glass, perfume, the cross bow, the compass, and public latrines. We will look at the origins of such Holy Orders as the Knights Templar, the Hospitallers, and the Teutonic Knights and the roles they played during the Crusades. Our textbook

There is a family in Uganda who has been transformed as a result of receiving shoebox gifts. This family has been through a lot of challenges because the parents lost their jobs. When their children received their boxes, they were greatly encouraged and have started coming to church. They were touched by the gift of love their children received from people they have never met.

"My son, Brent Elrod, died in a hiking accident on October, 10, 2013. He was student Pastor at Pathway Church in Powdersville, South Carolina. 
