From the Pastors

Dear Parish Family,

What is the biblical basis for opposition to abortion? No specific commandment in the Old or New Testaments provides the answer. The pro-life stance must come from something more than a specific commandment.

There are commands, though, that do apply. At the very beginning of Genesis, God said, "Be fruitful and multiply..." Abortion would contravene this commandment though an argument from this text is less than cogent.

The Ten Commandments are found in Exodus and Deuteronomy. One of them is "You shall not murder." Although this commandment does not clinch the argument, it is important to it. The question here is, do the unborn fall under this commandment. The pro-life advocate would say yes. From conception the unborn is to be defined as a person. The pro-choice people deny this. If the unborn have no claim on us, the womb is one of the most dangerous places to be.

When is a person a person? The law of the land creates artificial boundaries that are hard to justify. In what week of pregnancy is the unborn a person? It is best to assume that one is a person from conception though many would disagree.

God gave the plants and, later, animals for humans to eat. In the Scriptures the killing of human beings except in war and capital punishment is prohibited. If the unborn are regarded as persons, though not outside the womb, abortion is murder.

Are the unborn, persons? If they are, the commandment against killing applies. If abortion is murder, then our country is responsible for the unjust deaths of sixty-one million people since *Roe v. Wade*. This is nightmarish.

What should be the church's position? If we consider Christian doctrine as a whole, we should be strongly inclined to the pro-life position. God brings human life into existence. It is precious to Him. It should thus be respected. A pro-choice position is unworthy of the church. Modern technology has made abortions safer. But, we must not conclude that because we can do it, we should. The life of the unborn, made in the image of God, should have greater weight among us than anything else.

Should exceptions be allowed? Here we tread on uncertain ground. If it is allowed, it should occur in very rare instances for very good reasons.

Pastor Mike has and will continue to go to Washington in January for the March for Life and to participate in the Life Chain at Abington-Jefferson Hospital every October. You are invited to accompany him.

Next time, we will discuss the culture of death.


It's no secret: All we have comes from God. We hear talk from time to time about "self-made: millionaires, but most millionaires will tell you they didn't do it alone. We work for what we have in life. Actually, millionaires give back too. Every millionaire is responsible for creating 1,000 jobs. Every billionaire is responsible for 10,000 jobs created. But that said, work does not make it ours. "The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof; the world and those that dwell therein." Bottom line: it's all God's. It's all from God.

David Ramsey of the Financial Peace University has a good thought on this. "...being a steward really isn't a Christian idea at all. It's actually an Old English concept drawn from the days of castles and realms and the people who ran them. In those days (think 'Braveheart'), people lived in realmsareas of land approximately the size of three countries today. In the middle of that realm was a castle, where the lord of the realm lived.

"Now, the lord owned everything in the realm. He owned all the land, all the farms, all the buildings, and all the commerce. Everything was under his control and authority. Of course, the lord's castle was the nicest home in the realm, but another house nearby was pretty nice as well. That's where the lord's steward lived. The steward didn't own anything, but he took care of everything that belonged to the lord. He managed the crop rotations, the labor force, the taxes, the banking, the commerce, and any of the lord's other interests.

"That's what stewardship was all about - asset management. So, in the early 1600s when the translators of the King James Bible needed a word to describe how God wants believers to handle money, the idea of stewards and stewardship was a natural fit. On one hand, God is the Lord. Psalm 24:1 says, 'the earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof.' He owns it all. On the other hand, we are responsible to manage His stuff for His glory. That makes us stewards - or managers- of His resources. And just like the Old English lord held the steward responsible for his stewardship, we are going to give an account of how we manage God's resources (1 Corinthians 4:2). As believers, we can't disconnect the ideas of ownership and stewardship. When we understand our responsibility as asset managers, we can gratefully receive what God passes to us and enjoy what He has entrusted to us. But if we start thinking of ourselves as owners, it becomes much harder for us to open our hands (and our hearts) to use His money for His purposes."

The Holy Trinity Stewardship Committee believes in the ministry of this church, as do we all. Please consider taking a step up in your giving this year. During the coming weeks, pray about this, and make your commitment to grow. No matter how you choose to grow, whether by a percent of income or by a flat dollar amount, seek the Lord's guidance. If it is God's will, you'll find a way.





Stewardship Weekend will be November 10 & 11, 2018

What do we mean by the term Stewardship

Weekend? It is the name we use for the Weekend on which we return our *Pledge Card* for the support of the church program in the New Year beginning in January.

How do I get a *Pledge Card?* You will get one via e-mail during October. Others will be available in the narthex.

Why should I return a *Pledge Card?* Can't I just put my offering in the offering plate at worship? The church has many expenses for curriculum materials, heat, light, building upkeep, salaries, insurance and other things. These expenses must be budgeted in order that we may know what kind of program of worship, fellowship, education, music, evangelism and other parts of our witness can be carried out -- and what we can do for others. Unless our members decide in advance the amount they can give we can't plan an effective ministry.

What if I return a *Pledge Card* and then suffer financial reverses during the year that make it impossible to pay that amount? The Church is the Body of Christ; it is not a loan company. If circumstances you did not foresee make it necessary to reduce or even cancel the amount you thought you could give, all you need to do is to tell God. True Christians also make adjustments upward when their incomes are increased or they receive unexpected additional income during the year.

Will I be solicited personally in my home?

No. You will never receive a telephone call or visitor soliciting you for money. You will receive e-mails that we hope you will read carefully and prayerfully. **Does this church talk about money all the time?** No. This church is not always talking about money. The church is always talking about Jesus Christ. It is only with money that the program of the church as we know it today can continue to exist.

Why does the church ask for an increase in giving from each of us every year? Every year deeply committed Christians who gave substantially either die, experience grave financial reverses, or move to other communities. It is only with new and increased pledges that we can replace this loss. We especially hope that those who give \$5 a week or less will increase their giving by \$2 or more a week.

How much should I give? Did you know that Holy Trinity presently receives offerings from approximately 320 households. Of these, 240 households give \$1 - \$25 per week. If each of these households were to increase their giving by \$2.00 per week, Holy Trinity would have \$20,000 more per year. The remaining 80 households give more than \$25 per week. If each of these households were to increase their giving by \$5.00 per week, we'd have another \$20~000. A small amount from many families would make a huge difference to Holy Trinity for next, year's budget.

When is Stewardship Sunday?

Stewardship Sunday is the Second Sunday in November. Please prayerfully consider increasing the amount you give to Holy Trinity by just \$2 to \$5 a week. Please also think about participating in Sinply Giving.



Simply Giving

What is Simply Giving? It is a convenient, safe, and simple way for you to handle church offerings through electronic fund transfers directly from your checking or savings account. This automated program allows payments to be deposited directly into Holy Trinity's account on a steady, uninterrupted basis, providing the church with greater financial stability, less bookkeeping, and more confidence in meeting financial obligations. Many people already know how convenient electronic fund transfers are in paying bills and simplifying their records.

How does Simply Giving work? Church members who wish to give their offering through electronic transfer fill out a Member Enrollment and Authorization Form, indicating the amount they wish to have withdrawn and the frequency B weekly (Monday), semimonthly (1st and 15th), or monthly (1st or 15th). They also attach a voided check or savings deposit slip. These forms may be placed in the Jehoiada Chest at a service on the second Sunday in November, turned in to the church office, or placed in the offering plate at any time. The church submits this information to Vanco Services, LLC, a Minnesota-based financial-technology services company.

Who sees the information on the Enrollment Member and Form? Authorization The church secretary and financial secretary process these forms for Holy Trinity and keep this information confidential. Vanco Services, LLC employees who process the information at their end are bonded and have signed confidentiality agreements. None of the participant information is shared with any other organization.

How much does this program cost? All *Simply Giving* transaction fees are paid by Holy Trinity Lutheran Church. Donors pay nothing to use this service.

Is there a minimum amount? Yes. \$5 is the minimum amount per transaction.

If participants have a joint signature account, do both parties need to sign the form? Only one signature is required.

How do participants change the amount, account and/or frequency of their contribution, and how quickly is it processed? You can change the amount, the account from which it is withdrawn, and/or the frequency of withdrawal by completing a new authorization form. You request this form from the church office, fill it out, and return it. If you are changing the account, you must also attach a voided check or withdrawal slip. Within a week, your request is faxed and processed. When and where should I turn in my Member Enrollment and Authorization Form? You may bring your completed form with the attached voided check or deposit slip to one of the worship services during Commitment Weekend, the second weekend in November. A time will be provided at each worship service to place your information in the Jehoiada chest. Or you may place your information in the offering plate at any worship service that is convenient for you. Or you may bring it to the church office at any time.

How do participants keep a record of the amounts they have contributed? The participant's bank statement will include an itemized list of all electronic fund transfers from their account. A record of these transactions will also be provided on annual offering statements.

What if a transaction is rejected due to non-sufficient funds, closed account, etc.? This information will be emailed or faxed to the congregation immediately after Vanco Services, LLC receives notification from the bank. The church financial secretary will contact the person to determine together how to proceed.

What are some banking advantages for using electronic fund transfers for church contributions? Electronic fund transfers are safe, reliable, and convenient. All such transfers are governed by strict national rules and guidelines set by the Automated Clearing House Network and governed by Regulation E of the Federal Reserve. More than four billion electronic fund transfers are processed annually in the United States. This process is more efficient, more secure, and less expensive than credit card transactions and more efficient and timely than check collection.

Some years ago, our Church Council and finance-people examined this program and found it to be a good one. Since then *Simply Giving* has been offered as a way that members could support Holy Trinity's ministries.

Our financial gifts through the Church are a response to God's abundant gifts to us. Ministries flourish at Holy Trinity because of your faithful giving in response to the gifts of God.

On All Saints Sunday, families (and individuals) who wish to commemorate a loved one are invited to join the procession and place a lighted memorial candle on the altar.


Come to the narthex before the beginning of the service to join the formation of the procession.

If you wish to participate, be sure to bring a votive candle with you from home. Your votive candle must be in a glass votive candle holder. (Suggested colors for the glass candle holder are clear, red, or white.)

During the processional, you will carry your lit candle to the altar. You will then place your candle on the altar, as you speak aloud the name of the person whom you are remembering before God.

These are the saints. Their lights still shine before the throne of God.

After worship, please remember to take your candle home with you, to use during your personal or family devotions.





Why Bibles? And, Why Bibles for China?

Imagine if no one at Holy Trinity had a copy of the Bible, including Pastors Mandy and Mike? Imagine them preaching without firsthand reference to the Scripture? What if we had to rely on word-of-mouth and memorization by those who came in contact with Scripture in other places?

This is the situation for many people groups living in China. These people have often come to Jesus through the underground house church movement and are praying desperately for a copy of the Holy Bible. **They are not begging for food and clothing but BIBLES**!

November 11 is the International Day of the Bible.

We at Holy Trinity have been partnering with Asia Harvest through our contributions each November to provide Bibles for our Chinese brothers and sisters. For only \$1.80, Asia Harvest can print and distribute a Bible. In fact, Asia Harvest can print and distribute 230,000 Chinese Bibles per month depending on incoming funds.

Please help equip our Chinese brothers and sisters in Christ and fuel the fires of revival that are burning throughout the world's largest nation. What might you be willing to give up this week to put \$5, \$10, or \$20 towards Bibles for believers?

Many people believe China is now a rich country so people there no longer need our help. 90% of China's house church Christians live in rural areas thousands of miles away from modern cities like Beijing and Shanghai. The revival in China is burning bright in remote provinces where thousands are coming to Christ daily and they are among the poorest of the poor in China.

2. Many Christians have heard that Bibles are now legally printed inside China by the government approved Amity Press. However, in a country of more than 1,300 million people, allowing a trickle of legal Bibles only available in the registered churches cannot satisfy the need of 60 million + Christians who do not belong to the government-approved churches.

At Annual Meeting this year, **Sunday, January 27, 2019** the first item of business will be the adoption of Rules of Procedure. This adoption of Rules of Procedure has always been done at the outset of every denominational or synodical convocation (LCA, ELCA, or NALC). This adoption needs only a simple majority and is done to make the meeting run smoothly. Among other things, The Rules of Procedure say that Holy Trinity's Annual Meeting will be governed by Roberts Rules of Order, that all speeches will be limited to three minutes, and that anyone can present a resolution but that this resolution must be presented in writing to the Committee on Reference and Counsel by 3:00 p.m. on the Monday immediately prior to Annual Meeting.

At the time each resolution is presented to Annual Meeting, Reference and Counsel will advise the Annual Meeting as to whether or not the resolution should be adopted. Copies of these Rules of Procedure and Forms for Resolutions are available in the Narthex.




It's an easy way to shop and a great way to help...


