Dear Parish Family,

In the previous months, I've discussed the five Developmental tasks in the process of going through a change in pastoral leadership in the congregation. These are:

- 1. Coming to terms with the past
- 2. Discovering a new identity

- 4. Rediscovering the denomination
- 5. Commitment to new directions in ministry





Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

Now I want you to know, dear brothers and sisters, what God in His kindness has done through the congregations of the North American Lutheran Church (NALC). They are being tested by many troubles – COVID-19 especially – and have endured financial hardships. But they are also filled with abundant joy, which has overflowed in great generosity. For I can testify that they gave not only what they could afford, but far more. And they did it of their own free will. They excelled in the grace of giving. (2 Corinthians 8:1-3, 7)

Miracles do happen! The faithful support of congregations and individuals like you in 2020 allowed us to exceed budgeted revenues by \$32,000. This is truly remarkable given the pandemic and its effect on our local economies. On behalf of Bishop Selbo and the entire NALC team, we want to say, "Thank you!" Your partnership and trust in us have allowed us to continue moving forward in the mission and vision of the NALC and growing the church of Jesus Christ.

Many new congregations have been added in 2020. New mission starts and house churches across North America have been formed and the number is growing. We have been able to continue our support of missionaries serving Jesus in Belarus, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Haiti, Tanzania and elsewhere. We have more than 40 future pastors studying in the North American Lutheran Seminary system. Holy Trinity folks were incredibly generous toward their service men and women serving overseas during our January Freedom Steps collection. Holy Trinity

members provided 340 toiletries, 50 hand-knit scarves, 32 food items, several notes of encouragement, and donations of money to defray shipping costs.

Freedom Steps volunteers have packed 6 boxes for their Easter shipment and still have 2 boxes of toiletries left for the next shipment. Cindy's son Chris will be one of the Easter recipients. There is a box in the Narthex for ongoing collections following our January push. More notes of encouragement and supplies are always welcome.



Dear Holy Trinity family,

February 12th was the date for Holy Trinity's blood drive. There was a steady stream of people who arrived to donate blood; a total of 24 units were given. This number means that the Red Cross has the potential to save up to 72 lives. One or two of the units were identified as negative for CMV (a virus that most people are exposed to and have no problem with). But newborns cannot have blood that is CMV positive, so if a newborn need blood, it must be CMV negative. So at least some of the blood that was donated at our blood drive will be set aside for newborn babies that may need blood.

Many thanks to all who volunteered their time to make this a successful blood drive especially the donors!

The living liturgy

Lent: Eyes On Jesus

"O come, let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God." (Gradual for Lent, based on Hebrews 12:2)

When the characters in the Passion narrative look at Jesus, what do they see? In most cases, people misunderstood who He is and what He was doing. In some cases, by faith, people recognized Him aright. Our Lenten series this year, based on the Gospel according to St. Mark, will examine how the various people around Jesus viewed Him—and how we should view Him. We will "fix our eyes" on what Jesus has done to save us from our sins by His holy, precious blood and innocent sufferings and death, and celebrate what God sees on account of His work: our justification for His sake.


For Lutheran Christians, Lent is a sacred season in which we focus on the message of the Cross for our salvation. It is a strong tradition among Lutherans to gather for mid-week worship and Bible Study. We are following in that tradition each week in Lent. Join us **every Wednesday for worship and Bible Study at 9:30 a.m. and at 7:30 p.m.** as we draw closer to Jesus and fix our eyes on Jesus. The evening service and Bible Study will be live-streamed for those who are unable to be present.

Then, finally, Easter Sunday, we will gaze upon "Angel Eyes." The angel in the tomb knows the whole story of Jesus' resurrection. When he sees the women, he proclaims the Gospel to them, shows them where Jesus' body had formerly lain, and tells them that they can see Jesus themselves in Galilee. Likewise, the "angels" or messengers of the Church in the apostolic ministry tell God's people where they can find Jesus and His salvation in the Means of Grace.

Eyes on Jesus will continuously focus our eyes on Jesus Christ and Him crucified, buried, and risen for our justification. This is a vision that will never disappoint, for by trusting in Jesus, He promises that we will gaze upon His beautiful face now by faith and forever in heaven!




