Brewster was dedicated to the faith of the Christian Church handed down over many centuries. He had a special spiritual gift for healing ministry and was involved in training people for this work. Brewster was charismatic, being filled with the Holy Spirit in the exercise of his gift of healing and his many other gifts.

Brewster was winsome, almost always cheerful. He knew the joy in the Lord. He had a great laugh and bore up well in adverse circumstances. His confidence was in the power of God which can never fail.

Brewster was a man of fervent prayer. He believed that prayer made a difference, that it had power to change the lives of believers. He led the local pastors in prayer once a month when we gathered for fellowship. He was a source of great inspiration.

Brewster was a writer who produced stories that became two books. His stories are themes on faith struggling against desire and the battle against the unseen world of evil. Brewster's writing arose out of his deep Christian faith.

Brewster was a sinner, and he knew it. He was also a saint, redeemed by the blood of Christ. He loved His Lord. Most certainly, the Lord Jesus loved him.

His chair can never be filled by anyone else. We feel the loss so deeply in our hearts. But, he is now in the loving arms of a merciful God. Thanks be to God!

We ring bells in obedience to God's command to "make a joyful noise," as a sign that something supernatural is happening in our midst, and as a way to celebrate the defeat of evil through the life, ministry, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. You are encouraged to ring your bells every time you hear (or sing) Gloria, "Holy, holy, holy", Praise, or any reference to joy, bells, singing, ringing, angels, celebration, or Jesus Christ.



Bright, flaming red, star-shaped Poinsettias are known as "The Flower of the Holy Night" or the "Flame Leaf Christmas Star" in the United States.

One of the most popular flowers in Central America, it was brought here by Dr. Joel Poinsett, the first US ambassador to Mexico, over 100 years ago. The legend of the Poinsettia also comes from Mexico and explains how this flower came to represent the deep love of innocent hearts shown, by poor children, for the Baby Jesus.

Once upon a time, two very poor children lived in a village in Mexico. They were a brother and sister named Maria and Pablo. Just like all the other children in the village, Maria and Pablo looked forward to the special Christmas parade and the annual Nativity play. During this Nativity play, a large manger scene was set up in the village church. All the children of the village marched in the Christmas parade to bring their presents to the Baby Jesus on Christmas Eve.

Maria and Pablo loved Jesus and the season of His birth very much, but they had no money to buy a gift for Him. That evening as they walked to join the other children in the Christmas parade, they took the long route in hopes that they might be able to find some flower blossoms to lay before the manger of the Christ Child. But they couldn't find any.

Although they were sad at heart and quite disheartened by their poverty, they picked the prettiest green leaves they could find, squared their shoulders, and joined the parade of children. The other children teased them cruelly for bringing "weeds" to the Christ Child, yet Pablo and Maria braved their way to the Nativity Scene, knelt in worship, and placed the greenery carefully around the manger. As the children lifted their heads, a miracle occurred. Bright red star-shaped flowers burst forth from the greens and were the most beautiful of all the gifts that the Christ Child had received that day.

At Annual Meeting this year, the first item of business will be the adoption of Rules of Procedure. This adoption of Rules of Procedure has always been done at the outset of every denominational or synodical convocation (LCA, ELCA, or NALC). This adoption needs only a simple majority and is done to make the meeting run smoothly. Among other things, The Rules of Procedure say that Holy Trinity's Annual Meeting will be governed by Roberts Rules of Order, that all speeches will be limited to three minutes, and that anyone can present a resolution but that this resolution must be presented in writing to the Committee on Reference and Counsel by 3:00 p.m. on the Monday immediately prior to Annual Meeting. At the time each resolution is presented to Annual Meeting, Reference and Counsel will advise the Annual Meeting as to whether or not the resolution should be adopted. Copies of these Rules of Procedure and Forms for Resolutions are available in the Narthex.


December Joseph: A Christmas Story







Small Surrenders - A Lenten Journey (January 10 - March 28, 2017)

This winter, Pastor Mandy is offering an 8 week course on Emilie Griffin's *Small Surrenders – a Lenten Journey.*

Last fall, a group of us absolutely fell in love with this author, teacher, spiritual director and poet as we studied her book on the beauty and difficulty of aging. So this winter, I am

offering an 8 week course on her book "Small Surrenders." (instead of Peter Holmes' book on fasting)

Emilie Griffin sets the tone for the overall reflection of this devotion in the first paragraph of the introduction page when she writes: *Lent is a time when we deepen our faith in a journey not of grand gestures but of small surrenders.*

The journey begins, as one might expect, with a reflection on Ash Wednesday and continues through Easter Sunday. She interacts with the writings of spiritual masters, both ancient and contemporary, to help illumine her reflections. The content is deep, but the presentation of it is witty and transparent. Emilie Griffin writes with a gentle and tender spirit, drawing from a deep well of spiritual wisdom. Her words are seasoned with humility and genuine concern for others.

The format is straightforward and follows the successive weeks of Lent – although we will be beginning our reflection in January (even though Ash Wednesday is not until March 1). Each writing is a brief 3-5 pages long and takes almost no time to read, but the substance of the writing can be meditated on all day long. You will find your heart and your intellect stirred repeatedly by her words.

I know that Jan/10-Mar/28 is more than 8 weeks. If we have no snow, the class will end early; if we DO have snow, snow days won't make me crazy. Class will be offered on Tuesdays at both 1:00 pm and 7:00 pm.

I have 10 hardback books available at \$5 apiece (used) for the first 10 people who sign up; Kindle copies cost \$10. I can order additional paperback copies for \$21 + postage, although you can get one much cheaper through Amazon.
