From the Pastors

Dear Parish Family,

Recently, we attended the Convocation of the North American Lutheran Church. The worship was beautiful, the Westmont College Choir contributing much to our praise of God. The preaching was inspiring. The fellowship was warm among brothers and sisters in Christ. Important decisions were made.

The North American Lutheran Church now has a seminary. Our Seminary Center will be located at Trinity School of Ministry in Ambridge, Pennsylvania, near Pittsburgh, a seminary of the Anglican Church in North America, Instruction in the Lutheran Confessions and Lutheran history will be provided there. A Lutheran House of Studies has been established at Gordon-Conwell Seminary, Charlotte, North Carolina. Other Lutheran houses of studies will be located at various places in the country. All of these institutions will be part of the North American Lutheran Seminary. To learn more about the new seminary, go to www.holytrinity.net, click continuing education, and then scroll down to NALC Seminary.

The NALC has approved the development of a closer relationship with the Lutheran Church in Tanzania with the hope of establishing full Communion in two years. We already are in full communion with the Ethiopian Evangelical Church Mekane Yesus. Guests from Tanzania attended the Convocation.

Greetings from the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, Lutheran Church— Canada, the Ethiopian Evangelical Church Mekane Yesus, the Lutheran Church of Tanzania, the Anglican Church in North America, and the Roman Catholic Church. Our church has a strong ecumenical commitment

Several Ministry Partners made presentations. Doma International is a Lutheran ministry especially to women and children. At Bora in Ethiopia, a medical mission has been established. A twelve hour ride and a four hour hike will get you to this remote village. Other partners include China Service Ventures, Eastern European Mission Network, World Mission Prayer League, Friends of Madagascar Mission, and Youth Encounter. Our missionary, Diedone Panzo, was sent out by the World Mission Prayer League.

Representatives of Water Missions International made a presentation at the Convocation. This Christian organization provides clean water to people around the world. Many people including children die because of polluted water. Along with providing clean water, those sent out share the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

The emphasis at this Convocation, as always when the NALC meets, was mission outreach. A resolution was passed that set as a goal the establishment of 1517 congregations by 2017, the five-hundredth anniversary of the posting of the Ninety-five Theses by Martin Luther. Enthusiasm for mission was evident at the meeting. Our bishop, John Bradosky, and staff are highly committed to extending the Gospel here and abroad through the North American Lutheran Church.

Pastor Mandy has completed three years of service on the NALC Executive Council and chosen not to run for reelection. She feels honored to have been able to serve the church in this capacity. The Rev. Amy Schrifrin was elected in her place. Dr. Schrifin will be the keynote speaker at the Convocation of the Atlantic Mission District of the NALC to be held at Holy Trinity Church on October 12.

A strong sense of unity exists in the NALC. We are united in our commitment to Christ, the Scriptures, mission, and the great tradition of the Church. Next year we will meet at the Citadel in South Carolina. Thanks to Earl and Judi Reeder for representing us and to Milt Cannan and Sigrid Frandsen- Cannan for attending.

Thank you for the very generous donation of cleaning, kitchen, and baby supplies for the Cradle of Hope. It was very king of you to remember us. We deeply appreciate your interest in our desire to provide housing for one year to homeless mothers and their babies.

One of our current residents, Ceitera, is receiving training to become a counselor in the Philadelphia Prison system. She will complete the one-year program in November. Two of our residents in 2012-13, Nyeisha and Amanda, both gradudated high school in June 2013.

Out transitional housing program requires that each resident be attending school and/or working while in the program. Your gift also blesses each child. As the mothers obtain education, employment and permanent housing, the cycle of poverty is reversed and the children's lives are permanently affected.

On Tuesdays in September, October and November, Pastor Mandy will be leading *Growing Your Soul*.


Dates: September 17 through November 19, (10 weeks).

In this 10 week course, participants will be introduced to a sampling of the great riches of the Christian Spiritual tradition. We will look at key leaders and practices as we explore the ways in which Christians from the earliest times to the present day have sought to express and live out the deepest truths of our faith.

The Bible and the life of Iesus Christ will be the starting point for the story. But along the way, we look briefly at the early Church fathers, the saints and the mystics, the monks and the reformers. And we will practice a few of the spiritual disciplines they have taught the Church through the years. The story of Christian spirituality bears witness to the countless ways in which individuals and communities have felt the presence and heard the call of God, have been disturbed by the divine anger, and have felt impelled to give all they had to give in response. This years topic will be based on:

Joseph: How God Builds Character by Paul Borthwick.

This year we'll delve into a story of favoritism, envy, betrayal and deceit. Better than Reality TV, we'll also experience a story of forgiveness, humility, love and restoration. Building on how God helps us through life's challenges, we will be studying *Joseph: How God Builds Character* by Paul Borthwick.

Our author, Borthwick, writes that Joseph is a man of integrity and forgiveness. "Both words speak to the issue of spiritual depth. A person of character – especially in the context of the Christian life – sets himself or herself apart from others by moral uprightness, ethical courage and the strength to stand against evil." He continues by stating "people who have integrity live integrated lives. Their life convictions and their lifestyles match...their actions, values and behaviors stay consistent..."

Joseph is known as the dreamer and the possessor of the "coat of many colors," but his life is a success story made in heaven, one that offers a message of hope in the midst of trials for those that read it. Buffeted with the same kinds of problems we face today, Joseph's tenacious faith in God ultimately won him great honor and achievement. This study will take us into an in-depth examination of the family, experiences, choices and impact of the life of Joseph, one of the twelve sons of Israel. In eight studies this year, we'll explore Genesis, chapter 37 and Genesis, chapters 39-50 to discover what Joseph's life teaches us today about being people of character and integrity.

In preparation for each month's study, you'll find a Personal Reflection in the Holy Trinity Lutheran Church Women section of the newsletter. This question or exercise is designed to help you focus on God and on the theme of the study. In September, we'll discuss Chapter One: Building on Damaged Foundations. Our Personal Reflection is: If you were to ask God one question about the childhood that you've lived, what would you ask him?

Fun Summer Project

How Many Shoeboxes Can You Fill for Children?

Bring the love of Jesus to children and their families.

Their only "Christmas" experience will be your shoebox.

And, they can hear the Gospel message...many for the 1st time!

Since 2007, members of Holy Trinity have lovingly packed shoeboxes with toys, school supplies, and hygiene items for children in need around the world. This is a wonderful opportunity for adults and children alike to engage in hands-on mission and experience the joy of shopping for and filling shoeboxes for children who are victims of poverty in so many ways—war; natural disasters such as earthquakes, floods, and famines; jobless parents, or other life devastations. Each child who is given a shoebox will also receive an age- and culturally-appropriate Gospel in his/her language. There are many wonderful stories through Samaritan's Purse of how these gifts and the Gospel have brought families to church and to the feet of Jesus.


<u>How Many Shoeboxes Can You Make Happen?</u> Please consider packing as many shoeboxes as possible—either as your personal or family project or, even better, by asking extended family members and friends to join you in this effort. Shoeboxes will be collected at Holy Trinity during services on the second weekend in November (9 & 10).

This shoebox ministry, known as Operation Christmas Child, is a major mission effort of Samaritan's Purse, a nondenominational Christian organization headed by Franklin Graham. Know that your boxes of goodies may well be the only gift that a child receives all year or EVER. Also keep in mind that this is your personal opportunity to be an evangelist. So the more shoeboxes you prepare, the more opportunities you create for children and their families to know Jesus and his saving love.

<u>Contribute or Take Shoeboxes:</u> Please either bring your extra empty shoeboxes to the narthex for others to fill OR take shoeboxes to fill. Then take a brochure and have fun shopping! **Most importantly** as you prepare your boxes, pray often for the children who will receive them. For ideas of items to pack, please see a list on the next page.

Shipping: You will be asked to contribute \$7 for each shoebox you send. Some people feel called to support this effort by making a contribution to defray shipping costs for many shoeboxes. All contributions are appreciated. You may use the envelope attached to the brochure.

<u>Track your box to its destination:</u> Find out where your boxes go! Visit www.samaritanspurse.org,. Click "What We Do." and select "Operation Christmas Child." On the left menu click "Journey of a Shoebox. You will find a "Follow Your Box" link under Collecting Shoeboxes. Once you make your online contribution for shipping, you will receive an email to print your bar code. Affix this to your shoebox, making sure not to tape over the actual bar code. In 2014, you will receive an email telling you the countries where your boxes were delivered.



A Shoebox Ministry to Children Around the World

- 1. Use a sturdy shoebox or a plastic shoebox-sized container.
- 2. It is not necessary, but if you wrap your box, boxes and lids must be wrapped separately due to mandatory inspections.
- 3. Select the gender (boy or girl) and age category: 2-4, 5-9, or 10-14.
- 4. Make purchases and fill your shoebox to capacity!
- 5. You may include your name & address and/or a picture. Sometimes a child or family writes to you.

Add on top a check to **Samaritan's Purse** for \$7 for each box you have packed. You only need one check, even if you are preparing several boxes. OR, visit **www.samaritanspurse.org** to download bar-coded strips to affix to your shoeboxes and learn later where they go.

- 6. Place the lid on your box and tape on top the completed Operation Christmas Child label.
- 7. Place 2-3 rubber bands around your box and bring to a Holy Trinity service November 9 or 10.

Pens for older children

Combs, toothbrush, soap (in plastic Ziploc bag) washcloth

Socks, T-shirt, bandanas, sunglasses

Mirror (plastic, not glass)

Fun print tissue pack, Band-Aids with designs

Novelty plastic ware: cups, plates, straws

Age-appropriate candy/snacks: ring popes, animal crackers, Pez & dispenser, Nerds, Mentos, Lifesavers Beanie Baby-sized stuffed animals, dolls, balls (bouncy, hacky sack, blow-up beach balls, balloon)

Age-appropriate stickers

Games: maze & dot-to-dot pads, puzzles, Legos,

coloring books, water colors & brushes

Age & gender-appropriate small backpacks, purses, and visors

Boys

Legos, yoyos, Slinkies

Matchbox and tension-release cars & trucks Marbles

Chap stick

Wrist watch

Flashlights-include 2 rounds of batteries

<u>Girls</u>

Emery boards, nail art, nail brushes

Jewelry (bracelets, necklaces, ankle bracelets, etc.)

Bead making kits

Lip gloss

Hair bands, clips, etc.

Jump ropes

Do's & Don't's

- NO toys of war (military figures, weapons, etc)
- NO chocolate or any candies that would melt in heat
- NO lotions, liquids, or anything in glass containers
- DO include storybooks (you don't know what language your child speaks)
- DO consider games (especially travel size) that have picture directions, directions in several languages., or are able to be easily understood if a child cannot read English.
- DO be culturally sensitive when making selections. This project is about spreading the love of Jesus. The children who receive your gifts are red and yellow black and white.
- AVOID toys with American flags.
