From the Pastors

Dear Parish Family,

Jesus declared that the poor are blessed. More so than the other Gospels, Luke reflects Jesus' concern for the poor. At the beginning of His ministry, Jesus read a passage from Isaiah in the synagogue at Nazareth: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he had anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor, He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and the recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." (Quoted in Luke 4: 18-19 ESV) The Messiah has a special concern for the poor.

In the Lucan version of the beatitudes, Jesus says, "Blessed are you who are poor" rather than "Blessed are the poor in spirit," again showing Luke's and Jesus' concern for the poor.

Referring to the passage from Isaiah He quoted earlier, Jesus told the disciples of John the Baptist: "Go and tell John what you have seen and heard: the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, the dead are raised up, the poor have good news preached to them. And blessed is the one who is not offended by me."(Luke 7: 22-23 ESV) Again Jesus expressed his concern for the poor. In Luke 14: 13, Jesus counselled his host to invite the crippled, lame, blind, and poor to dinner.

The story of Lazarus, the poor man begging at the gate of the rich man, is unique to Luke. The rich man does not invite Lazarus in so that his suffering can be relieved. The rich man is condemned; Lazarus is taken to heaven in the bosom of Abraham.

Both the story of the rich ruler and of Zacchaeus, the tax collector, are admonitions to give to the poor. The rich man went away in sadness. In contrast, Zacchaeus committed himself to give away half of his assets to the poor. Jesus responded, "Today salvation has come to this house, since he also is a son of Abraham. For the Son of Man came to seek and save the lost." (Luke 19: 9 ESV)

In Acts, written by Luke, the early Church is described in part, this way: "And all who believed were together and had all things in common. And they were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had needs." (Acts 2: 45 ESV)

What can we conclude? Jesus would have us show a special concern for the poor and share our abundance with them. We pray that our church keep this commitment. Let us remember what the Blessed Virgin Mary sang, "... he has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty." (Luke 1: 53 ESV) The rich too can belong to the Kingdom, but only by God's grace that leads to generosity. May we rich follow after our Lord.

We believe that it is because of all your prayers, and the prayers of others, that he came home on January 24th. The doctors were afraid that Howard would have brain damage - but, we all know that all things are possible with God and Christ, prayers are powerful. Physically, he is still recovering. He is receiving PT and OT therapy at home and a home care nurse comes at least once a week. And recently, he and Sheila were able to go to one of their wonderful neighbors for dinner. He continues to progress on a daily basis, but, understands it is going to take time. And, as he continues to learn about what happened to him and the shape he was in, he too is realizing that his recovery is a miracle.
