From the Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

Last month I wrote: There are five Developmental Tasks that take place as we journey together in this Interim Ministry journey that we are living through now. The first Developmental Task is: **Coming to Terms with the Past**.

Loren B. Mead writes, "Every congregation lives in dialogue with it's past." We can't change the past but the past is part of who we are today as the people of God at Holy Trinity. This congregation is both the heir and the victim of its story. A congregation is a living, breathing cauldron of ministry and story and mission and tragedy. It is not waiting for a new pastor to bring life – life is already here and we are living a ministry that was here before our pastors retired and we will be here by God's grace when the new pastor is long gone. The past of this congregation is sometimes flawed but also the past is an enormous repository of experience, wisdom, and ministry that can become a ground upon which a new ministry can be built by clergy and laity serving together.

Coming to terms with the past means the congregation comes to a place where it is able to look at its past, lay to rest its ghosts, value its heroes and heroines, honor its special story, forgive itself for its faults, and gain energy for a new stage of its journey. There the things of the congregation – its buildings, the special memorials, its location, and how the story of how the physical plant was assembled. Talking about these physical things can help us unpack our emotional baggage, come to terms with our history, and get ready to move on.

A Note from Paul Hattaway

Holy Trinity recently heard from Paul Hattaway, Director of Asia Harvest for whom we designated a financial gift from the last of our Mission Commitment funds in 2019. Half of our gift went toward the Living Martyrs Fund and the other half toward Bibles for China. Paul writes in part:

I wanted to ask if you noticed our announcement a few months ago that the Chinese church leaders are now unable to provide any reports or updates of those we support?

Persecution has reached such an intensity that they're not willing to place the lives of those they serve at risk when gathering reports.

We continue to help about 1,300 living martyrs across Asia, but no more updates from China will be coming unfortunately.

Our Bible project is completely separate, with different Chinese leaders and structures, so it continues as normal for now, and for as long as the Lord will allow.

The difference with the Living Martyrs is that to get updates, each recipient had to be personally visited in their village or home, as many are elderly and don't use cell phones or email, etc.

China Bibles remain the greatest focus and need. Myanmar and elsewhere are crucial too, but they tend to be short-term projects where there is a need for some months, we meet the need, and then we move on to the next one.

The China Bible Fund, however, is a long-term, ongoing need that is likely to continue until the Lord returns, or China is a completely free and open society.



Through the years, the church has remembered saints of the past by designating a certain day on the church liturgical calendar for these saints. October 18 is the day to remember St. Luke, Evangelist. St. Luke is credited for writing the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles, which would mean that Luke contributed over a quarter of the text of the New Testament, more than any other author.

It is believed that he was a Greek convert to Christianity. Being a Gentile, his Gospel has a special interest in lifting up Gentiles in the life of our Lord. He most likely was a physician since St. Paul refers to him as the "beloved physician." (Col. 4:14)

Because of this, **October 18**, or the Sunday closest to that date has been designated as a day to emphasize the healing ministry of Jesus with special prayers for healing. This is also a tradition at Holy Trinity.

Keeping with our historical tradition, on **Sunday, October 18**, we will include the **Service of Healing** in the liturgy. This Service of Healing is one way that the church extends Christ's ministry of healing of body, mind, and spirit. Healing implies a sense of well-being and wholeness that God desires for the people of God that begins with a right relationship with God, neighbor, and self. This wholeness is offered through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

Be sure to be present on **October 18**, the **Day of St. Luke**, to participate in this special opportunity to pray for healing for yourself and for others.

Christ's Home Sneaker Collection

In our new partnership with Christ's Home, we have learned that SNEAKERS are currently the greatest need for the children and teens living at the Warminster campus. We have a list of specific needs for 16 of the children and then a general need for sneaker stock.

For the specific needs:

We will send a google doc via email to all. If you would like to provide for a specific child, you can sign the spreadsheet and see the child's name,



sneaker size, color preference, and style preference. If you choose this option, please bring the sneakers in their box and place a clearly written note just inside that provides the child's name.

For the general needs, all sizes are welcome, from toddlers to teens, but here are some important tips.

- For children age 5 and under, please buy Velcro only; no laces.
- For teen boys, their sneakers are very important to their often damaged self-image. The boys want black or white (They can have a stripe of color but the overall shoe must be black or white.). Their favorite brands are Vans and Converse, although other major brands are acceptable (Asics, Underarmour, Adidas, etc.) Please understand no Walmart level shoes for these young men. They already feel different in public school and really need to have the same kinds of shoes that others are wearing. These sneakers will entail a larger expense.

Please bring your shoe contributions to the Narthex or the Office. We will receive your contributions through the end of November.

Opportunity to Support Our Missionaries

Holy Trinity is blessed to have Didi and Seraphina Panzo as our beloved members and missionaries who have been serving God for the past eight years, the first four in Ecuador and the most recent four in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC). They have fallen in love with the people in the Congo and will be returning for four more years.

Didi shared (see Sept. 20 online service and move cursor to 1 hour 30 minutes for presentation) that the DRC is a country of 85 million people with a dysfunctional government. That means the money does not reach the people and there is great poverty, especially suffered by the children.

Didi and Seraphina Are Involved in Four Programs:

- 1. Women in the DRC are expected to obtain food, cook and sell to support the family, AND give their earnings to their husbands who spend it on beer and abuse them. Seraphina works with groups of women to empower them while Didi, a trained counselor, provides counseling. These women are brought into the Word of God and helped to keep safe.
- 2. So many families cannot afford to educate their children, and many children live in orphanages where they are fed only once a day, going without food from morning until evening. The Panzo's do not have enough money to meet these overwhelming needs but have been able, through the generosity of Holy Trinity, to provide a meal of bread and porridge once or twice a week and educate some of the children.
- **3.** The indigenous people built a church and called it Lutheran but had no idea what a Lutheran is. So the Panzo's are teaching the Lutheran confession and traditions. With an NALC grant, a theological school has been built, awarding associate degrees. The school began with eight students and now have 60 and a second grant to build a dormitory for them.
- **4.** The Panzo's bring together farmers to share God's Word and provide seed to plant for a good harvest.


Didi emphasizes that most importantly God is helping make all this effort possible, and he and Seraphina are so grateful for the support of several churches, especially their home church, Holy Trinity. He stresses that it is not easy to be in the Congo and see children's situation. In households, young adults eat one day, middle-age people eat the next, and children eat on the third day, so they rotate eating. "This touches our heart to see this life people are living. We have experienced the love of the people, which is why we want to return."

How Can You Help

The Panzo's have reserved a container for shipping all their much-needed items (kitchen supplies & appliances, garden tools, home furniture, etc.) from their son's home in North Carolina to the DRC. They will be packing their container for shipping in mid-November.

First, you may contribute money so that needed supplies and appliances can be purchased and delivered directly from suppliers.

Second, we are collecting good condition shorts, t-shirts, and flip-flops for children ages 7-15.

Third, we are collecting reader glasses (no prescriptions please) as thousands of people come to eye clinics and need vision support.
