Dear Parish Family,

God dwells in thick darkness. Moses told the people of Israel, "These words the Lord spoke to all your assembly at the mountain out of the midst of the fire, the cloud, and the thick darkness, with a loud voice; and he added no more." (Deuteronomy 5:22 ESV) This passage immediately follows Moses' rehearsal of the Ten Commandments.

In Exodus after God gives Moses the Ten Commandments, the narrator writes, "Now when all the people saw the thunder and the flashes of lightening and the sound of the trumpet and the mountain smoking, the people were afraid and trembled, and they stood far off and said to Moses, 'You speak to us, and we will listen; but do not let God speak to us, lest we die.'" Moses told the people of Israel not to fear. God wanted to deter the people from sinning. Then, "The people stood far off, while Moses drew near to the thick darkness where God was." (Exodus 20: 16 – 21 ESV)

In Psalm 18 God responds to David's distress. "Smoke went up from his nostrils, and devouring fire from his mouth; glowing coals flamed forth from him. He bowed the heavens and came down; thick darkness was under his feet." (Psalm 18: 8 – 9 ESV) And a little further on the text says, "He (God) made darkness his covering, his canopy around him, thick clouds dark with water." (Psalm 18: 11 ESV) We sing a hymn that refers to this darkness of God.

Oh, tell of his might; oh, sing of his grace,
Whose robe is the light, whose canopy space;
His chariots of wrath the deep thunderclouds form,
And dark is his path on the wings of the storm.
(Lutheran Book of Worship, 548, "Oh, Worship the King")

Is the Lord not light rather than darkness? God is light. Yet in the Scriptures, the image of darkness has its place as representing God's presence, power, hiddenness, and mystery.

In Psalm 18 the Lord who makes "darkness his covering," saves the distressed petitioner. "He sent from on high, he took me; he drew me out of many waters. He rescued me from my strong enemy and from those who hated me, for they were too mighty for me." (Psalm 18: 17 ESV) Also in Psalm 18, David says, "For it is you who light my lamp; the Lord my God lightens my darkness," (Psalm 18: 28 ESV) Our darkness is different from the darkness that shrouds God. Darkness shrouds the Lord in mystery and indicates His power. Our darkness is sin.

God is light, and God is darkness. It is not that He is both good and evil. It is that He is presence, glory, power, and mystery. Both the Lord's darkness and light indicate these things. In another familiar hymn we find the image of light for God.

Those reignest in glory; thou dwellest in light;
Thine angels adore thee, all veiling their sight;
All laud we would render; oh, help us to see
"Tis only the splendor of light hideth thee!
(Lutheran Book of Worship, Hymn 526
"Immortal, Invisible, God Only Wise")

In his first letter Saint John writes, "This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all. If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice truth. But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin." (1 John 1: 5 - 7 ESV)

Why are Lilies the Flower of Easter?

More than any other flower, the Easter lily is the traditional, time-honored flower of Easter. Symbolic of the resurrection, Easter Lilies rise from earthly

graves as scaly bulbs, and bloom into majestic flowers that embody the purity, virtue, innocence, hope and resurrection they symbolize.

Dating back to Biblical times, the lily is mentioned numerous times in the Bible. One of the most famous Biblical references is in the Sermon on the Mount, when Christ told His listeners: "Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they toil not, neither do they spin; and yet ... Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these."

Tradition has it that when Eve left the Garden of Eden, she shed real tears of repentance, and from those remorseful tears sprang up the lilies of Easter. These lilies sprang up to remind Eve that God would never forget that He had promised Adam and Eve that He would send the Messiah to defeat "that ancient serpent" who had deceived them into disobedience.

The pure white lily has long been associated with the baby Jesus and Mary, his mother. In ancient paintings, the Angel Gabriel is pictured extending to the Virgin Mary a branch of pure white lilies, announcing that she is to be the mother of the Christ Child. In other paintings, saints are pictured bringing vases full of white lilies to Mary and the infant Jesus, prefiguring His resurrection.

Often called the "white-robed apostles of hope," lilies were found growing in the Garden of Gethsemane after Christ's agony. Tradition has it that the beautiful white lilies sprang up where drops of Christ's sweat fell to the ground in His final hours of sorrow and deep distress. Churches continue this tradition at Easter time by banking their altars and surrounding their crosses with

masses of Easter Lilies, to commemorate the resurrection of Jesus Christ and hope of eternal life.

The majestic white flower has so thoroughly come to symbolize the Resurrection of Christ, that the phrase "to gild the lily" has come into common usage meaning "a foolish attempt to improve on perfection." To many artists and poets it has seemed that, if any flower could have one, the Easter lily would have a soul.

Enjoy Your Lilies for Years to Come!

Once all danger of frost has passed, you can move your lilies to a sunny location outside.

To plant your Easter lilies, prepare a well-drained garden bed in a sunny location with rich organic matter (one part soil, one part peat moss, one part perlite). Good drainage is the key for success with lilies. Plant your bulbs 3 inches below ground level, and at least 12-18 inches apart in a hole sufficiently deep that the bulbs can be placed in it with the roots spread out and down. Spread the roots and work the prepared soil around the bulbs and roots, leaving no air pockets. Water immediately and thoroughly after planting.

As the original plants die back, cut the stems back to the soil surface. New growth will soon emerge. Your lilies will bloom again **NEXT YEAR IN JULY**. It is possible that they could bloom again later this summer, but most likely you will have to wait until the summer after this one to see your lilies bloom again. (It is only under controlled greenhouse conditions that these bulbs can be forced to bloom in March or April.)

The Easter Lily is surprisingly hardy, even in cold climates. Just be sure to provide winter protection for your bulbs by mulching them generously. Remember: Lilies like their roots in the shade (mulch) and their heads in the sun.


Continuing Lenten Midweek Lenten Worship and Devotional Study

Directions for the "Diane Throws" Rectangles


Rectangles will measure 8 inches by 55 inches, each row uses a knit stitch



Lutheran Church Women's Circle Bible Study



The Beatitudes Matthew 5:3-10

Holy Trinity Church Women are studying the Beatitudes in their Circles. These teachings come from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount found in Matthew. We are exploring how these seemingly simple statements of what Jesus values in us can be quite complex and challenging, even unsettling as they speak to a way of thinking and acting that we need to cultivate. We will discuss the difficulties and rewards of trying to live according to these teachings of Jesus. Ultimately, we hope that through this study and practicing what we learn, we will dwell more deeply in the blessed life that Jesus has promised.

MARCH CIRCLES

"Blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God."



 - 2 pairs of socks
 - 1 hand towel, dark color recommended
 - 2 3 bath-size bars of gentle soap equaling 8 to 9 oz. any brand, in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars.
 - 2 diaper pins or large safety pins






We encourage you to use this resource in your personal devotions, in Sunday school classes or with your entire church.




