From the Pastors

Dear Parish Family,

As in Temple worship in ancient Jerusalem and in the synagogues of modern Judaism, the Psalms are sung to various tunes (or tones) at Holy Trinity Church. The traditional place for singing them is located between the First and Second Lessons at the Eucharist. The singing of Psalms has been central in the Daily Office. Their use is a very old practice in Christian worship.

Hymns and songs along with the Psalms were used in early Christian congregations. In Luke, Mary and others sing hymns to the Lord. These canticles are now sung in our worship. Hymns of heaven are sung by the angelic host in Revelation. "This is the Feast," used in the Eucharist, is taken from this last book of the Bible. Heaven is a place of singing. The Church joins heaven in song and has from the earliest days.

When Paul instructs the Church at Ephesus, he mentions the practice of singing in the congregation: "And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit, addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart, giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ.," (Ephesians 5: 19 ESV) In this exhortation the Apostle hopes that the congregation will be filled with the Spirit. Our singing in worship reflects the Spirit's moving the hearts of the people of God to praise Him.

Lutheran worship is noted for being very choral. We sing many parts of the liturgy. These choral parts include the Introit; hymns; chants like the Kyrie; canticles like the Gloria; psalms; the Verse; invitations to prayer as are found before the Prayer of the Day and Eucharistic Prayer; and the blessing. People, cantor, and pastor all contribute to the choral praise of God.

In the Third Setting we sing the Lord's Prayer. All of this music contributes to the beauty of worship. Hymns, psalms, chants, and canticles connect us with the Church throughout the ages and, most importantly, with the Triune God, the One in three, Who is the only God and our Lord.

Several weeks ago our Society of the Hours attended St. Stephen's Orthodox Cathedral, a congregation that represents a great tradition in Christian doctrine and worship, to participate in Vespers in their chapel. The service was mostly sung by the congregation and a small choir of cantors a cappella (no musical instruments to accompany; literally "in chapel style"). In the singing of sacred songs, we are in company with Israel and the wider Christian Church. We rejoice in the Holy Spirit who inspires our song.


Directions for the "Diane Throws" Rectangles

Rectangles will measure 8 inches by 55 inches, each row uses a knit stitch

Please make sure that the length is measured on a flat surface to ensure its size





Lutheran Church Women's Circle Bible Study



One Year; Three Topics

During the 2016 – 17 Circle year, we will predominantly be studying the book of James. This Bible study presents a strong follow-up to the Beatitudes that we delved into last activity year. In Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, He told us how to live as His disciples. James explores the battles and challenges we face along the way to a disciplined life of discipleship. James is about putting our faith into practice, giving it hands and feet and a mind that is formed by and conformed to Christ's teachings. He tells us how we should act and behave. As one writer has captured James:

For James, faith was no abstract proposition but had effects in the real world. James offered numerous practical examples to illustrate his point: faith endures in the midst of trials, calls on God for wisdom, bridles the tongue, sets aside wickedness, visits orphans and widows, and does not play favorites. He stressed that the life of faith is comprehensive, impacting every area of our lives and driving us to truly engage in the lives of other people in the world.

In September, we will begin by becoming more familiar with James. Our theme is that genuine faith put into practice will result or manifest itself in righteous living. If you're truly a follower of Christ, true faith will show itself in the way you live your life. Our first topic is **Wisdom in Trials.** How do we get through trials, tribulations, and temptations in our life? What Godly wisdom can we apply?

In December, we will step aside from James to hear a Christmas topic. We will consider the life of Joseph, Jesus' earthly father, and what his examples have to teach us. Again, when Lent begins in March, we will take another break to read stories about our persecuted family members in the body of Christ. They will be both unsettling and inspiring in how they call us to think about our own lives and what God wants and expects of us.
