From the Pastors

Dear Parish Family,

Now it is election time, and what an interesting time we are having! In what ways does a Lutheran perspective give insight into this presidential race and all others?

First, the Church should not support any particular political party or candidate, including candidates for President of the United States. It is no part of our mission to be a partisan institution. But, the Church should express its views in public – the Church speaks to the public and is a public, non – governmental institution – on matters such as free exercise of our faith in American society, concern for the poor, and issues regarding marriage and life, e.g. abortion, euthanasia, marriage, and sexuality. We will not be pushed into a private cranny by secularists. The North American Lutheran Church has issued statements about abortion and marriage. The marriage statement was written in conjunction with some other church bodies. Such statements have been and will be made available at Holy Trinity.

The non – establishment clause in the First Amendment of the Constitution does not require the Church to keep silence in the public square on pressing public issues that pertain to our life and mission. Reference to the foregoing topics is appropriate in the pulpit and classroom as well as in print as long as a political party is not promoted. Holy Trinity does not represent the Republican, Democratic, Green, Libertarian Parties, or any other party. When members are speaking of politics in the precincts of the church building, discretion and prudence should rule the day.

Another thing that the Church can appropriately do is encourage its people to vote. So we encourage you to vote. The U.S. Constitution has guarded this precious right. We should exercise it.

At places in the New Testament, Christians are encouraged to pray for those who govern us. On this subject, it is worth quoting at some length from 1 Peter. "Be subject for the Lord's sake to every human institution, whether it be to the emperor as supreme, or to governors as sent by him to punish those who do evil and to praise those who do good. For this is the will of God, that by doing good you should put to silence the ignorance of foolish people. Live as people who are free, not using your freedom as a cover-up for evil, but living as servants of God. Honor everyone. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the emperor." (1 Peter: 13-17 ESV) We pray every week for those who govern us.

We must keep the Lutheran confessional teaching of the two kingdoms in mind. The earthly kingdom is responsible for protecting its citizens and their welfare, even using coercion to fulfill its responsibilities. In the spiritual kingdom pastors preach the Word of God, rightly divided into Law and Gospel.

Finally, we must remember that the Church despite all of its warts is the one enduring institution whose inheritance is the heavenly city Jerusalem. The city of the world will perish; the City of God domiciles not only in this world but in the world to come. (See St. Augustine, *The City of God*)



Jesus said to his disciples, "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat, or about your body, what you will wear. For life is more than food, and the body more than clothing... Consider the lilies, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, how much more will he clothe you. (Luke 12:22-28)

It is remarkable to see how often throughout the Gospels that Jesus uses parables about growth to describe the life of faith. From "mustard seeds" to the "lilies of the field," Jesus speaks of faith in our lives as a living thing, growing and thriving.



We all know that living things need to grow to survive. A sprout needs to break free from the shell of a seed in order to become a thriving plant. A baby colt must rise on shaky legs to become a galloping horse. Nature itself tells us that without growth, there is no life. Jesus tells us that the same is true with faith.

If our faith does not break out from the shell of our selves, our faith cannot live. If we do not trust God enough to take a small step, we will never be able to run. Sometimes the very proof of faith itself is when we dare to risk what we have, for the sake of what we can become by the power of God.

This is especially evident in our lives as God's stewards. The biblical definition of a steward is someone who takes care of what belongs to another. According to Scripture, all we have belongs to God and we are his stewards — temporary care-takers for the sake of our neighbors and the world.

In that same chapter of Luke, after promising to his disciples that God is the trustworthy care-taker of our lives, Jesus goes on to talk about God has made us care-takers of one another. Jesus said:

"Fear not, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom. Sell your possessions, and give to the needy. Provide yourselves with moneybags that do not grow old, with a treasure in the heavens that does not fail, where no thief approaches and no moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." (Luke 12:32-34)

Faith and generosity go together. This is one of the greatest gifts we have in Christ. Because we know that God will provide for us, we are free to be able to provide for others. This is what it means to worship the Lord as our loving Creator.

In his explanation to the First Article of the Apostles' Creed, Martin Luther reminded us of all the things God has provided for us. He said:

"I believe that God has created me and all that exists, that he has given me and still preserves my body and soul, my eyes and ears, my reason and all my senses, together with food and clothing, home and family, and all my property. Every day he provides abundantly for all the needs of my life. He protects me from all danger and guards and keeps me from every evil. He does this purely out of fatherly and divine goodness and mercy, though I do not deserve it. Therefore I ought to thank, praise, serve, and obey him. This is most certainly true!" (Luke 12:32-34)

My prayer for our Lutheran congregations across this country is that we would recognize with thankfulness the manifold gifts of God in our lives and use the opportunities we have been given to grow in love and service. By the power of God, such growth is reflected not only in financial giving to the service of Christ's mission, but in the giving of our *selves* in lives of discipleship, following where our Lord has led the way.

In this season of harvest and thanksgiving, I pray that each of us would live out the faith we have been given by God, through our growth in the simple, practical expressions of stewardship in the sharing our time and resources in a living offering of our faith in God.

Stewardship Weekend will be November 12 & 13, 2016

What do we mean by the term Stewardship

Weekend? It is the name we use for the Weekend on which we return our *Pledge Card* for the support of the church program in the New Year beginning in January.

How do I get a *Pledge Card*? You will get one via e-mail during October. Others will be available in the narthex.

Why should I return a *Pledge Card?* Can't I just put my offering in the offering plate at worship? The church has many expenses for curriculum materials, heat, light, building upkeep, salaries, insurance and other things. These expenses must be budgeted in order that we may know what kind of program of worship, fellowship, education, music, evangelism and other parts of our witness can be carried out -- and what we can do for others. Unless our members decide in advance the amount they can give we can't plan an effective ministry.

What if I return a *Pledge Card* and then suffer financial reverses during the year that make it impossible to pay that amount? The Church is the Body of Christ; it is not a loan company. If circumstances you did not foresee make it necessary to reduce or even cancel the amount you thought you could give, all you need to do is to tell God. True Christians also make adjustments upward when their incomes are increased or they receive unexpected additional income during the year.

Will I be solicited personally in my home?

No. You will never receive a telephone call or visitor soliciting you for money. You will receive e-mails that we hope you will read carefully and prayerfully. Does this church talk about money all the time? No. This church is not always talking about money. The church is always talking about Jesus Christ. It is only with money that the program of the church as we know it today can continue to exist.

Why does the church ask for an increase in giving from each of us every year? Every year deeply committed Christians who gave substantially either die, experience grave financial reverses, or move to other communities. It is only with new and increased pledges that we can replace this loss. We especially hope that those who give \$5 a week or less will increase their giving by \$2 or more a week.

How much should I give? Did you know that Holy Trinity presently receives offerings from approximately 320 households. Of these, 240 households give \$1 - \$25 per week. If each of these households were to increase their giving by \$2.00 per week, Holy Trinity would have \$20,000 more per year. The remaining 80 households give more than \$25 per week. If each of these households were to increase their giving by \$5.00 per week, we'd have another \$20~000. A small amount from many families would make a huge difference to Holy Trinity for next year's budget.

When is Stewardship Sunday?

Stewardship Sunday is the Second Sunday in November. Please prayerfully consider increasing the amount you give to Holy Trinity by just \$2 to \$5 a week. Please also think about participating in Sinply Giving.



What Does A Bible Mean?

A Devoted Christian Woman Waited 71 Years for A Bible She Prayed Almost Without Ceasing!

In November, we observe Bible Sunday at Holy Trinity (**Sunday, November 13**) by presenting inscribed Bibles to our children Do we realize the magnitude of the gift we are giving to them? We also make Bibles available to anyone who does not have their own Bible. However, Bibles are not automatically available in many Asian countries where there is hostility to Christians.

What would our Christian walk look like if we were entirely dependent on Pastors Mike and Mandy sharing from one Bible for our entire community? We might often feel like a rudderless ship, being pushed around by the wind and waves.

How many Bibles do you own – both in book form and on your electronic devices? Please consider making a \$2 - \$3 contribution for every Bible you have so that the growing number of Christians in China and other Bible – restricted countries throughout Asia can have access to the Word of God.

Recently, an 84 - year - old woman in Myanmar (Burma) shared her astonishing story.

"I was born in December 1931. My parents were very poor, so I started first grade when I was 13 years old. There was only one Bible in our village and it belonged to our pastor. I really wanted to have my own copy, so I have been praying to God for a Bible since 1945, when I was 14. Whenever I saw the Bible in the pastor's hands, I really want to have my own, so I kept praying."

"I was very hungry for the Word of God and I desperately wanted to read it, but there were no Bibles available. This was truly heartbreaking for me. I became discouraged that for a time I stopped praying to have a Bible. But then someone gave me the Book of Mark. I was elated; I read it whenever I could. I almost memorized the whole book, and it strengthened my faith."

"By the grace of God, today I received the full Bible from Asia Harvest for free. This is amazing! Only God can do this. He has answered my 71 years of prayer for a Bible. The Lord is so good to me. My favorite Scripture is Psalm 23. I send my thanks to all who donated, supported, and brought this precious Bible to me. I will always read it."

Asia Harvest provides the Scriptures in 72 different languages through its Asian Bible Fund. Bible costs \$1.80 to print and distribute in China and an average of \$2.70 to print and distribute to other Asian countries. (Please note that the gift sent to Asia Harvest from our mission fund goes specifically toward assisting with children's surgeries to fix cleft palates.)

Among other things, The Rules of Procedure say that Holy Trinity's Annual Meeting will be governed by Roberts Rules of Order, that all speeches will be limited to three minutes, and that anyone can present a resolution but that this resolution must be presented in writing to the Committee on Reference and Counsel by 3:00 p.m. on the Monday immediately prior to Annual Meeting. At the time each resolution is presented to Annual Meeting, Reference and Counsel will advise the Annual Meeting as to whether or not the resolution should be adopted.
