From the Pastors

Dear Parish Family,

The Theological Conference, along with the Convocation of the North American Lutheran Church, was an incredible experience. This year's theme for Conference and Convocation was martyrdom. The word, martyr, in Greek literally means witness. In its Christian use the word means one who witnesses to faith in Christ unto death. The early Church was a Church of the Martyrs and so is the Church of today.

During both events speakers addressed the theme of martyrdom. One speaker related the story of Augustinian monks who during the Reformation were executed for their support of the evangelical teachings of Luther. Luther himself escaped their fate, largely because he was protected by the Elector of Saxony, but was ready to be a martyr. The most compelling speaker was an Assyrian Christian woman who resides in the United States and works for an organization that extends help to the persecuted Assyrian Christian Church in Iraq and elsewhere. She described the plight of these Christians and the murder and dislocation that ISIS has wrought against them. Their situation is desperate.

The Arabic letter nun has been placed on the doors of Assyrian Christians living in ISIS held areas of Iraq. Nun is the first letter in the name Nazarani, meaning Nazarenes or Christians. These Christians have had the choice of paying the tax imposed on non-Muslims, called Jizya, leaving their homes, or being killed. They will not renounce their Christian faith.

Fundamental questions at issue are whether Islam is inherently violent and whether there are moderates within it. In recent decades what we have experienced is violent Islam. Well-known scholar and speaker Robert Spencer, who spoke to the delegates and visitors at Dallas where we met, denied that moderate Islam exists. The Quran, the Muslim scriptures, encourages violence against those who oppose Islam. Spencer himself required body guards and the police to protect him while speaking to the Convocation.

What then should be the Christian attitude toward Islam? Luther's teaching of the two kingdoms helps us out here. The kingdom of the right is the Church; the kingdom of the left is the civil government. In this context left and right have nothing to do with political ideology. The kingdom of the right, the Church, must boldly witness to Jesus Christ, non-violently. We must witness even in the face of threat. We must not respond violently to Islamic aggression. We may become martyrs for our witness. Empowered by God Himself to protect its citizens, the kingdom of the left is given the responsibility to use force against the violence of internal and external enemies. The use of violence to protect against aggression is not the Church's task, but the government's.

The Church can do many things in the face of this crisis. We can provide aid to persecuted Christians; we can pray for them; and we can witness to Christ, as they do, no matter what the consequences. In a few weeks pins purchased from Saint Katherine Greek Orthodox Church, Naples, Florida, will be distributed after worship. On them is the letter nun with the words, "I too am a Nazarene." We hope every one of you will wear a pin as part of your witness to Christ.

The Beatitudes Matthew 5:3-10

During the 2015-16 activity year, Holy Trinity church women will be studying the Beatitudes in their Circles. These teachings come from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount found in Matthew. We will begin with an overall introduction to them in September and then delve into each of the eight Beatitudes, one at a time, in succeeding months.

We will see how these seemingly simple statements of what Jesus values in us can be quite complex and challenging, even unsettling as they speak to a way of thinking and acting that we need to cultivate. We will discuss the difficulties and rewards of trying to live according to these teachings of Jesus. Ultimately, we hope that through this study and practicing what we learn, we will dwell more deeply in the blessed life that Jesus has promised.

Every woman is cordially invited to be part of one of Holy Trinity's five women's circles. We meet once a month. Four Circles meet at the church while one meets in members' homes. 
Musica Concordia is our ecumenical choir. We perform four sacred concerts a year and rehearse for these on a TBA schedule. All are welcome.

I've climbed to the mountain top, And now my troubles all look small. They're so far down below me, I can hardly see them now at all.


I put my faith in the Lord, And what a relief it has been. I don't worry about tomorrow; I am trusting now in Him.

The Bible as The Norm of Faith




Sabbath Keeping: The Gift of Rest
