From the Pastors

Dear Parish Family,

"Joy to the World" is one of the most favored of Christmas hymns. On the last Sunday in Advent we greet the Nativity by singing the carol's mirthful words. All of creation repeats "the sounding **joy**."

This great **joy** began with the angel's announcement of the birth of John the Baptist. Zechariah, the priest, who would be the father of this child, received the word from the heavenly messenger in the Temple in Jerusalem while he was burning incense. "Do not be afraid, Zechariah, for your prayer has been heard, and your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you shall call his name John. And you will have **joy** and gladness, and many will **rejoice** at his birth, for he will be great before the Lord. (Luke 1: 13 – 15a ESV) The response of neighbors and relatives to the birth of John was **rejoicing** with his mother, Elizabeth.

Later, an angel came to Mary, Elizabeth's cousin, and said, "Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!" When Mary visited Elizabeth, the Virgin's cousin exclaimed, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb!" (Luke 1: 42 ESV) Yet unborn, John leaped for **joy** in Elizabeth's womb. Mary responded with what we call *The Magnificat*, "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit **rejoices** in God my Savior;" Again, we hear of great **joy** at the coming of the Savior. The angel announced to the shepherds, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of a great **joy** that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord." (Luke 2: 10 – 11 ESV) The good news of great **joy** is Christ, the Savior of the world. The response to the birth of Jesus was praise of God by angels and shepherds.

In the series of parables of the lost sheep, the lost coin, and the prodigal son heaven **rejoices** at the repentance of the sinner. **Rejoicing** is an appropriate response for our salvation in Jesus Christ. **Rejoicing** is an appropriate response at the coming of the Lord.

On Palm Sunday "...the whole multitude of the disciples began to **rejoice** and praise God with a loud voice for all the mighty works that they had seen, saying "Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" (Luke 19: 37 ESV) And at the end of the Gospel of Luke, the ascension of Christ is reported along with the disciples' response, "And they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and were continually in the temple blessing God." (Luke 24: 52 – 53 ESV)

We can praise with great **rejoicing** our God who has sent Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior with beloved carols like "Good Christian Friends, Rejoice" the last hymn we sing on Christmas Eve. We can rejoice by reciting the Lutheran Hail Mary, "Ave Maria, gratia plena, Dominus tecum. Benedicta tu in mulieribus, et benedictus fructus ventris tui, Jesus Christos. Amen", that is "Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus Christ. Amen." (See Dr. Darel Paul's A Lutheran Rosary) and Luther's "Evangelical Praise of the Mother of God." "O Blessed Virgin, Mother of God, what great comfort God has shown us in you, by so graciously regarding your unworthiness and low estate. This encourages us to believe that henceforth He will not despise us poor and lowly ones, but graciously regard us also, according to your example." (See Dr. Darel Paul The Lutheran Rosary)

May you and yours have a **joyful** Christmas (all twelve days). May you **rejoice** at the coming of our Lord and Savior at Bethlehem and await with expectancy and **joy** His promised return. Merry Christmas!





Is back from the holiday break & ready to create!



Directions for the "Diane Throws" Rectangles

Rectangles will measure 8 inches by 55 inches, each row uses a knit stitch Please make sure that the length is measured on a flat surface to ensure its size Use size 8 knitting needles, use 4 ply yarn, cast on 40 stitches, adjust # of stitches so the 40 stitches=8 inches

Lutheran Church Women's Circle Bible Study



The Beatitudes Matthew 5:3-10

Holy Trinity Church Women are studying the Beatitudes in their Circles. These teachings come from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount found in Matthew. We are exploring how these seemingly simple statements of what Jesus values in us can be quite complex and challenging, even unsettling as they speak to a way of thinking and acting that we need to cultivate.
We will discuss the difficulties and rewards of trying to live according to these teachings of Jesus. Ultimately, we hope that through this study and practicing what we learn, we will dwell more deeply in the blessed life that Jesus has promised.

JANUARY CIRCLES "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be filled."

This fourth Beatitude presents another character quality that Jesus wants us to have as His disciples. We hear the word righteousness often but do we truly understand its meaning? We will take time to explore the many facets of this word so that we can better comprehend this Beatitude. Can we be righteous in the eyes of the secular world, or is this truly a Godly trait. How do we "get" or achieve righteousness. Come to a January circle and learn about this concept that Jesus emphasized.




