From the Pastors

Dear Parish Family,

How wonderful and mysterious is the world in which we live! God has done marvelous things. We live and stand before His holy majesty, though hidden from our eyes until the end of time. Yet, "The heavens declare the glory of God and the sky above proclaims His handiwork." (Psalm 19: 1 ESV) The odds of our coming into existence were small, but here we are in this Christmastide, celebrating the birth of the Son of the Most High God, a title for Jesus given in the announcement of the angel Gabriel to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Here we are immersed in the joy of being God's children through our redemption in Jesus Christ.

The Blessed Virgin Mary rejoiced in the *Magnificat* (a song we also sing), a title from the first word of the Latin version. Elizabeth told her cousin Mary that when she heard Mary's greeting, the unborn John leaped with joy in her womb. Elizabeth blessed Mary for believing the message of Gabriel. Mary responded in joyous song. "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my savior; … (Luke 1: 46-47 ESV) What tears of joy must have embraced her cheek!

The soon to be virgin mother obediently accepted the Word of the Lord through Gabriel. "And Mary said, 'Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be according to your word." (Luke 1: 38 ESV) Elizabeth told her, "And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her from the Lord."

When Mary and Joseph presented Jesus in the Temple, they encountered Simeon, who took up the child into his arms and sang the song that we also sing, called in Latin the *Nunc Dimittis*. Simeon told them, "Behold, this child is appointed for the fall and rising of many in Israel, and for a sign that is opposed (and a sword will pierce through your own soul also), so that thoughts from many hearts may be revealed." (Luke 2: 34 ESV) In her song, Mary sang, "... he (God) has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts; he has brought down the mighty from their thrones and exalted those of humble estate.;" (Luke 1: 51b-52 ESV) What tears of grief must have fallen on the cheek of Mary when her son died on the cross, what tears of joy when she received word of His resurrection.

Mary pondered the message of the angel and all the great events surrounding the birth of Jesus. So much more did she have to ponder through and beyond the day she sat with that company in the upper room that would take the message of the Gospel to the world. (Acts 1) In the midst of astounding events she was faithful to the Lord.

Like Mary we have been brought Good News. Jesus Christ, the Son of the Most High God, has given us salvation. We rejoice in the birth of Christ. We weep at His death, but our weeping is quickly turned to joy at the thought of His resurrection.

During this Christmastide, may we know anew the joy of Jesus' birth. May we also reflect on the child as "a sign that is opposed...so that thoughts from many hearts may be revealed." (Luke 2: 34b-35 ESV) We think of Christ's enemies including Satan himself working against His mission. Yet in the end Christ's suffering and crucifixion result in victory and joy. The crucifixion is itself a victory, for Jesus died as a ransom for us sinners.

May the joy of the Gospel be strengthened in our hearts during the twelve days of Christmas and may we be faithful disciples like Mary as we travel through this world.







- Rectangles will measure 8 inches by 55 inches
- Each row uses a knit stitch
- Please make sure that the length is measured on a flat surface to ensure its size
- Use size 8 knitting needles
- Use 4 ply yarn
- Cast on 40 stitches
- Adjust # of stitches so the 40 stitches=8 inches






