From the Pastors

Dear Parish Family,

Holy Trinity Church is engaged in a number of outreach projects: the AIDS dinner, Martin Luther/Silver Springs School, the Kensington Ministry, Sunday Breakfast Rescue Mission, the Bread of Heaven Food Pantry, Freedom Steps, Christmas Child, and a number of LCW projects and other Social Ministry committee projects. We have probably missed some and for this we apologize.

Through these ministries we are reaching those with AIDS, children, the addicted, the poor, and our men and women in the military. We are engaged in projects over a wide spectrum of social issues.

Our most recently established projects are the Bread of Heaven Food Pantry and the Kensington Ministry. The Kensington Ministry involves two institutions, The Last Stop and Sarnelli House. The Last Stop is a rehabilitation center where AA regularly meets. During the day it offers peanut butter and jelly sandwiches to the people who pass by. Through this street ministry people are drawn into rehab. Members of Holy Trinity make sandwiches. Other supplies are also given to The Last Stop.

Sarnelli House extends hospitality to the people under the "L". Either breakfast, lunch or dinner is served once a day Monday through Friday. A clothing store (free) is located on the premises.

Kensington is one of the most desperate situations in America. It is a drug dealing and drug using center. Not only people from the city but also from the suburbs come there to get high and to live. Drug dealers stand on many corners.

The elevated train superstructure creates a permanent shadow over the avenue. Litter covers the streets. People sleep on stoops, steps, and the sidewalk. Often with bowed heads others are tripping on a stairway or other place. A few die on the sidewalk from an overdose on a lethal drug like fentanyl. Squatters used to live under the bridge on Kensington Avenue near Sarnelli House that has now been cleared by the city.

There is a dazed look of despair and bewilderment on many faces. Hungry people wait in line at Sarnelli House for the gates to open for a meal. Other Christian organizations like Saint Francis House also provide meals.

Members of Holy Trinity have regularly helped prepare meals at Sarnelli House. Most of the guests are quiet and polite. Some express their gratitude for the meal. In line hungry people wait patiently. Rudeness is infrequent. A few are high, but do not cause trouble.

Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary Roman Catholic Church stands above the elevated train on Kensington Ave. and B Street near Lehigh. It is a fitting symbol of the extensive work of the Church in Kensington.

Sarnelli House was founded by the Redemptorist Order (Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer), that does much work among the poor. Redemptorist priests staff Visitation B.V.M. Church.

We are committed to working in Kensington with other Christian brothers and sisters. We hope this ministry will continue to develop as we work with and among fellow brothers and sisters in Christ. Next time, more on the Kensington Ministry.




Dear Holy Trinity Congregation,





"What makes a Great Christian?"




During Lent, we will meet on Wednesdays at 9:30 a.m. / 7:00 p.m. Then following Easter, back to the Tuesday schedule.


The Mission of Jesus by Ray Vander Laan.

At Annual Meeting this year, **Sunday, January 27, 2019** the first item of business will be the adoption of Rules of Procedure. This adoption of Rules of Procedure has always been done at the outset of every denominational or synodical convocation (LCA, ELCA, or NALC). This adoption needs only a simple majority and is done to make the meeting run smoothly. Among other things, The Rules of Procedure say that Holy Trinity's Annual Meeting will be governed by Roberts Rules of Order, that all speeches will be limited to three minutes, and that anyone can present a resolution but that this resolution must be presented in writing to the Committee on Reference and Counsel by 3:00 p.m. on the Monday immediately prior to Annual Meeting. At the time each resolution is presented to Annual Meeting, Reference and Counsel will advise the Annual Meeting as to whether or not the resolution should be adopted. Copies of these Rules of Procedure and Forms for Resolutions are available in the Narthex.



The Collection of Shoebox Items Begins

We hope to fill more than 200 shoeboxes at our **November 10** church packing party. With prayers to meet this goal, we ask you to consider contributing needed items.

General Needs

These are general items that go into every well-packed box. We will need in bulk: washcloths and bars of soap combs (large pick style best) pads of paper NO BIGGER THAN 6"x9" pencil sharpeners and erasers coloring books small stuffed toys, dolls or puppets boys & girls socks – various sizes for ages 2 – 14

We also hope to include toys, puzzles, hair ornaments, balls, balloons, small vehicles, etc. In addition to the bulk items listed above, here is our September wish list.

These are suggestions. Be Creative!

September Emphasis: School Supplies & Toiletries (NO liquids or lotions)

Colored pencils, pens

Childproof scissors, rulers, glue sticks (no bottles), scotch tape Stencils & Stickers (best without words; think animals, flowers, shapes) Color forms, Connect the Dots and Maze books Backpacks for older boys and girls that can be folded compactly Small purses or sacks for younger children Nail files, clippers, emery boards, especially with fun designs Band-Aids, regular and those with fun designs for the younger children.




