From the Pastors

Dear Parish Family, From Pastor Mike's blog on The Templeton Project:

What is Bigotry?

Bigotry is the hatred of people of a certain social or economic class, religion, race, nation, ethnic group, political affiliation, gender. (There are only two genders. God created gender and sex, not us), or ideology by an individual, group of individuals, society, or nation that may eventuate on a political level in laws against them and even more violent persecution. Bigotry involves the prejudgment (prejudice) of a person based, not on his personal qualities including character, but on a group he represents. Prejudices can be formed, not only from personal experience but also from the judgments of others that one accepts for whatever reason. Negative judgments of others based on some category are often derived from preconceived notions.

The word bigotry has been thrown around in America as political conflict increases. In these cases the definition of bigotry seems to be far too wide or the judgment is blatantly false. Such name calling has become a political tool. An important measure of whether the word is appropriate in a certain situation or situations is only fairly determined by a clear definition of the word's meaning and, if the definition is inaccurate, a re-formulation of the definition. Gut-feeling reactions and responses are sometimes right, but often wrong.

Sexual preference requires a bit further discussion. While the orthodox Christian Church regards homosexuality as an ethical fault and sin, homosexual persons are not to be mistreated. Such mistreatment manifests sin fighting sin. All people are to be respected as human beings.

The Church must teach both respect for all people and the limits of sexual union in marriage of one man and one women. When dealing with ethical questions, we are to respect the person, yet defend the teaching.

Bigotry is not to have any credence within the Christian community. Throughout the New Testament all people are invited into the Church. In Galatians Saint Paul writes, "...in Jesus Christ you are all sons of God, through faith. For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male or female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." (Galatians 3: 26 - 29a ESV)





This has been a difficult year for us in that we have become a little shorthanded due to a diminishment in staff. As a result of these changes, I have had to pick up some of the workload to make sure everything still gets done as it should. So, in October it did occur to me to reapply for the grant that we have received from your congregation for the past three years to supplement our religious education curriculum. However, October came and went, and I did not get the opportunity to complete the application for the funds. So, you can imagine my grateful surprise when we received a check for \$1500.00 in November from the endowment fund.

Dear Holy Trinity Supporters,

We are sending you an update on the China Bible donation (\$1,500) the church kindly sent last October, plus the subsequent gift in December for \$588, which was designated "where needed most" but which was applied to China Bibles.

The \$2,088 total for China Bibles enabled us to print and deliver 1,160 full Chinese Bibles to the house churches in these 3 provinces: Gansu, Jiangsu, and Sichuan. For more detailed reporting on the project overall, we wrote this email newsletter at the start of the year.

That has been applied accordingly, and in June the Chinese brothers traveled around the country meeting with each recipient and then file the latest update from them, which we can then send to you after it has been translated.



MARCH CIRCLES

Love is Kind and Uplifting

"Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things." 1 Corinthians 13: 4-7

Life is sometimes cruel and painful. Everyone wants to be treated with kindness; without it life becomes painful and hard to bear. In this month's lesson, we'll see that Jesus' love shows us how to be kind. If we're to love as Jesus loves us, it's essential that we treat others kindly. Sometimes this is easy and other times it may be extremely difficult. Words can be loving and kind, or they can be brutal and destructive. One of the most needed acts of kindness is that of building each other up. We all need someone who will reach out to us with kindness and an uplifting attitude. Here are the two things we'll focus on this month:

- 1. To recognize and accept the lovingkindness of the Lord towards us.
- 2. To choose words and actions of kindness that will reach out to others with love that builds them up.

We'll begin with some questions. We'll ask God to make us aware of any unkindness toward others in our lives. Then we're to ask Him to teach us to replace unkind words and deeds with actions that are kind and uplifting. No small task. But with God nothing is impossible.

Memorize Psalm 19:14 and make it your daily prayer.


