From the Pastors

Dear Parish Family,

Lent will arrive soon. It consists of forty days excluding Sundays that focus on repentance and the renewal of faith as we look forward to Easter. This season in purple, representing repentance, begins with Ash Wednesday, the day on which we receive on our foreheads ashes in the sign of the cross. As they are applied each one of us hears from the pastor the words that come from Genesis that God spoke to Adam and Eve, "Dust you are and to dust you shall return." With a reminder of sin is also one of death. We sinners will die.

Our sin is deeper than the individual acts that we commit either by omission or commission. David declares, "Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin did my mother conceive me." (Psalm 51:5 ESV) We are born in sin and commit sin throughout our lives. So with David we pray, "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me." (Psalm 51:10 ESV)

Saint Paul links sin and death. "Therefore, just as sin came into the world through one man, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men because all sinned - for sin indeed was in the world before the law was given, but sin is not counted where there is no law. Yet death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over those whose sinning was not like the transgression of Adam, who was a type of the one (Christ, mine) who was to come." (Romans 5: 12ff ESV)

In the Ash Wednesday liturgy (*Lutheran Book of Worship*) after a litany in which we confess our sins, we come forward to receive ashes applied to our foreheads, while the pastor says, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." (*Lutheran Book of Worship*)
