My Dear People,

June will mark one year that I have been your Interim Pastor and what a year it has been! Last year at this time, we were hoping that we'd be back to "normal" by the fall and certainly by Christmas. But here we are, still living with the COVID-19 pandemic. Thank God, the numbers of people infected and deaths are decreasing while restrictions are being lifted.

As we face the weeks and months ahead, we continue to face each day as a gift from God. Each day, as disciples of Jesus, we seek ways to live out our calling as witnesses to the Gospel of Christ. The following is a summary of an excellent article written by Brett McCracken, senior editor at The Gospel Coalition.

Whatever is our response to the governmental lifting of restrictions let's keep a few things in mind. First, we are children of God and witnesses to the power of the Gospel in our lives. Thus, we want to live together in Christian unity. On Trinity Sunday we will celebrate the Unity of the Trinity. As people marked by the cross of Christ in our common Baptism, we live together in unity. Psalm 133 declares, "Behold, how good and pleasant it is when brothers dwell in unity!" We witness to the love of God in Christ when we live together in unity.

Thus, even though we may disagree on how we are to live together as we loosen the COVID-19 restrictions we do it with respect and understanding toward others, even the ones with whom we don't "see eye-to-eye."

We can heed Paul's wisdom in <u>Romans 14</u>: "Let us not pass judgment on one another any longer, but rather decide never to put a stumbling block or hindrance in the way of a brother" Or <u>1 Corinthians 8:9</u>: "Be careful, however, that your freedom does not become a stumbling block to the weak."

Even if you think these precautions are a needless overreaction, can you not sacrifice your ideal for a season, out of love for others who believe the precautions *are* necessary? We need to strive to honor people on both sides of the issue.

As much as ever before, Christians should follow the advice of James 1:19 to be "quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger." Listening well may slow down the process of deliberation and planning, but it is worth it. Whatever opinions church leaders themselves have on the matter of reopening, they should take time to humbly hear the voices of others within the parish as well as other church and government leaders in our area. Church members should likewise model Christ like humility <u>Phil. 2:3</u> "Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves."

We model that humility in how we react to the plan, prayerfully and thoughtfully outlined by our church leaders, even if we <u>don't agree with every aspect of it</u>. No one of us should assume we've arrived at the definitive answer on how to do this well. Let's model humility by acknowledging that <u>everything is *not* obvious</u>, and we are all just trying to do the best we can in this pandemic.

We should also take <u>Hebrews 10:25</u> seriously when it says we ought not to neglect meeting together. We should feel the ache of what is lost when we only meet virtually. Every Christian should long for the day when "church on Zoom" gives way to "church in a room."*

There are some things Christians should *not* be timid about, of course, and one of those is our bold commitment to the Gospel of Jesus Christ and all that Scripture commands. What Paul urges the Ephesian church, therefore, should be equally urgent for us today: "Walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace" <u>Eph. 4:1–3</u>. May God lead us through this and into a bolder trust in God's grace and commitment to the saving Gospel of Jesus.

The living liturgy

The Season after Pentecost

The Sundays after Pentecost make up the longest portion of the Church Year. This is the Time of the Church – the time we focus on growing together in the life of the Holy Trinity.

On the first Sunday after Pentecost, the Church celebrates Holy Trinity Sunday. We are baptized into one name, but that name is "Father, Son, and Holy Spirit."

There is only one name, only one God - but there are three persons: The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. On this Sunday we confess the great mystery of the Holy Trinity.

The Sundays of this time of the Church Year are known as the Sundays after Pentecost. Picking up on Pentecost as the season of growth, they are often referred to as the Green Sundays. The readings focus on the life of Christ in His Church. We hear Jesus teaching His disciples and healing the faithful.

Because the Pentecost season is part of "ordinary" time, congregations may choose to observe some of the lesser festivals of the season. When saint days of commemorations fall on Sundays, worship leaders could highlight these to offer teaching moments about the breadth of the Church's life and work. These noteworthy days enable Christians to reflect on how we worship "with angels and archangels and with all the company of heaven."

On the last Sunday after Pentecost, Christ the King Sunday, the Church gives voice to the joyful hope of the second coming of Jesus for the resurrection of the dead and the last judgement when Christ will reign forever as King. The end-times focus of the last few Sundays of the Church year bears themes of hope and preparation that are similar to those of Advent, which soon follows.

During the Time of the Church, we focus on growing together in the life of the Holy Trinity.

Practices and Traditions of the Season after Pentecost:

--The church is decorated in green paraments, the color of growing plants. This marks the season of growth in living in our Baptism and receiving the Lord's Word and Sacraments.

--On Trinity Sunday, we use the Athanasian Creed to confess our faith. This ancient statement of faith goes into great detail to confess the catholic (universal) faith that must be faithfully and firmly believed to be saved: "that we worship one God in Trinity, and Trinity in Unity."




