Dear Parish Family,

The Fourth Sunday in Lent is also called *Laetare*, a title for the day found in the *Service Book and Hymnal*, but not in the *Lutheran Book of Worship*. *Laetare* means rejoice, the first word in the Introit (entrance chant sung by the choir at Holy Trinity) of the liturgy for that day. "Rejoice ye with Jerusalem, and be glad with her: all ye that mourn for her *Ps*. I was glad when they said unto me: Let us go into the house of the Lord. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost: as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen." (*Service Book and Hymnal*, p. 85) In the midst of Lent, a season of repentance, we are also called to rejoice.

The Third Sunday in Advent, a season also with a penitential theme, includes a call to rejoice. The Introit reads, "Rejoice (*Gaudete*) in the Lord always: and again I say, Rejoice. Let your moderation be known unto all men: the Lord is at hand..." (*SBH*, p. 76) We not only prepare for the return of the Lord with repentance, but also with rejoicing at His future coming. Advent is a season of hope with repentance as the subtheme.

The color of the chasuble, the cape over the white alb worn by the pastor, on *Gaudete* and *Laetare*, is rose. Our new rose chasuble for *Laetare* includes purple, reminding us that we are still in Lent.

The first words in the Introit for *Gaudete* (rejoice, be glad) are from Paul's letter to the Philippians. "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. (Phillipians 4: 4-7 ESV) Let us take Paul's advice and rejoice always in the Lord, not being anxious but lifting up our hearts in prayer. Even when we are in a season of repentance, we rejoice, especially when we go into the house of the Lord to worship together.



Why are Lilies the Flower of Easter?

More than any other flower, the Easter lily is the traditional, time-honored flower of Easter. Symbolic of the resurrection, Easter Lilies rise from earthly

graves as scaly bulbs, and bloom into majestic flowers that embody the purity, virtue, innocence, hope and resurrection they symbolize.

Dating back to Biblical times, the lily is mentioned numerous times in the Bible. One of the most famous Biblical references is in the Sermon on the Mount, when Christ told His listeners: "Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they toil not, neither do they spin; and yet ... Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these."

Tradition has it that when Eve left the Garden of Eden, she shed real tears of repentance, and from those remorseful tears sprang up the lilies of Easter. These lilies sprang up to remind Eve that God would never forget that He had promised Adam and Eve that He would send the Messiah to defeat "that ancient serpent" who had deceived them into disobedience.

The pure white lily has long been associated with the baby Jesus and Mary, his mother. In ancient paintings, the Angel Gabriel is pictured extending to the Virgin Mary a branch of pure white lilies, announcing that she is to be the mother of the Christ Child. In other paintings, saints are pictured bringing vases full of white lilies to Mary and the infant Jesus, prefiguring His resurrection.

Often called the "white-robed apostles of hope," lilies were found growing in the Garden of Gethsemane after Christ's agony. Tradition has it that the beautiful white lilies sprang up where drops of Christ's sweat fell to the ground in His final hours of sorrow and deep distress. Churches continue this tradition at Easter time by banking their altars and surrounding their crosses with masses of Easter Lilies, to commemorate the resurrection of Jesus Christ and hope of eternal life.

The majestic white flower has so thoroughly come to symbolize the Resurrection of Christ, that the phrase "to gild the lily" has come into common usage meaning "a foolish attempt to improve on perfection." To many artists and poets it has seemed that, if any flower could have one, the Easter lily would have a soul.

Enjoy Your Lilies for Years to Come!

Once all danger of frost has passed, you can move your lilies to a sunny location outside.

To plant your Easter lilies, prepare a welldrained garden bed in a sunny location with rich organic matter (one part soil, one part peat moss, one part perlite). Good drainage is the key for success with lilies. Plant your bulbs 3 inches below ground level, and at least 12-18 inches apart in a hole sufficiently deep that the bulbs can be placed in it with the roots spread out and down. Spread the roots and work the prepared soil around the bulbs and roots, leaving no air pockets. Water immediately and thoroughly after planting.

As the original plants die back, cut the stems back to the soil surface. New growth will soon emerge. Your lilies will bloom again NEXT YEAR IN JULY. It is possible that they could bloom again later this summer, but most likely you will have to wait until the summer after this one to see your lilies bloom again. (It is only under controlled greenhouse conditions that these bulbs can be forced to bloom in March or April.)

The Easter Lily is surprisingly hardy, even in cold climates. Just be sure to provide winter protection for your bulbs by mulching them generously. Remember: Lilies like their roots in the shade (mulch) and their heads in the sun.

Alumna Profile: Martina Smith

hat better path for a person to take – when her *whole family* is musical – than a path that takes her on a journey that includes Philadelphia Sinfonia?

That's the path taken by Martina Smith, a French horn player and undergraduate horn performance major at Temple University. Martina was inspired to join Sinfonia from many directions: "My older sister, Nellie, who plays cello, was in Sinfonia before I was, and she loved it so much and inspired me to want to join My horn teacher at that time, Bill Bonnell, [also] highly recommended Sinfonia to me. My whole family is musical: my mother is a soprano and music director at our church, my father is a composer, my oldest sister is an oboist and early wind specialist, and my other sister, [the] cellist, also plays baroque cello and viola da gamba."

Wow – now that's a lot of influence to join Sinfonia! During her sophomore year in high school, Martina joined the newly-formed Philadelphia Sinfonia Players ensemble, and continued in the advanced group, Philadelphia Sinfonia, during her junior and senior years. Among Martina's most memorable experiences were performing Beethoven's 9th Symphony in Verizon Hall, and Engelbert Humperdinck's opera, *Hansel und Gretel* – narrated by Martina's father. Martina shares that this was a very special way "for me to see him collaborate with all of my friends in Sinfonia!" She also returned to Sinfonia in January as an alum to perform Mahler's *Symphony No. 1*, which was "just exhilarating!"

Martina has loved her years of study at Temple. She has studied with Jeffrey Lang, Associate Principal Horn of the Philadelphia Orchestra - whom she had met first through a brass sectional at Şinfonia. She has worked with many members of The Philadelphia Orchestra, played with the Curtis Orchestra, and performed in orchestra, wind symphony, chamber ensembles, and in solo recitals at Temple. Martina highly recommends Temple "for any young aspiring brass players who want to study with Philadelphia Orchestra musicians in a competitive but healthy school environment that is also very affordable."

Martina, who plans to continue horn performance in graduate school and freelance as well, encourages young musicians to "keep a balance of knowing what you want, but being open to any opportunities that come your way.... I have seen just how successful musicians are

when they are the most flexible, as they are the ones who get the most well-known and get the most "gigs" or playing opportunities. Learn to be happy with the opportunities you have been given, but don't give up that push for improvement. Balance is key in our happiness and self-improvement, and one of the most important things to focus on in college is why you are playing your instrument, knowing how it makes you and others feel, and to enjoy improvement in a healthy and balanced way."
