From "All Glory, Laud, and Honor" to "Jesus Christ Is Risen Today" the hymns for Holy Week rehearse the great acts of salvation that are at the heart of the Christian faith. Holy Week begins with Passion (Palm) Sunday. In that service we remember both the entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem and His death on the cross. The service begins with the palm procession to the hymn "All Glory, Laud, and Honor," (*LBW, 108*) written by Theodulph, Bishop of Orleans, during the time of Charlemagne and his son, Louis the Pious. Jesus is the Son of David and King, whom heaven and earth praise. The worshipping congregation joins the universal church and the angelic choirs in praise.

"At the Cross, Her Station Keeping," (*LBW, 110; Stabat Mater dolorosa*, the first words of the hymn in Latin, means "the sorrowful mother was standing") is a thirteenth century hymn that focuses on the sorrow of Mary at the suffering and death of Christ. This hymn was sung throughout the ecumenical Stations of the Cross at Our Lady Help of Christians.

Thomas Aquinas, the great medieval scholastic theologian, wrote "Now, My Tongue, the Mystery Telling," (*LSB*, 630) a hymn sung on Maundy Thursday concerning the Sacrament of Holy Communion. The Lord gives His very body and blood every time we partake of the Sacrament.

Venantius Honorius Fortunatus (sixth century) wrote a hymn that we sang on Good Friday, "Sing, My Tongue, the Glorious Battle." (*Hymnal 1982, 166*) Its theme is told in the first verse: "Jesus Christ, the world's redeemer from that cross now reigns as King." His death on the cross was a great victory that won for us redemption.

"The Royal Banners Forward Go" (tune, Vexilla Regis; *LBW*, *125*) was also written by Venantius Fortunatus. Again the theme is of Christ's victory over evil. The writer lays emphasis on the cross that is called "tree of beauty, tree most fair."



On Good Friday we also sang "O Sacred Head, Now Wounded," (*LBW 116, 117*) written by Bernard of Clairvaux. Bernard was a member of the Cistercian Order. During his life he wrote numerous works including sermons on the Song of Songs. Bernard was one of Martin Luther's favorite saints. In the portion of the hymn included in the *Lutheran Book of Worship*, the emphasis is on the head of Jesus that is "with grief and shame weighed down." Jesus' "grief and bitter Passion were all for sinners' gain."

On Easter Sunday we sang among many hymns "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today; Alleluia." (*LBW, 128*) The paschal victim, Jesus Christ, is now the triumphant Lord, for through His death and resurrection Christ has reconciled sinners. Alleluia means "Praise the Lord." It is the Latin spelling of the Hebrew word, Hallelujah.

In coming months we will unpack the meaning of these and other hymns. Until then, may you have a joyous Easter season.

## SALT AND LIGHT

"You are the salt of the earth, but if salt has lost its taste, how shall its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything except to be thrown out and trampled under people's feet. You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so, they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven."

*Matthew* 5:13-16

Jesus Christ means we are either salt or we are not salt. But the salt may lose savor. It may lose its ability to cleanse and preserve and it then ceases to be salt at all. It stops working. Likewise, Dietrich Bonhoeffer states in his book, *The Cost of Discipleship*, "The discipleship mission is to save the world, but if the community ceases to live up to its mission, if it loses its saltiness, its mission may be lost. The call of Christ makes those who respond to it the salt of the earth in their total existence." He continues, "...either we follow the call or we are crushed beneath it."

Jesus also calls his disciples the light of the world. Jesus says, "Let your light shine before others, so they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." "The light is not an instrument which has been put in your hands, such as preaching. It is the disciples themselves.... You are the light in your whole existence, provided you remain faithful to your calling.... And since you are the light, you can no longer remain hidden, even if you want to. It is the property of light to shine" (Bonhoeffer).

There are so many ways we can witness our faith to others. But one common denominator in all testimonies is this: they describe a turning point in one's life — how Christ's saving action made a difference and change in one's life — relationships, lifestyles and ministries.

Although there are countless ways to give testimony to how God is making a difference in your life, there are two ways, not often mentioned, that we can be salt and light which leave a lasting impression on others and lead them towards Christ: goodwill ambassadors and legacy giving.

First: Is your witness salty? Does it flavor, cleanse and preserve the mission of Holy Trinity? How do you leave a lasting impression, a stamp of "goodwill" on others? Paul states in 2 Corinthians 5:20, "Therefore, we are ambassadors of Christ, God making his appeal through us." Through Christ's death and resurrection, God reconciled the world. We through faith become God's agents for reconciliation. Thus, as ambassadors, with God's help, we are to comply with every part of the gospel in our relationships. Every day, God gives us opportunities to recognize, exercise and maximize our influence through testimony!

You are called to be goodwill ambassadors for Christ, being unified, talking positively about Holy Trinity's mission and promoting the greater mission of the NALC. You and I are God's representatives. People are influenced by our words, actions and decisions. When we speak positively and passionately about our congregation's leadership and ministry, we are more apt to draw family members, coworkers and friends into the church rather than turn them away.


Second: Do you speak well of Holy Trinity's mission and ministry to others? Words have power and can influence for good or bad. Even when you disagree, does your light continue to shine? "Iron sharpens iron, and one man sharpens another" (Proverbs 27:17). The responsibility of testimony is in the hands of each of us. And our testimony is sharpened in community.

Paul is imploring us to be reconciled to God, to be coworkers in the ministry of the gospel and to not be a stumbling block to each other. "Walk in wisdom toward outsiders, making the best use of the time. Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how you ought to answer each person" (Colossians 4:5-6). A goodwill ambassador is one who works for the greater good of the mission — not tarnishing but building up the reputation of Holy Trinity and the NALC.

How do others outside the church experience the testimony of Holy Trinity? "Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things" (Philippians 4:8).

You are salt. You are light. How will your choices in the way you serve flavor and reflect the mission of Holy Trinity? Spiritual Gifts Commitment Weekend is May 11 & 12. You should have received the Time & Talent Packet by email. If you are not on the email list, copies are available in the narthex. Please review the ministry teams and select when and how you want to serve our community.

You will have the opportunity to place your completed form in the Jehoida Chest during the service you attend. The Stewardship Team is praying that during these next few weeks, the Holy Spirit will open your heart and mind to hear God's Word and put into action the work of the Lord.
