#### **From the Pastors**

Dear Parish Family,

When you make a key decision in your life, how much does Christ play a part? In the life of a disciple, Christ must lead the way. Two words are central to the theme of discipleship in the Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark, and Luke). They are **disciple** and **follow** with the latter word of action defining the noun, disciple. To be a **disciple** means **to follow** Jesus Christ. What does it mean specifically to follow Jesus Christ? Here is a list of texts (ESV) from Mark that help answer the question. "Follow me and I will make you fishers of men." (Mark 1:17)

"Follow me and I will make you fishers of men." (Mark 1:17) "But those that were sown on the good soil are the ones who hear the word and accept it and bear fruit, thirtyfold and sixty fold and a hundredfold." (Mark 4:20)

"If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me." (Mark 8: 34)

"...whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be slave of all. For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve and give his life as a ransom for many." (Mark 10: 43-45)

When you make decisions in your life remember a few basic things from these passages:

- 1. Work to bring others to Christ.
- 2. Bear fruit (act in obedience to Christ).
- 3. Know that bearing the cross, i.e. suffering is part of being a disciple.
- 4. Serve others.

Most importantly, all the disciple's service is based on Christ's own self-giving. He is ransom for many, a sacrifice for the sins of the world. He said at the Last Supper, "This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many." (Mark 14:24) God's mercy and compassion in Christ precede the fruit we bear.

When you make important decisions in your life, let Christ lead the way. Those who have been ransomed, bear fruit.



We realize that many of you have had your old number for many years – have it memorized and have grown fond of it!


That being said, all things come to an end and it is time to say goodbye to your old number & welcome in a **NEW NUMBER!**

If you wish to participate, be sure to bring a votive candle with you from home. Your votive candle must be in a glass votive candle holder.


(Suggested colors for the glass candle holder are clear, red, or white.)



#### The Right Time



## ATIME FOR GIVING

There are all sorts of very good reasons why **now** is just not the right time to give to the Church.

When people are kids, they don't have any money except the little bit they earn at home or at minimum wage. So that's not the right time to give.

Once the kids are in school and college, people **definitely** don't have any money, so that's not the right time to give.

Even after the kids are out of college and the house is paid for, people still can't give because they're saving for retirement.

And once people are retired, they're living on a fixed income. That means there's less to live on every year. So that's not the right time to give either.

In fact, it's never the right time.

But on the other hand, there are all sorts of reasons why it's **always** the right time to give.

When people are kids, they're filled with idealism. Since they know the Church is working to make the world a better place, they give.

And when people are just starting out, they believe you can live on love -- and the Church teaches about that kind of love loose in the world. So they give.

When the kids are in school and college, worship is the only place where people can find some time to get in touch with God and their real selves. So they give.

Once the kids are grown and gone, people think a lot about the meaning of life and what they're going to do with what's left of their own. Through the church, God keeps reminding them there's life after mid-life. So they give.

And after people retire, they have the time to act on the idealism of their youth. By now, they've known God for a long time. They are grateful for the way God has walked with them through the trials they have had to face. It's the Church that has always lifted up the goodness and love of God. So they give.

In fact, for some people, it's **always** the right time to give. But I guess that's the way time works for most of us -- either it's never the right time to give or it's always the right time to give ... What time is it for you?



#### Simply Giving

What is Simply Giving? It is a convenient, safe, and simple way for you to handle church offerings through electronic fund transfers directly from your checking or savings account. This automated program allows payments to be deposited directly into Holy Trinity's account on a steady, uninterrupted basis, providing the church with greater financial stability, less bookkeeping, and more confidence in meeting financial obligations. Many people already know how convenient electronic fund transfers are in paying bills and simplifying their records.

How does Simply Giving work? Church members who wish to give their offering through electronic transfer fill out a Member Enrollment and Authorization Form, indicating the amount they wish to have withdrawn and the frequency B weekly (Monday), semimonthly (1<sup>st</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>), or monthly (1<sup>st</sup> or 15<sup>th</sup>). They also attach a voided check or savings deposit slip. These forms may be placed in the

Jehoiada Chest at a service on the second Sunday in November, turned in to the church office, or placed in the offering plate at any time. The church submits this information to Vanco Services, LLC, a Minnesota-based financial-technology services company.

Who sees the information on the Member Enrollment and Authorization Form? The church secretary and financial secretary process these forms for Holy Trinity and keep this information confidential. Vanco Services, LLC employees who process the information at their end are bonded and have signed confidentiality agreements. None of the participant information is shared with any other organization.

How much does this program cost?

All Simply Giving transaction fees are paid by
Holy Trinity Lutheran Church. Donors pay
nothing to use this service.

Is there a minimum amount? Yes. \$5 is the minimum amount per transaction.

If participants have a joint signature account, do both parties need to sign the form? Only one signature is required.

How do participants change the amount, account and/or frequency of their contribution, and how quickly is it processed? You can change the amount, the account from which it is withdrawn, and/or the frequency of withdrawal by completing a new authorization form. You request this form from the church office, fill it out, and return it. If you are changing the account, you must also attach a voided check or withdrawal slip. Within a week, your request is faxed and processed.

When and where should I turn in my Member Enrollment and

Authorization Form? You may bring your completed form with the attached voided check or deposit slip to one of the worship services during Commitment Weekend, the second weekend in November. A time will be provided at each worship service to place your information in the Jehoiada chest. Or you may place your information in the offering plate at any worship service that is convenient for you. Or you may bring it to the church office at any time.

How do participants keep a record of the amounts they have contributed? The participant's bank statement will include an itemized list of all electronic fund transfers from their account. A record of these transactions will also be provided on annual offering statements.


What if a transaction is rejected due to non-sufficient funds, closed account, etc.? This information will be emailed or faxed to the congregation immediately after Vanco Services, LLC receives notification from the bank. The church financial secretary will contact the person to determine together how to proceed.

What are some banking advantages for using electronic fund transfers for church contributions? Electronic fund transfers are safe, reliable, and convenient. All such transfers are governed by strict national rules and guidelines set by the Automated Clearing House Network and

governed by Regulation E of the Federal Reserve. More than four billion electronic fund transfers are processed annually in the United States. This process is more efficient, more secure, and less expensive than credit card transactions and more efficient and timely than check collection.

Some years ago, our Church Council and finance-people examined this program and found it to be a good one. Since then Simply Giving has been offered as a way that members could support Holy Trinity's ministries.

Our financial gifts through the Church are a response to God's abundant gifts to us. Ministries flourish at Holy Trinity because of your faithful giving in response to the gifts of God.





#### Commitment Weekend will be November 7 & 8, 2015

What do we mean by the term Commitment Weekend? It is the name we use for the Weekend on which we return our Pledge Card for the support of the church program in the New Year beginning in January.

**How do I get a** *Pledge Card?* You will get one via e-mail during October. Others will be available in the narthex.

Why should I return a Pledge Card? Can't I just put my offering in the offering plate at worship? The church has many expenses for curriculum materials, heat, light, building upkeep, salaries, insurance and other things. These expenses must be budgeted in order that we may know what kind of program of worship, fellowship, education, music, evangelism and other parts of our witness can be carried out -- and what we can do for others. Unless our members decide in advance the amount they can give we can't plan an effective ministry.

What if I return a Pledge Card and then suffer financial reverses during the year that make it impossible to pay that amount? The Church is the Body of Christ; it is not a loan company. If circumstances you did not foresee make it necessary to reduce or even cancel the amount you thought you could give, all you need to do is to tell God. True Christians also make adjustments upward when their incomes are increased or they receive unexpected additional income during the year.

Will I be solicited personally in my home? No. You will never receive a telephone call or visitor soliciting you for money. You will receive e-mails that we hope you will read carefully and prayerfully.


Does this church talk about money all the time? No. This church is not always talking about money. The church is always talking about Jesus Christ. It is only with money that the program of the church as we know it today can continue to exist.

Why does the church ask for an increase in giving from each of us every year? Every year deeply committed Christians who gave substantially either die, experience grave financial reverses, or move to other communities. It is only with new and increased pledges that we can replace this loss. We especially hope that those who give \$5 a week or less will increase their giving by \$2 or more a week.

How much should I give? Did you know that Holy Trinity presently receives offerings from approximately 320 households. Of these, 240 households give \$1 - \$25 per week. If each of these households were to increase their giving by \$2.00 per week, Holy Trinity would have \$20,000 more per year. The remaining 80 households give more than \$25 per week. If each of these households were to increase their giving by \$5.00 per week, we'd have another \$20,000. A small amount from many families would make a huge difference to Holy Trinity for next year's budget.







An email update from Didi Panzo

Dear Brothers and sister in the Lord Jesus,

We are glad to be back in the USA after our one month trip to Africa. The purpose of the trip was to visit our families in Angola-Cabinda, especially to spend time with my mother and siblings after the death of my father that occurred August 7<sup>th</sup> and he was buried August 10<sup>th</sup> of 2015. Also to do a mission site survey in the Democratic Republic of the Congo where we will be serving next as missionaries. It was a good trip with positive outcomes. Below you will find information related to the trip.

#### 1. In Angola

- besides being in the midst of the family and comforting my mother and siblings, I had the opportunity to visit the General Secretary of the Christian Council of Churches in Angola of whom we exchanged words of encouragement for future collaboration between the Christian Council of Churches and the World Mission Prayer League.
- I also visited the General Secretary of the Evangelical Church of Angola who is the founder and owner of a Christian Pacific University that trains church leaders in Nursing Science, computer engineering, psychology, Social work Science, Theology and accounting. His interest is how missionaries from WMPL can be useful in mentoring their students in the field of their expertise and also through teaching to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. The University is well prepared to receive missionaries with housing and transportation. Let us continue to pray for this collaboration opportunity between the south and the north.


#### 2. In the DRC

- Crossing the border from Angola to the DRC, I had a chance to meet with a Pastor called Kudulu who is doing some Christian Social Project at the town of Muanda that is at the coast of the DRC.
  Muanda is situated at 80 miles from Boma, the city where we will be based for mission work.
  Pastor Kudulu owns an orphanage and a Kinesitherapy center to help orphans and those born with bones disability or some problems that affect their bodies. He has a strong ministry as he himself was born crippled and raised in a Christian orphanage where in his adult age he was able to get a theological education. His will is that WMPL can partner with them in sending missionaries who are available to teach, mentor, and inspire young orphans for a Christian life through Bible Study, Biblical camps and other Christian activities that may help them to grow spiritually. The Orphanage in in partnership with the Christian Community Development Network CCDN. Let us pray for God's guidance and discernment for future cooperation with this project.
- In Boma I met with the team of CCDN who will serve as our host in DRC. They shared about the opportunity of family transformation that is need in that side of the DRC. We visited some places out of the city of Boma where we will be focusing our program and also visited safe neighbors as a place to live. It is a challenge to find affordable housing but we are trusting that God will provide. We agreed that we can purchase our furniture locally and appliances and other items will be shipped from the USA. To find a good price and a good car was an issue as man of the cars are ten years old and very expensive. (cont. on pg. 15)

We decided not to prioritize the purchase of a car as we don't have enough funding. We will wait and continue to pray for God's provision or maybe the donation of a car with 4 x 4 wheels that is less than 9 years old and in good condition to ship to the DRC. Pray for it.

- I met with the Lutheran Bishop of the DRC and some key leaders who manifested the interest of having us there as missionaries. The topic of concern regarding families in dysfunction is a top priority in the DRC as they are so pleased that we can train Pastors and church leaders to bring back a family value that has been lost for many decades. Also with two other NALC Pastors from North Carolina, we conducted seminars in the Lutheran Church that took two days. One day was dedicated for women about forgiveness and reconciliation and the second day was dedicated to Pastors, Evangelists and other leaders of the church about The Church as Mission. Everyone seemed excited to have this training and requested that it could happen more.
- The Counseling center that we will be establishing on the West side of the DRC will bring a big impact for families, communities and the churches restoration as Christ will be at the center of the matter. Please pray that we can be there by mid-December and pray for God's provision. We are still in need of 2/3's of the total field settlement cost. Thanks for Black Forest Lutheran Church who already responded with 1/3 of the cost we trust that God will provide for the rest before the setting time.



#### Put Bibles in the Hands of Asian Believers

How often do you read your Bible? How often do you reference your Bible when you need to know how God's Word speaks to a concern? Imagine if you had no Bible access and had to rely on word of mouth. This is the situation for millions of Christians throughout Asia.


For the third year, Holy Trinity hopes to support the printing and distribution of Bibles to Christians in Asian through Asia Harvest. This is a 501(c) 3 nondenominational, nonprofit Christian organization with its U.S. base in North Carolina. It is able to print and distribute up to 230,000 Chinese Bibles alone per month, depending on incoming funds.

As of mid-October 2015, more than 9 million Bible have been printed and distributed to members of Chinese house churches throughout the country, and almost 600,000 Bibles have been printed and distributed to people groups in 68 other Asian languages, including the North Korean Bible project launched last year. Each Chines Bible costs just \$1.80 to print and distribute, and Bibles to other parts of Asia cost \$.2.70 each.

In China alone, it is estimated that 10-15,000 new believers come to Christ each day, or approximately 3.5–5 million per year, which results in a serious lack of Bibles for China. Asia Harvest partners with house church networks throughout China in a long-term goal to put Bibles in the hands of believers.

Please consider a contribution of any size so that a fellow brother or sister can be equipped with the Word of God as each one of us is. Perhaps a morning coffee could provide two or three Bibles! #### One Woman's Story

Pregnant, alone, and under threat of death, Achon stood firm in her faith. She chose Christ. Soon after declaring her choice, she watched her attackers suddenly flee the arriving Nigerian military. God stood with her in her time of need.

"Today, Achon continues to heal, both physically and emotionally, from the February 18<sup>th</sup> attack. Her left arm is still in a cast and she is haunted by memories of that terrifying day. Even as her wounds heal, Achon is caring for her newborn daughter, Amanwandi, whose name means 'God saved me.' She and her daughter will continue to face challenges, and she would be greatly encouraged to know that other believers are standing with her."


