Dear Parish Family,

Two new social outreach ministries have opened up at Holy Trinity. The Bread of Heaven Food Pantry will begin operation on Thursday, March 8. The food pantry room is ready for food to be placed on the shelves. Volunteers will be trained on Tuesday, February 27. The wider community has been advised through the local pastors. In the future we hope to co-operate with other food pantries. There is a sense of excitement as we begin this new venture. This ministry will have an evangelism component. Christian literature will be provided on a book shelf in the waiting room. The cross of Christ hangs above the people who come for help.

We hope that you will come to the dedication of the pantry after the service on March 4. It will take place in the pantry. We hope also that you consider becoming a volunteer. More about the pantry will be communicated in coming weeks.

Associated with the pantry is the Holy Trinity Kensington Ministry. We already have a relationship with *The Last Stop* and *Sarnelli House*. We are providing peanut butter and jelly sandwiches to *The Last Stop*. Sandwiches are given to people on the streets. We encourage members of Holy Trinity to keep making sandwiches and placing them in the refrigerator at church.

Its purpose is to feed the hungry but also to encourage individuals to get help for their addiction. *The Last Stop* provides an opportunity for detox and the start of a new life.

Sarnelli House provides five meals a day for the indigent some of whom live under a bridge a half block away. A store is located there where people can come to pick out clothes provided free. Please bring your good, used clothing, especially men's clothing.

Why are Lilies the Flower of Easter?

More than any other flower, the Easter lily is the traditional, time-honored flower of Easter. Symbolic of the resurrection, Easter Lilies rise from earthly

graves as scaly bulbs, and bloom into majestic flowers that embody the purity, virtue, innocence, hope and resurrection they symbolize.

Dating back to Biblical times, the lily is mentioned numerous times in the Bible. One of the most famous Biblical references is in the Sermon on the Mount, when Christ told His listeners: "Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they toil not, neither do they spin; and yet ... Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these."

Tradition has it that when Eve left the Garden of Eden, she shed real tears of repentance, and from those remorseful tears sprang up the lilies of Easter. These lilies sprang up to remind Eve that God would never forget that He had promised Adam and Eve that He would send the Messiah to defeat "that ancient serpent" who had deceived them into disobedience.

The pure white lily has long been associated with the baby Jesus and Mary, his mother. In ancient paintings, the Angel Gabriel is pictured extending to the Virgin Mary a branch of pure white lilies, announcing that she is to be the mother of the Christ Child. In other paintings, saints are pictured bringing vases full of white lilies to Mary and the infant Jesus, prefiguring His resurrection.

Often called the "white-robed apostles of hope," lilies were found growing in the Garden of Gethsemane after Christ's agony. Tradition has it that the beautiful white lilies sprang up where drops of Christ's sweat fell to the ground in His final hours of sorrow and deep distress. Churches continue this tradition at Easter time by banking their altars and surrounding their crosses with masses of Easter Lilies, to commemorate the resurrection of Jesus Christ and hope of eternal life.

The majestic white flower has so thoroughly come to symbolize the Resurrection of Christ, that the phrase "to gild the lily" has come into common usage meaning "a foolish attempt to improve on perfection." To many artists and poets it has seemed that, if any flower could have one, the Easter lily would have a soul.

Enjoy Your Lilies for Years to Come!

Once all danger of frost has passed, you can move your lilies to a sunny location outside.

To plant your Easter lilies, prepare a well-drained garden bed in a sunny location with rich organic matter (one part soil, one part peat moss, one part perlite). Good drainage is the key for success with lilies. Plant your bulbs 3 inches below ground level, and at least 12-18 inches apart in a hole sufficiently deep that the bulbs can be placed in it with the roots spread out and down. Spread the roots and work the prepared soil around the bulbs and roots, leaving no air pockets. Water immediately and thoroughly after planting.

As the original plants die back, cut the stems back to the soil surface. New growth will soon emerge. Your lilies will bloom again **NEXT YEAR IN JULY**. It is possible that they could bloom again later this summer, but most likely you will have to wait until the summer after this one to see your lilies bloom again. (It is only under controlled greenhouse conditions that these bulbs can be forced to bloom in March or April.)

The Easter Lily is surprisingly hardy, even in cold climates. Just be sure to provide winter protection for your bulbs by mulching them generously. Remember: Lilies like their roots in the shade (mulch) and their heads in the sun.



Dear Pastor Mandy,

I've enclosed the finished alter cloth that Dad had been working on for the church before his passing. This is the product of hope, commitment and dedication from a number of selfless people who rallied to fulfill the wish a man, who they had not met, did not know, and had no reason to care about, but each gave of him or herself to fulfill a stranger's wish. Surely a testament to Christian values, faith and humanity.

I wanted to tell you a bit about those who participated, each in his or her own way, to make this happen:

Chris Gustin, of Homestead Weavers in Columbus, IN. I found Chris through her website, as I searched for a "home" for Dad's loom. She answered my email offering to donate Dad's loom to anyone who would put it to good use. Chris offered a home in a junior high school art class, for use by an art teacher who is a weaver herself and who is teaching her young students to weave. She's been using her own loom in her classroom because the school couldn't provide one. As we discussed those details, Chris took interest in the story herself, and offered to complete Dad's project for the church, before passing the loom on to the teacher.

Michael DeSteffano, of Mooney's Moving and Storage in Warminster, PA, who packed up Dad's loom at Springhouse Estates, and stored it for us while we figured out what to do with it. Michael is a mover and runs a storage facility, but once we connected with Chris Gustin in Indiana, offered to repack the loom for shipment by freight, even though that was not really his business. He packed it so carefully and so well, that it made the trip to Columbus, IN undamaged, even after it fell over in the truck on route.

Jenn of UPS in Fort Mill, SC, who was so moved by the story when she asked what we were shipping and why that she personally took "logistical command" and arranged the move from Warminster to Columbus, coordinating every detail of the move, even rescheduling to avoid a holiday and weather delay, with many calls to Chris and Michael, to ensure safe delivery of the two palleted boxes.

And Chris again, for receiving the loom, unpacking and reassembling it, using her experience and craft to decode what Dad had already woven and his (literally) back of the envelope notes, and repair a bit of damage to finish the piece and deliver what you hold in your hand now. She will also repack and deliver the loom to the middle school.

Laurette Krause, the middle school art teacher, who will put the loom to good use, teaching a new generation of potential weavers, which would have absolutely thrilled my dad. As you know, he loved to

teach and give of his time and himself, and I can't think of any use or disposition that would have made him happier or prouder than to have young children learning on his loom

Joyce, who endured me thinking out loud, working to find a solution, recruiting the participants, and ultimately making it all happen. It is fitting, in my mind, that she put the finishing touch on the piece, by sewing on the label that says, "Handmade by Robert A. Berger."

I hope that there is a place in the church for this piece and that it serves you and the congregation well for some time to come. It was one of his last wishes and hopes and I am grateful to all and for all who came together to make it happen. I ask that you take a picture of it in the church, and send it to me by email to <u>adberger@comporium.net</u>, so that I can forward it to Chris, and that you put in a prayer for all of these good souls who came together on behalf of a total stranger.

Finally, I want to thank you and Mike for your support of my dad throughout his life, and in his final days. He looked forward to your visits, and truly brightened each time you entered his room. I can't tell you how much you and the church meant to him, and mean to our family.



<u>MARCH CIRCLES</u> Faith and Miracles A Closer Look at Two Gifts of the Holy Spirit

Do you ever say to yourself, I wish I had more faith.

Do you believe that miracles still happen as in Bible times and that they can happen in your life? In March, we will take a closer look at these two gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Where faith is concerned, one of our problems is that we often try to generate faith from within, using human methods. But, as a gift of the Spirit, faith endows us with the confidence that God is going to work in a specific instance. Remember that even for the apostles, faith was not there for every situation. It came on special occasions according to God's sovereign grace. The apostles did not heal all the sick people they encountered. We will explore this gift in our lives in more detail.

As for miracles, we will consider that the most amazing miracle facing every one of us is that it is impossible for us to save ourselves on our own. Yet, God promises to save us through Jesus Christ. So it is a miracle that we are granted salvation and will enter eternal life, and yet we have no idea exactly how that happens. We will look at this miracle and what works for or against us having this gift or working miracles.




