From the Pastors

Dear Parish Family,

We have now come to observance of the Nativity (birth) of our Lord Jesus Christ. We do not know when Christ was born, but the Church has designated an old pagan holiday as the time to observe our Lord's nativity.

In Mark John the Baptizer announces the coming of One who is mightier than he, whose sandals he is not fit to untie. John baptizes with water as a sign of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. Jesus comes to grant forgiveness and to baptize with the Holy Spirit. We already know from the very first line of this Gospel that Jesus is the Christ and Son of God.

Mark does not include a story of Jesus' birth. He begins with John's announcement and Jesus' Baptism. At His baptism a voice from heaven declares Him the Son and Beloved. Near the end of the Gospel the centurion at the cross exclaims that Jesus is truly the Son of God.

In Matthew and Luke Jesus is declared the Son of God in their stories of His birth. In Luke the angel Gabriel says to Mary, "And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." (Luke 1: 31-32 NRSV)

In Matthew the angel in a dream of Joseph instructs him to take the child to Egypt to protect Jesus from Herod. Matthew cites a passage from the Old Testament that indicates Jesus' Sonship. "Out of Egypt I have called my son." (Luke 2:15 from Hosea 11:1)

In John the Son is the Word with the Father who comes in the flesh among us. We are among those who have seen His glory.

Jesus is the Son of God. His birth is wrought by the Holy Spirit through a virgin. The ecumenical creeds confess Jesus as the Son born of a virgin. In the Nicene Creed we confess that Christ was incarnate (a word from Latin) of the Holy Spirit, that is he was made man.

Christmastide is a very special time in the Church year. We celebrate the birth of Christ, His coming in the flesh. He was made man and crucified **for us.** On the third day He rose from the dead. Because of Christ we receive the forgiveness of sins and life everlasting. He is the Son of God, one with the Father.

The birth of the child at Bethlehem is the most momentous event in history alongside His crucifixion and resurrection. May we as His disciples know the blessings of this season. We are a people that live in the light of Christ. Christmas is truly a time for us to be merry on account of the birth of Jesus Christ, Son of God.

Among other things, The Rules of Procedure say that Holy Trinity's Annual Meeting will be governed by Roberts Rules of Order, that all speeches will be limited to three minutes, and that anyone can present a resolution but that this resolution must be presented in writing to the Committee on Reference and Counsel by 3:00 p.m. on the Monday immediately prior to Annual Meeting, **Monday, January 22nd.** At the time each resolution is presented to Annual Meeting, Reference and Counsel will advise the Annual Meeting as to whether or not the resolution should be adopted. Copies of these Rules of Procedure and Forms for Resolutions are available in the Narthex.

Holy Trinity sent 357 shoe boxes to Operation Christmas Child this past November, 2017. That means there are 357 children who would have been left out of receiving their first gift ever and learning about Jesus if not for your loving, generous efforts!

We thank everyone who had a hand in this mission to children in great need around the world. These gifts represent not only the physical items that fill many basic needs and bring joy to children and their parents alike, but also the opportunity to hear the Gospel story through *The Greatest Journey* booklet given with each shoe box and then be invited to participate in a 10-week Bible study course. A Heart full of thanks to:

◆ **The Mission Commitment Task Force** for the \$2,500 grant that was used to purchase needed supplies for the packing party and help defraying shipping charges which were raised to \$9 per box.

What a list! What a Church! And how God provides. We don't plan too specifically, but everyone's contributions and Mission Task Force grant completely covered supplies and shipping for 230 packed party boxes. That is no small miracle!!

Remember, this is a year-round project, so begin collecting now for 2018! Fun To Know: We did not advertise but quietly applied for a new shoe box challenge. If we could pack at least 7 more boxes this year, we could win tickets to Adventure Aquarium through the generous funding of a family helping to motivate the packing of more boxes. We delivered 356 boxes initially, then quickly found enough supplies to pack one more. So now we can send (our youth group/Sunday school children) on a great Adventure this year.




NOTES OF THANKS (cont...)







Dear Fellow Servants in Christ at Holy Trinity,



As with many things we experience in this earthly life, change can be both nerve wracking and exciting, sometimes both at the same time. Such a change has now come for the Interfaith Food Pantry.

This ecumenical ministry was begun 47 years ago, back in 1970, by the clergy of Abington. Volunteers came from all of the congregations of Abington and their service was coordinated for many, many years by Bob Miller, Sr. and Dagmar Burgess. Bob and Dagmar were volunteers themselves, spending many hours per week on this task. And for years and years, all of this was run from Holy Trinity's second grade Sunday School room and its huge closet.

In 2003, neither Bob Miller nor Dagmar Burgess could continue their volunteer coordination. With no volunteers to fill their shoes, the food cupboard was handed over to the agency, Interfaith Housing Alliance of Ambler. It was thought best to hand the operation of the food cupboard to an actual agency with paid staff that was equipped to continue this worthwhile outreach.

As time has progressed, and unfortunately the need has increased, we have seen the Food Cupboard grow in its ability to provide support and sustenance. Almost 4 years ago members of our congregation got together to remake and paint what was once a back hallway room into a beautiful waiting area for individuals and their families when they came to pick up food. Many times during heavy donation periods more of our rooms have been filled with cans, boxes and bags of food until such time the volunteers could weigh and have it shelved.


As a social service agency, Interfaith Housing Alliance of Ambler is committed to expanding their services to include fresh produce and an area for shopping. Ongoing planning has resulted in a need for them to find more space to accomplish this goal. They have long wanted a first floor area of 1,000 square feet so as to facilitate not only their expansion goals but to make it easier for donors and elderly volunteers with bringing the food into the cupboard. (Anyone who has ever lugged heavy grocery bags knows whereof we speak...now imagine, 1,000 or more pounds in one single donation which is very typical of many Boy Scout or Police food drives.)

Due to our inability to provide such a space, Interfaith will be moving out of Holy Trinity as we begin the New Year. Our sadness to see them depart is tinged with excitement at the promise of a new venture for them and the outstanding service they provide. As of mid-January they will be located in a storefront at 1356 Easton Road in Roslyn. This has brought us back to where we, as a congregation, began in the '70's. We are praying and listening for the Holy Spirit to speak words of wisdom and courage as we embark on *The Bread of Heaven* Food Pantry. We invite your prayers and open ears to hear God's direction for this new/old ministry.

Pastor Mike has organized the first meeting of volunteers for *The Bread of Heaven*, Food Pantry on **Wednesday**, **January 17th at 7:30 p.m.** in his office, so we may begin to serve our neighbor's needs for daily bread. But much more than that, as disciples of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, we are excited to bring those who have an eternal need that no amount of food can fill in contact with the One Who provides for all our needs. May God be praised and glorified in all we do and say.
