We are about to enter the week of the Church Year that is the center of our faith and life. It is a week that goes from joy and shouts of Hosanna to deep grief and conflict, to suffering and death and finally to unspeakable joy and gladness as we walk with Christ the road to the cross and empty tomb. During this Lenten Season, we have focused our mid-week worship and Bible Study on the theme, "Eyes on Jesus." Will we keep our eyes on Jesus this week and beyond?

The events of Holy Week and the Resurrection make all the difference in our lives. In this week our eyes focus on Jesus who leads us through death and into life – Eternal life. This is good news for weary saints. This life can be rather weary at times, especially the past year as we have dealt with radical political upheavals, violence in our cities and towns, hatred and lies as we have rarely seen before. If that's not enough to depress us, the COVID pandemic with all the political overtones that accompany it have driven many a feeling of hopelessness and deep depression.

Yet, in the midst of all this gloom and sadness, the message of the prophet Isaiah gives us hope and new life. "The Lord . . . will swallow up on this mountain the covering that is cast over all peoples, the veil that is spread over all nations. He will swallow up death forever and the Lord God will wipe away tears from all faces . . . For the Lord has spoken. This is the Lord; we have waited for him; let us be glad and rejoice in His salvation." (Isaiah 25:6-9 – First Reading for Easter Sunday)



Many hands (and backs, shovels, trowels, and clippers, etc.) make light work while honoring the dear saints who loved Holy Trinity. All are welcome!









Here I Stand Sunday, April 18

On April 18, 1521, three and a half years after he nailed the 95 Theses to the church door in Wittenberg, Martin Luther made his historic stand at the Diet (official meeting) in the German city of Worms (pronounced "Vorms"). Accused of fostering heresy, he was directed by Charles V and other leaders to recant his teaching about the pure Gospel or face death.

As recounted in his collected works, Luther concluded his statement to the Diet with the words: "Since then your serene majesty and your lordships seek a simple answer, I will give it in this manner, neither horned nor toothed: Unless I am convinced by the testimony of the Scriptures or by clear reason (for I do not trust either in the pope or in councils alone, since it is well known that they have often erred and contradicted themselves), I am bound by the Scriptures I have quoted and my conscience is captive to the Word of God. I cannot and I will not retract anything, since it is neither safe nor right to go against conscience. "I cannot do otherwise, here I stand, may God help me, Amen" (LW 32:112–13).

On April 18, 2021, we at Holy Trinity along with Lutherans around the world will commemorate the 500th anniversary of Luther's defiant defense of the pure Gospel by observing "Here I Stand" Sunday.





Updating on the COVID-19 procedures at Holy Trinity

Since a number of church members have requested that we consider congregational singing in worship, the following new procedures will begin at Holy Trinity starting the **Second Sunday of Easter, April 11** the congregation may **sing the last hymn.**

Singing will be with facemasks/coverings in place covering the mouth and nose. Since the benediction is before the final hymn, worshipers who need to/are uncomfortable at this time with congregational singing, would be able to leave the sanctuary immediately after the benediction and before any congregational singing begins. We will respect the concerns of those who need to leave as well as those who stay for the Closing Hymn.

In addition, we are planning for an **Easter Sunday hymn sing with brass** on the lawn between services (*see page 11 of this Echoes) so the worshipers attending either the early or late Easter Sunday service will be able to attend. There will also be an Easter continental breakfast of pastries, coffee and tea on the lawn. In the event of an Easter rain, the hymn sing and Continental breakfast would be the following week.

We will be operating under the same guidelines of social distancing, wearing masks covering both mouth and nose, encouraging use of hand washing and sanitizing, sanitizing the building interior, and social distancing, asking worshipers to save their conversations after service for outside.

We continue to consider the available professional information and operate in Christian love, working together as is stated in the Holy Trinity Call Profile: Although this addresses different needs, the ongoing pandemic requires continued prayer for our church to navigate this challenge as brothers and sisters in Christ.
