

Deism, derived from the Latin word, deus, meaning god, is the belief that God made the world and then stood back from it. Deistic beliefs do not allow for miracles, the deity of Christ, the Holy Trinity, or a regard for the Holy Scriptures as the authority for doctrine. Many of the Founding Fathers of the United States including Thomas Jefferson were Deists. The "Jefferson Bible" is a pamphlet size volume containing the teachings of Jesus but excluding such things as His miracles and resurrection. Abraham Lincoln, James Madison, Benjamin Franklin, and George Washington were also deists.

Charles Taylor, author of *A Secular Age*, views Deism as a doctrine that is found along the path to atheism. Christians are not deists. We believe that Jesus is the Son of God and that God is a Trinity, one God in three persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We believe in the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead and in miracles, happening not only at the time of Jesus but also now.

The deist believes that God can be seen through nature, apprehended by reason, but not through God's revelation as recorded in the Holy Scriptures. According to this belief, the Word of God and the Sacraments are not means of communion with Him, neither are visions and miracles. The Holy Spirit is not present in believers; for, there is no Holy Spirit in Deism.

A deist believes he can see God in nature, but not in the other ways that Christians have fellowship with the Lord. The Holy Spirit works in Christians to produce faith through the means of grace, the Word and the Sacraments. By these means we have communion with God. This is not so in Deism. Individuals who say that they can commune with God in nature and do not need to go to church are deists, not Christians.

Deism is a religion of the Law and the Law alone. Christians hear Law and Gospel, not only what we should do and have often failed to do through our sins of omission and commission, but also the forgiveness of sins through Jesus Christ, God with us.

Saint Paul asks the rhetorical questions: "The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ?" (1 Corinthians 10:16 ESV) Deists do not believe in such participation, fellowship, and communion.

God is Lord of history and providentially guides it to the fulfillment of His purposes. He is present in special ways among the people of God who hear the Word and receive the Sacraments. The faithful are the body of Christ. God is not only far but also nearby. We know Him now by faith and will see Him face to face in the great Day at the end of time.

Enjoy the beauty of nature this summer. See God present there as you picnic, hike, camp, climb, swim, and so on, but also rejoice in Him as He works in Word and Sacrament among His faithful people, the Church, to which you belong. May the Lord God fill your days with His presence.





Usually shoe box gifts are distributed by local pastor partners to open hearts to Jesus and church doors to entire families.

Holy Trinity members and friends have been packing shoe boxes for more than ten years, both individually and more recently through the addition of our annual shoe box packing party each November. We also have the opportunity to travel to the Baltimore packing center and volunteer to inspect shoe boxes and pack them in cartons for their journey.

Need for Boxes 10-14 Year-Old Boys
