Dear Parish Family,

On a recent Sunday we celebrated the Feast of the Holy Trinity, the very name of our congregation. For many Christians the doctrine of the Holy Trinity is perplexing. How can God be three-in-one?

The origin of this doctrine is the New Testament itself, though the word is never used in its pages. In the Gospel of John (see John 17), Jesus speaks of the mutual indwelling of the Father and Himself. The Paraclete, that is, the Holy Spirit, the One that leads the Church into all truth, is sent by the Father through the Son. "And when he (Jesus) had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit.'" (John 20:22 ESV)

The problem that confronted the Church is how her confession that God is one agrees with the teaching regarding the three persons. The issue came to a head in the early fourth century when a priest of Alexandria, Egypt, in the defense of the oneness of God, stood firm in his assertion that the Son was a created being inferior to the Father. His primary antagonist was Athanasius. Though in the past controversies over the Trinity had occurred, none matched the conflict that arose in the great Egyptian city. The controversy was not an abstract classroom debate, having nothing to do with the everyday life of the Church and its people. Athanasius maintained that the Son had to be God, coequal with the Father, in order for Him to save us, for only God can save humanity. This assertion lies at the heart of Christian faith.

Eventually, Emperor Constantine called an ecumenical council of the bishops that met in the city of Nicaea in what is present day northwestern Turkey. It was at this meeting that a creed was adopted that at the Second Ecumenical Council in Constantinople received its present form, used regularly in our own worship services. *Continued on pg. 2*

The doctrine of the Trinity asserts that God is one in three persons. In the Gospel of John the perichoresis is described as the mutual indwelling and love between the Father and the Son. The Father glorifies the Son and the Son the Father. The Spirit is sent by the Father through the Son. The inner dynamic and interrelationship of the persons is the perichoresis. Perichoresis is a term used post-biblically in the theological reflection of the Church.

Saint Hilary, Bishop of Poitiers during the fourth century, writes in his work on the Holy Trinity that God is one but not solitary. Within the one God are three persons, each fully divine. The Trinity is a community of persons. The word person describes the distinctiveness of each of the three. The Athanasian Creed gives in great detail our confession of both the Trinity and the two natures of Christ. You may want to study carefully this symbol to increase your understanding of the Church's teaching of the Holy Trinity.

We are a privileged people to be among those who confess the Holy Trinity. Difficult to describe in symbols or pictures, the doctrine shows forth the nature of God and His love for His creation, a love so great that the Father sent His eternally begotten Son to bring us eternal life and from the Father through the Son the Holy Spirit to abide with us, the Church.

Dear Fellow followers of Christ:

I am writing to you on behalf of the Rev. Didi Panzo, sent by us to Boma in the Dominican Republic of the Congo. Did is encountering some difficulties & I thought we all need to be sure we are responding to God's will as we support him.

First, there is a problem with water. The supply is inconsistent, typically less than ½ the time. When it flows, it is yellowish and of unknown quality. Bottled water is about US \$1.50 per bottle. (I just bought some for 15 cents in Arizona) It seems, there is a need for some purification, perhaps a storage tank and a pump for in-house use. Electricity comes from his generator, so there is insufficient power to boil water.

Next, Didi is just beginning to minister to the people in Boma. Some are farmers & he needs resources to help with seeds, fertilizer and instruction. There is also a need for counseling and support for those with family issues. He might need to share food or water, blankets, Bibles, and similar.


Then there is a need for financial resources. Didi did not get his full allowance last month, via WMPL. He receives money via an ATM; which has a fee with every withdrawal. He has felt it necessary to hire a guard for his house and vehicle. Without even getting enough for his living expenses, it must be very tough to be helping others.

We would all probably like more photos and messages from Didi. His internet, like other resources is slow and sporadic. American ISPs are suspicious of messages from the DRC and may not allow all messages to get through. Did is not a wizard at all of the intricacies of sending messages and images.

In summary, please pray about your support for our brother in the DRC. We all want to be sure when we sent him to a place we might have been unwilling to go, we are not leaving him on his own.

If you have any questions, either contact Didi directly via email, or you can write back to me and I will try to clarify further.

Directions for the "Diane Throws" Rectangles

Rectangles will measure 8 inches by 55 inches, each row uses a knit stitch Please make sure that the length is measured on a flat surface to ensure its size Use size 8 knitting needles, use 4 ply yarn, cast on 40 stitches, adjust # of stitches so the 40 stitches=8 inches

It's Time to Think about Filling Shoe Boxes for Children

Operation Christmas Child Shoe Boxes filled with school supplies, toiletries, toys, and accessories bring needed items to boys and girls around the world where they are victims of poverty, war, famine, and disasters. They also enable us to be the loving hands and feet of Jesus and bring an introduction to the Gospel story presented in a culturally appropriate way. Many times these shoe box gifts, distributed by local pastors, are the "tools" to open hearts and bring entire families to regular church worship and involvement.

Holy Trinity members and friends have been packing shoe boxes for children for ten years. This mission has grown as both individuals pack boxes, and members come together in early November for a packing party at which 232 boxes were packed last year. For the first time last year, nine members also volunteered a day of assistance at Samaritan's Purse Baltimore shoe box processing center where boxes are inspected and sealed for shipping.

The summer months are a good time to begin picking up supplies, often on sale

both for your own individually packed shoe boxes as well as for contributions to our church packing party this coming November. Attached is a list of ideas, as well as a specific idea list for boys 10-14 years old.

Our monthly emphasis for our Packing Party Collection will be

September School Supplies & Toiletries (NO liquids or lotions)


October Toys & Accessories

November Collect money to help defray shipping costs \$7/box

Change in Collecting Shoe Boxes: While we will receive your donations of shoe boxes that you have been saving for us throughout this past year, we will not be asking you to keep saving. We plan to order a supply of Operation Christmas Child Go Boxes. Church volunteers learned last year at the processing center that more GO boxes can be fit into shipping cartons, thus providing pastors with more boxes to distribute to more children. **PLEASE NO PLASTIC containers. They break in transit.**

Sign-Up To Volunteer at Processing Center

We are waiting to confirm our desire to participate again as volunteers at the Baltimore Processing Center where shoe boxes are inspected and sealed and packed for shipping. Look for a sign-up sheet in June to indicate your interest.

What <u>**TO**</u> put in a Shoebox

Do include 2 sets of batteries with any item requiring batteries.

Stuffed animals - Beanie Baby sized Dolls with assorted clothes, e.g., Barbie's Plastic dinosaurs, insects, etc. Balls - bouncy, hackey sack, beach balls Balloons, marbles Musical instruments (kazoos, horns, harmonicas, mini keyboards, etc.) Flashlights with 2 rounds of batteries Novelty plastic ware: cups, plates, bowls, spoons & forks (NO knives) Matchbox & tension release cars, trucks, trains, planes Jewelry making kits, play doh Color form books or sets Puzzles, Lego sets Small tools for older boys (screwdrivers, hammers, etc.) Glow sticks, bracelets, etc. Slinkys, yoyos, jump ropes

Need for Boxes 10-14 Year-Old Boys

This age group receives the fewest contributions, in part because many people find ideas for this age group challenging. If you choose to pack boxes for these boys, here are some ideas:

\$5 backpacks from Five Below (that can be folded in thirds) or lighter weight back sacks ball cap or visor Definitely a ball! Marbles, Glo sticks, fold-up Frisbees, yoyo Puzzles, Lego or K-Nex kits for age Coloring books, maze books, etc. Vehicles (larger ones sell for \$4-\$5 each in Rite Aid) Soap, washcloth or sports towel, toothbrush, toothpaste Nail clippers, Band-Aids, chap sticks, tissue pack, comb Flashlight with 2 sets of batteries Notebooks (5" x 8" or under) and/or pad of paper Pencils, sharpener, pens, crayons/colored pencils Ruler, eraser, glue stick, scotch tape, scissors Refillable Water Bottles, Plastic or Metal Calculator Mini hammer, screw driver set, etc. Socks, gloves Stuffed animal: tiger, lion, dog, etc.




