Dear Parish Family,

Our church bells are now operating. They ring for us and for the neighborhood. In his *Thoughts of Solitude* Thomas Merton gives an excellent description of their significance.

Bells are meant to remind us that God alone is good, that we belong to Him, that we are not living for this world.

They break in upon our cares in order to remind us that all things will pass away and that our preoccupations are not important.

They speak to us of our freedom, which responsibilities and transient cares make us forget.

They are the voice of our alliance with the God of heaven.

They tell us that we are His true temple. They call us to peace with Him within ourselves.

The Gospel of Mary and Martha is read at the end of the Blessing of a Church Bell in order to remind us of all these things.

The bells say: business does not matter. Rest in God and rejoice, for this world is only the figure and the promise of a world to come, and only those who are detached from transient things can possess the substance of an eternal promise.

The People's Emergency Center needs our help.

PEC provides emergency housing and comprehensive services to over 200 families experiencing homelessness in Philadelphia every year. Because these families turn to PEC in moments of crisis, they are generally unable to provide basic needs for their children, including school supplies and school uniforms. PEC is deeply committed to the needs of these students and their goal is to provide every child in their care with at least two school uniforms and basic supplies such as:



Operation Christmas Child Shoe Boxes filled with school supplies, toiletries, toys, and accessories bring needed items to boys and girls around the world where they are victims of poverty, war, famine, and/or disasters. They also enable us to be the loving hands and feet of Jesus and bring the Gospel story presented in a child’s language and in a culturally appropriate way. Usually shoe box gifts are distributed by local pastor partners to open hearts to Jesus and church doors to entire families.

Holy Trinity members and friends have been packing shoe boxes for more than ten years, both individually and more recently through the addition of our annual shoe box packing party each November. We also have the opportunity to travel to the Baltimore packing center and volunteer to inspect shoe boxes and pack them in cartons for their journey.

The summer months are a good time to begin buying supplies, often on sale,

both for your own individually packed shoe boxes as well as for contributions to our church packing party.

We as a church have responded to the need for more boxes for 10-14-year-old boys. Katie Beyer and Linda Borkowski report from their Baltimore packing center experience that more boxes are also needed for 2-4-year-olds.




