Dear Parish Family,

Are we simply looking for a hired hand to manage the preaching and worship and to make out the annual reports to the NALC?

The whole point of this process is that we come through it with a new vision of what God wants us to be and do in the Ministry and Mission of the Gospel at Holy Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church. By the leading of the Holy Spirit, we will come through this with some new commitments about what is important and what is not. Moving through this Interim Period we will come through it committed to a new future and a new ministry.

Loren Mead states in his book, <u>A Change of Pastors</u>: "The pastor you have selected has also selected you and you are bound to each other for a purpose: to build a worshiping, working community of faithful people who have discovered a direction of ministry and intend to pursue it together." We will learn together, Pastor and Congregation, what it means to be the people of God, gathered around Word and Sacrament at this place and for this time. We are not in a "hiring process." We will be transformed and our new pastor will be transformed as we seek God's new future for us.







"If I had known Christianity was really like this, I would have become a Christian a long time ago."

This is what Charli, a student at Columbia College in South Carolina, recently told her CCO campus minister, Jonathan.

Throughout the past year—a dark one by almost any measure—Jonathan has kept little lights burning "in hope and expectation of the light of Christ to dawn fully." Nearly every week, he and a group of students have sat around his backyard fire-pit, surrounded by dangling Edison bulbs, sharing meals, praying, and discussing what it means to follow Jesus.

He admits that the darkness of the past few months has often felt impenetrable. "The challenges of social-distancing, meeting outside, and wearing masks add considerable inertia to things that used to be very simple," he says. "But then, in a moment, little lights appear." Lent: Eyes On Jesus

Historically, Lent developed as a season of preparation for Holy Baptism. Liturgically and theologically, Lent is the Church's refocus on the significance of Holy Baptism. The daily drowning of the old Adam in us through contrition and repentance, which characterizes the entire Christian life of discipleship, is deliberately intensified during Lent as a renewal of faith and life in Christ. This repentance is always the divine work of the Holy Spirit through the Law and the Gospel. The Law crucifies the old Adam, and the Gospel raises up the new creation in us. Thus, a Lenten focus on the cross and Passion of the Lord Jesus Christ is not aimed at an emotional response but is a pointed proclamation and confession of the Law and the Gospel, a preaching of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. Lent is properly penitential when it brings the cross to sinners and sinners to the cross of Christ as the fountain and source of forgiveness, life, and salvation.

"O come, let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God." (Gradual for Lent, based on Hebrews 12:2)

When the characters in the Passion narrative look at Jesus, what do they see? In most cases, people misunderstood who He is and what He was doing. In some cases, by faith, people recognized Him aright. Our Lenten series this year, based on the Gospel according to St. Mark, will examine how the various people around Jesus viewed Him—and how we should view Him. We will "fix our eyes" on what Jesus has done to save us from our sins by His holy, precious blood and innocent sufferings and death, and celebrate what God sees on account of His work: our justification for His sake.

Eyes on Jesus will continuously focus our eyes on Jesus Christ and Him crucified, buried, and risen for our justification. This is a vision that will never disappoint, for by trusting in Jesus, He promises that we will gaze upon His beautiful face now by faith and forever in heaven!

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday service on February 17 at 7:30 p.m. Weekly mid-week Lenten services will continue through March 24, at 9:30 a.m. and 7:30 p.m. Following each service, there will be a Bible Study on the theme, Eyes On Jesus. All are most welcome to participate either in person or virtually.



Safety & Security Action by Church Council

During the December meeting church council received the property committee report concerning possible updating of the Church's security including replacing keys with an electronic fob that fits on a key ring, security cameras monitoring the areas outside around the church, and after-hours intruder detection.

After in-depth discussion of the issue, including church break-ins, employee safety, and being able to provide police with images to assist them in any investigation, the council voted in favor of accepting the bid of one of the competing companies.

Plans are being made to install the system this winter. While the way we access the building will change (a small electronic fob instead of a key), our building will remain readily accessible for all of our programs.
