One of the most critical thoughts everyone said is the difficult of paying the tuition that cost between \$20 & \$30 every trimester as the director said that among 350 students, only 80 students whose parents are capable to pay. for this trimester kids of 6 grades who owe the school will not allow to participate in final exams. Another claim they made is the condition of the class rooms as you may see in the picture, the room is dark, dusty floor and the walls are not finished. Teacher are proud in doing their job but no salary for over six months. Pray for them and think how can you help for the success of these little children. The last things to say about children is abandonment and starvation. Every day 3 to 5 kids comes and knocks my door for need of foods. Imagine that we cannot respond to their request because we don't have enough. If you serve 3 kids they will let the others and you may be in obligation of serving all, please pray for the situation.
