From the Pastor –

On the Third Sunday of Easter (April 18, 2021) I said in the sermon: “Today, there are influences and powers around us that challenge our Biblical Faith. The culture continues to hold up sinful lifestyles that are direct contradictions to the Word of God. Even some church bodies are turning from the Scriptures to skip down the yellow brick road of progressivism and modernism. Laws are being written, such as the so-called Equality Act, which make sinful ways of living a protected status which, if not affirmed in all locations, including churches, will be basis for censure and punishment. The Evangelical and Biblical churches must stand on our beliefs even against such governmental tyranny.

It’s time now to stand firm and write to our senators to vote against this sinful act. Like Luther, we today must stand firm on the Word of God which informs our conscience.

Christ is here among us and we know his living bodily presence. He is not a spirit. He is alive, and we know it with all our heart and our mind and our soul! He comes to us with his wounded hands and forgives us our sins, restores us to new life, and sends us out as witnesses; yes, even marveling witnesses to stand for the truth and to witness to Christ’s resurrection.”

As witnesses to Christ’s Resurrection, we as the people of God, must speak up about current events and the activity of our government. We are indeed citizens of this nation and have the right to free expression of our faith. The First Amendment of the US Constitution states: “Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech” . . .

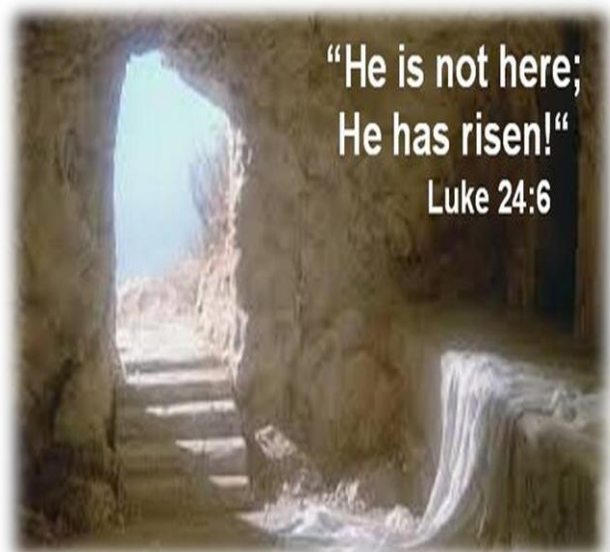

The Festivals in May

This month, we have three major Church Festivals: **Ascension of our Lord**, **The Day of Pentecost**, and **The Holy Trinity**. All of these affirm very basic teachings of our faith.

In the creeds we confess that Jesus “ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father.” We at Holy Trinity will celebrate the **Ascension of our Lord** with a service of Holy Communion, **Thursday May 13 at 7:30 p.m.** His glorious Ascension signified the completion of His time on earth, is celebrated by the Church forty days after the Resurrection and ten days before the Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit. Our Lord Jesus Christ gave us hope by promising that *“when I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also”* (John 14:3).

The Second major Festival is the **Day of Pentecost**, fifty days after Easter. This year **Pentecost is May 23**. On Pentecost, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the church. The liturgical color for Pentecost is red, symbolizing the fire of the Holy Spirit. On Pentecost, we at Holy Trinity will also celebrate the Affirmation of Baptism, Confirmation. This is a time when baptized children affirm their Baptism after a period of Catechetical instruction and growth in their Christian Faith.

The season of Pentecost make up the longest portion of the Church Year. This is the Time of the Church - the time we focus on growing together in the life of the Holy Trinity. On the first Sunday after Pentecost, the Church celebrates **Holy Trinity Sunday**, our congregation’s “Name Day.” We are baptized into the name of one God, yet three persons: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. On this Sunday we confess the great mystery of the Holy Trinity. On Holy Trinity Sunday we confess our faith with the Athanasian Creed, which goes into great detail to confess the catholic faith that must be faithfully and firmly believed to be saved: “that we worship one God in Trinity and Trinity in Unity.”

The liturgical color for The Holy Trinity is white. The following Sundays of the Season of Pentecost the liturgical color is green, a symbol of growth since the Pentecost Season is a time of growth in living in our Baptism and receiving the Lord’s Word and Sacraments. Be sure to be present to participate in the worship life of the Church as we worship God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, ²⁵ not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near. --Hebrews 10:24-25

Stewardship is one of the predominant themes of the Bible. The Scriptures say a great deal about stewardship because it affects virtually every aspect of our earthly existence. To the extent that we put these biblical principles into practice, we will enjoy the freedom and fulfillment that comes only from being Christ's servants. (John 12:26; Col. 3:24).

The New Testament word for stewardship is *oikonomia*, from which we derive the word economy. This word means "management of a household," and it refers to the responsibility that is entrusted to a manager. A steward acts as an administrator of the affairs and possessions of another. As Christians, we have been entrusted with a stewardship; the things we call our own are not really ours, but God's. We have no possessions, and we do not even own ourselves:

"Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you have been bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body" (1 Cor. 6: 19-20; 1 Cor. 3:23).

From a biblical point of view, stewardship is all-inclusive. It touches every area of life, including our time and talent as well as our treasure. Stewardship is faithfully using whatever God gives us (opportunities, interests, skills, employment, family, talents, spiritual gifts, land, money, etc.) for His glory. The theme of stewardship ranges from Genesis 1-2 when God made the man and woman stewards of this planet, to Revelation 21 - 22 when God will make His children stewards of the new creation.

If biblical stewardship involves every facet of life, it requires a basic commitment on our part: we must present ourselves to God as His servants, with no conditions attached. The real issue of stewardship is whether we are administering our time and talents as though they are ours or as though they are God's. The pattern of our lives is shaped by the decisions we make, and the greatest of these decisions is this: Am I the lord of my life, or is God the Lord of my life? We will either seek to rule our own lives or submit to the rule of God. This is the difference between the great I WILL (Isa. 14: 13-14) and the great THY WILL (Matt. 6:10; Mark 14:36). Whether we realize it or not, we face this decision many times in the course of each day.

When we trusted in Christ, we exchanged the old for the new; we passed from death into life, from darkness to light, from sight to faith, and from an earthly to a heavenly citizenship (John 3:36; 2 Cor. 5:17; Phil. 3:21; Col. 1:13). True stewardship reflects this exchange in a lifestyle ordered by the lordship of Christ over all things. Faithful stewardship of natural talents and spiritual gifts requires that we use them to glorify God and edify others. Our purpose is not to please ourselves, but to serve others.

Time is our most valuable asset. A biblical perspective on time involves several things: 1) Life is brief, and we cannot be presumptuous about the future 2) the eternal gives meaning to the temporal and 3) our use of time will reflect our priorities.

We encourage everyone to take the time to pray and reflect on your daily stewardship of all that God has given you.

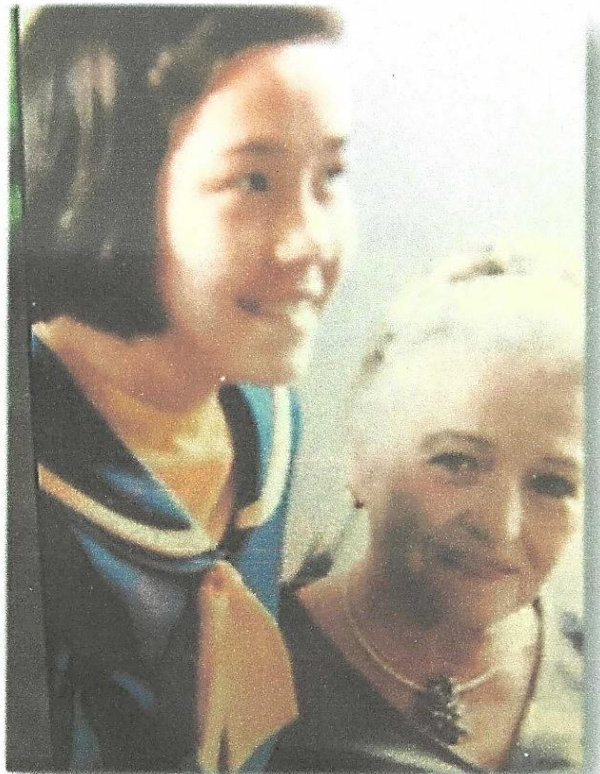

poverty to life in America.

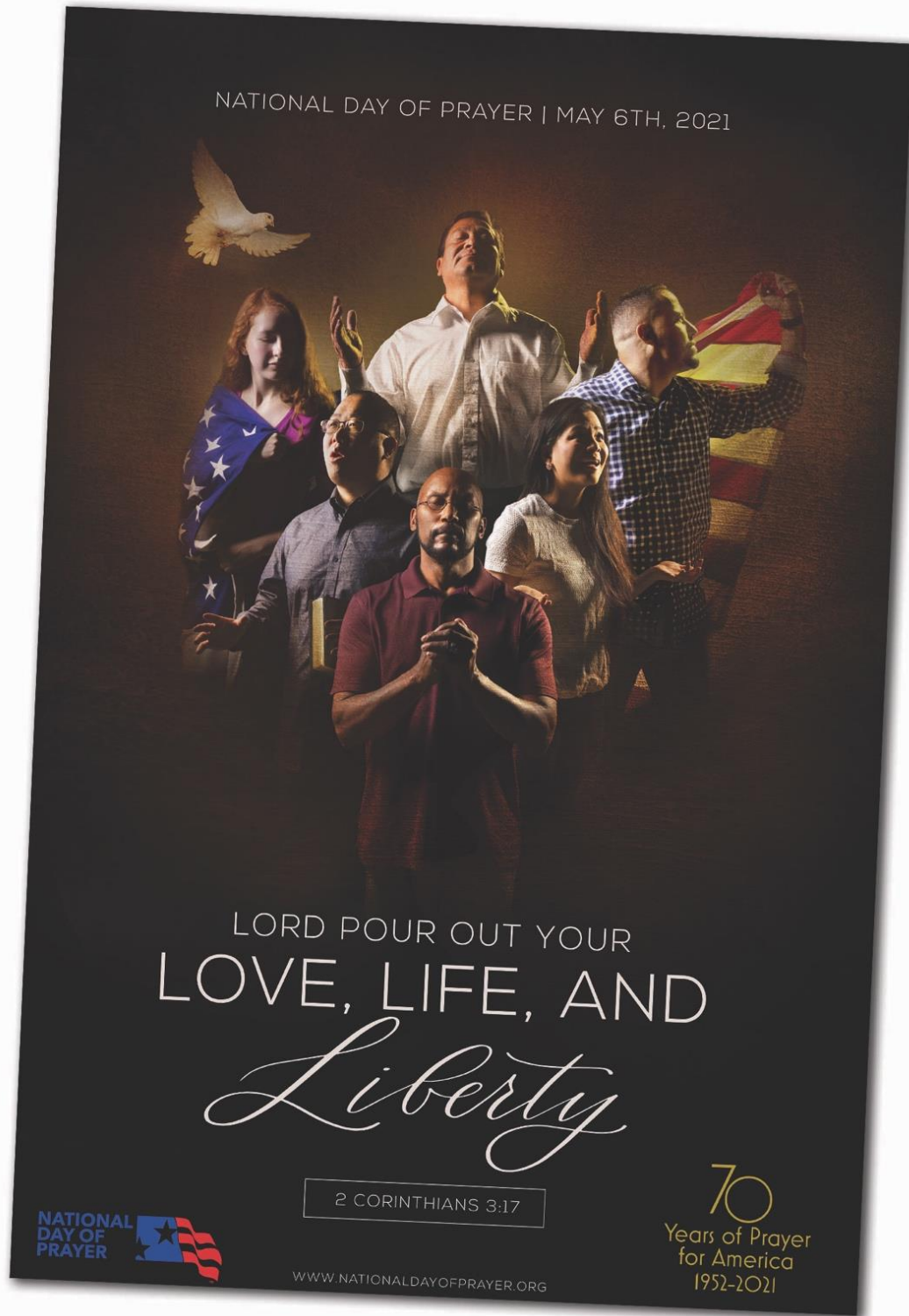
Many of us met the author

when we celebrate Mother’s Day.

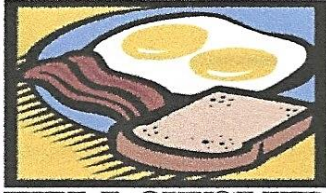
