Dear Parish Family,

During this time of Interim Ministry at Holy Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church, a third Developmental Task is allowing for needed leadership changes. This is natural and healthy for any Christian Congregation. 
Dear Holy Trinity Family,


ADVENT

Here we go! Now that Thanksgiving is over, the rush begins. This world is busy with buying, baking, and busying ourselves in getting stuff ready for a secular holiday. Instead of driving yourself crazy this month, why not take the advice of the Christian Church Year Calendar and truly observe the season we are entering: Advent.

November 29 marks the beginning of a new liturgical year on the church calendar. The first four Sundays of the church year are the four Sundays of Advent. Advent means "Coming" and it is a season of preparation for the coming of Christ: once in history and His second coming at the end of time, the Parousia. Advent focuses on Christ, NOT Christmas. The lessons and themes for this season focus on the hopeful expectation of God's restoration of His people in the First Readings. The Gospel Readings focus on the Second Coming of Christ as well as God's preparation for Christ in John the Baptizer and the Virgin Mary. The music in Advent is rich in beauty and in theological concepts of preparation, anticipation, and hope. In Advent we are preparing for CHRIST, not Christmas. The liturgical color for Advent is blue, a color that suggests Hope. To allow Advent to have its fullest dramatic impact, we defer Christmas music, decorations, and celebrations until the 12 days of Christmas, December 24 -- January 5.

The theology and beauty of Advent must not be obscured by the Christmas preparations. This Advent Season, listen to the music, the words, the readings, and the sermons and soak in the beauty of this season. Instead of busying yourself with Christmas preparations, use daily Advent devotions available on the NALC website (www.thenalc.org) or pick up a copy in the narthex. Do acts of kindness for those in need. Pray for a heart that is open and anticipating Christ as He comes again to take His people home. This is the season of Advent. Let us observe this season as we prepare for Christ.

Bright, flaming red, star-shaped Poinsettias are known as "The Flower of the Holy Night" or the "Flame Leaf Christmas Star" in the United States.

One of the most popular flowers in Central America, it was brought here by Dr. Joel Poinsett, the first US ambassador to Mexico, over 100 years ago. The legend of the Poinsettia also comes from Mexico and explains how this flower came to represent the deep love of innocent hearts shown, by poor children, for the Baby Jesus.

Once upon a time, two very poor children lived in a village in Mexico. They were a brother and sister named Maria and Pablo. Just like all the other children in the village, Maria and Pablo looked forward to the special Christmas parade and the annual Nativity play. During this Nativity play, a large manger scene was set up in the village church. All the children of the village marched in the Christmas parade to bring their presents to the Baby Jesus on Christmas Eve.

Maria and Pablo loved Jesus and the season of His birth very much, but they had no money to buy a gift for Him. That evening as they walked to join the other children in the Christmas parade, they took the long route in hopes that they might be able to find some flower blossoms to lay before the manger of the Christ Child. But they couldn't find any.

Although they were sad at heart and quite disheartened by their poverty, they picked the prettiest green leaves they could find, squared their shoulders, and joined the parade of children. The other children teased them cruelly for bringing "weeds" to the Christ Child, yet Pablo and Maria braved their way to the Nativity Scene, knelt in worship, and placed the greenery carefully around the manger. As the children lifted their heads, a miracle occurred. Bright red star-shaped flowers burst forth from the greens and were the most beautiful of all the gifts that the Christ Child had received that day.

What A Year for Operation Christmas Child at Holy Trinity!

Holy Trinity has a MOST generous church family, and it could not have been more apparent than during our fall shoebox effort for Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child.

First, Holy Trinity has sent 401 shoeboxes! That is 12 more than last year.

Second, Holy Trinity members lent their time and talent to our "8-day week" of receiving shoeboxes from area individuals and churches, packing shoeboxes in cartons, and transporting them to Covenant Church in Warminster. (Thank you logistics man-of-the-hour Rob Ischinger for procuring that big truck!) Including our 401 shoeboxes, we packed and transported 1,558 shoeboxes! And we had 24 dedicated volunteers to enable us to be a receiving church.

Third, to assist with shoebox shipping costs, members of the congregation contributed almost \$1,100 toward shipping our 401 shoeboxes.

THANK YOU to ALL who packed shoeboxes individually, helped make our early October packing party happen outside, provided all manner of toys, hand-sewn dresses and stuffed animals; crocheted hats, and other needed shoebox supplies and wow items.

Missionary Support for Didi & Seraphina Panzo

Following Didi and Seraphina Panzo's visit to Holy Trinity and their presentation to the congregation this fall, Holy Trinity rallied to provides support for the Panzo's return in January for four more years to serve in the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

One of the pressing needs is feeding the orphans who come to them begging for food because they are fed only once a day at their nearby orphanage. We shipped 30 unbreakable plates and bowls, as well as 30 knives, forks, and spoons for this purpose. We also sent a 220-volt coffee maker. All of these items were purchased at a discount and shipped free to the Panzo's son in North Carolina so that they would be ready to pack in the shipping container in mid-November.

Other shipments included more than 100 flip-flops (children often must go barefoot), 25 pairs of reading glasses, and assorted children's clothes. Pastor Larry sent books from his personal collection for the library at the seminary. Holy Trinity sent \$5,500 toward the Panzo's container shipping costs of \$6,000 and the purchase of a used car.

You are invited to participate as you feel called in an ongoing collection of money through January 1 to help the Panzo's provide the desperately needed second daily meal to the orphans. We will send your caring gifts in January once the Panzo's have returned to the Congo. If you would like to contribute, please mark your envelope and memo section on your check "Congo Orphans."

Prayer News of September & October from Pastor Didi and Serafina Panzo, Missionaries in the Democratic Republic of Congo

Up to date for churches visits during the month of September, we were able to visit two churches, Zion Lutheran and Faith Lutheran Community in Zimmerman, Minnesota led by Pastor Jake Gilliard our former colleague of the WMPL now serving the LCMS. We spent a good time as we were able to share to the congregations about the DRC's mission. People were so moved and compassionate about the cause. We hope that these two congregations will be in our list of supporters.

Two others churches in our schedule to visit were Gift of Grace, Wisconsin and Saint Paul Lutheran in Minneapolis but we didn't make it physically because of Covid-19 restriction. At St Paul we did it in live stream as we sent our message in thanking their support in prayers and donation and also stating our plan for return. For Gift of Grace we received at Minneapolis the Pastor and one elder of the church who brought a gift card to us and some books that are barely in the DRC. We prayed together and gave thanks to God for the partnership and all donations received.

From the end of October to November 1, 2020 we were invited to visit Pastor Tom Olson and his wife Eunice, missionary candidates of the WMPL (World Mission Prayer League). They live in Howley, Minnesota where we spent two good days with them talking about the mission in the DRC as they are discerning to join us for the mission work in the DRC. They seem very enthusiastic and looking at the opportunity as a God's calling. I was invited to preach at the joint service of two churches that Tom is the Pastor. We were very impress in building relation with this wonderful couple, to God be the glory. Moving Plan Since November 3, 2020 we left Minnesota and moved to North Carolina where we will be packing all donations received and after all is loaded in the container for shipping to the DRC. We are informing all partner that your donations reached well the destination and are ready to be packed. We are so glad for all your responses and thank you so much for your love on us and for God's mission in the DRC.

Also informing that we purchased a descent used Toyota FJ Cruiser to be use in the DRC as requested with some urgent accessories in case of replacement needs. Again thanks for all your effort and willingness to lift up the Kingdom of God.



At Annual Meeting this year, **Sunday, January 24, 2021** the first item of business will be the adoption of Rules of Procedure. This adoption of Rules of Procedure has always been done at the outset of every denominational or synodical convocation (LCA, ELCA, or NALC). This adoption needs only a simple majority and is done to make the meeting run smoothly. Among other things, The Rules of Procedure say that Holy Trinity's Annual Meeting will be governed by Roberts Rules of Order, that all speeches will be limited to three minutes, and that anyone can present a resolution but that this resolution must be presented in writing to the Committee on Reference and Counsel by 3:00 p.m. on the Monday immediately prior to Annual Meeting. At the time each resolution is presented to Annual Meeting, Reference and Counsel will advise the Annual Meeting as to whether or not the resolution should be adopted. Copies of these Rules of Procedure and Forms for Resolutions are available in the Narthex.
