"In the Interim"

As we go through life, we often find ourselves "in between the times:" Waiting at a red light, sitting restlessly in the doctor's reception area, the team sits in the locker room at the half-time. They are all "in between the times."

Some of those "in between the times" intervals last longer. A baby is conceived, and the expected nine months are "in between the times." An engagement ring is given and accepted, and then the couple is living "in between the times." In this COVID-19 world, we are all living in the time between complete shut-down and returning to living more "normally," whatever that may be.

The planet itself lives in between the times. The world right now exists in an in-between time known as an interglacial time. The last ice age was about 11,000 years ago. Yet you did not wake up this morning saying to your spouse, "honey, remember we are in between the ice ages." Nevertheless, the world does spin its way around the sun in between the glacial times.

How much of your life do you spend "in between the times?" waiting in lines, sitting at the end of the runway waiting for the take-off, waiting to go to sleep, -- all of these mark that margin called "in between the times." In one way or another, all of us are living in that no man's land all of the time. In fact, living between the times just belongs to the human condition.

Here at Holy Trinity, we find ourselves in a kind of "in-between-times" which we have not experienced for 33 years! We are between two Pastorates. As the Interim Pastor, I humbly accept your invitation to serve as your Interim Pastor in this in-between time. We have much to do in this interim.

Our Regional Dean, Pastor David McGettigan and our Mission District Dean, Pastor Dan Schaeffer will be working with the Congregation and Council to discern where we are in our ministry and what we feel, is God's design for our ministry in the future. My role is to provide pastoral leadership as we continue the day-to-day ministries to which the Holy Spirit is calling us. I look forward to working in this capacity in this interim period. I depend on the guidance of the Holy Spirit in this ministry. Please pray for me as I promise to pray for you daily.

As we face the future in these in-between-times, we must remember that things will be different. We have many good traditions and practices as a congregation but we must also be open to the leadership of God, the Holy Spirit as we seek a new Pastor. We will be learning new ways, new traditions, new things that we have never done before. A wise saying that I learned many years ago is, "the last words of a congregation are: 'but we never did it that way before.'" Pray that we will be open to God's New Thing for us. (Isaiah 43:19)

We will be challenged to consider who we are and what is it that makes us the church of Jesus Christ. In all that we do it is the eternal Word of God that defines who we are and what we are called to do. As Lutheran Christians, we understand the Word of God to be: (1) the Holy Scriptures, God's inspired Word (Ps. 119:105); (2) the Message of the Gospel of Christ that binds us together (Eph. 1:13); and (3) Jesus, the Word-made-flesh. (John 1:14). We will center all that we do and say around that eternal Word. And as we live together as such, let us live together as brothers and sisters of Christ in this community. I think the words of St. Paul to the Colossians are good for us to consider:

¹² Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, ¹³ bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. ¹⁴ And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. ¹⁵ And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. ¹⁶ Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. ¹⁷ And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him. (Col. 3: 12-17)

These are good words for us to live by in these in-betweentimes. Finally, also remember that we are living in-between the two comings of our Lord, Jesus Christ. By faith we look back to His finished redemptive work on the cross and in the open tomb, and we look forward to His glorious return. As redeemed citizens of a heavenly kingdom, we live in-between the times. We are the ones who affirm: "Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again!"

I invite you to join with me and the entire congregation as we face these in-between-times with faith in our Lord, Jesus Christ; a commitment to live as his disciples, following His Word; and giving thanks and rejoicing in His wonderful promise that "I am with you always, even to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20)

My dear family of Christ at Holy Trinity,

We often call ourselves a family and we truly are. Haven't we yearned to be together, to see each other, to talk to each other, and to worship The Holy Trinity together? The Walk of Honor on June 13 was the first time we were all together for several months. In these difficult times, it was a wonderful way to say "Thank you" and to honor our retired pastors, Mike and Mandy. As I spoke with many of our family, I kept hearing I miss seeing each other, I miss worship, I miss being in church, I miss Holy Communion. As we begin to gather again for worship on June 20 & 21, we will be strengthened by the Word of God and the Sacraments in our common faith in our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

But we are part of a larger family, the North American Lutheran Church. Holy Trinity Family:

With Pastors Mike and Mandy's retirement Holy Trinity is now in a period of pastoral vacancy and transition. We are being ably led by The Reverend Larry Guenzel and are thankful for his leadership. Now that the pastors have retired, the church council is responsible for electing a call committee made up of six members.

Guidance on the call process can be found on the NALC website (<u>thenalc.org</u>) and navigating to the Call Process page where the NALC Call Process Manual and other Informative materials can be found. I encourage every member to review these materials and understand that church council has been advised that it will take up to 12 months or more for Holy Trinity to have a new pastor.

This coming Wednesday evening at the July meeting church council will be identifying members who the council believes possess the attributes needed to be on the call committee and then asking them if they would be willing to serve. Once the committee is formed, there will be a congregational workshop (see the NALC website for details) and the committee will review candidates.

If you would like to suggest someone to be a member of the call committee, or serve yourself, you may send me an email with the name of the person along with a two or three sentence statement explaining why that person ought to be considered.

You may approach me in person or by phone or email the church @ <u>secretary@holytrinity.net</u> if you have any questions about this process. You might think there is nothing you can do to contribute to the process; that is incorrect. You can pray for spiritual discernment of the council and call committee throughout this process.




