From the Pastor

My Dear People,

"Who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?" These are the famous words of Mordecai, the Jew, who wrote to Esther, his adoptive daughter when the Jews in the Persian Empire were threatened with extinction. Because of her beauty, Esther had been elevated to the position of Queen. Her Persian husband, Ahasuerus (Xerxes) without knowing her Jewish heritage had been tricked into proclaiming the edict that was to lead to the death of all Jews in his empire. Esther was the only one with any "Political influence" who might change the course of destruction for her people. At the risk of her life, Esther approaches the King and ultimately saves the Jewish population of the Empire.

Today, we live in different but challenging times. The COVID Pandemic still is on the minds of many of us. It seems to have gripped our nation to the point that we think of nothing else, all the while missing the terrible and sinful culture that engulfs our society.

The Church today lives in a postmodern period that in many ways mirrors the very challenging and difficult times of the Church of the first Century. The government and today's culture have an uneasy, sometimes outright hostile, relationship with the church in many places. More Christians have died for their faith in the last 100 years than in all the previous centuries combined. *



"Eyes That Hear – Ministry with Deaf People." Pastor Guenzel studied American Sign Language through college and Seminary. His internship and first call were with Alpha Lutheran Church of the Deaf in Rochester, NY. He initiated interpreted services for the deaf at Trinity, Lansdale.



"What is it like to hear a hand? You have to be deaf to understand," wrote deaf educator, Willard J. Madsen, of Gallaudet University. Come and learn about the challenges of deafness, the "Deaf Culture," and even learn dactylology, (fingerspelling) and a few signs. There will also be tips on living with someone with diminishing hearing today – even yourself!



We will also spend some devotional time in remembrance of the tragedy of "9-11", now known as "Patriot Day"

Operation Christmas Child: 3 Ways to Make A Difference!

We invite you participate in on or two or all three of the opportunities to spread the Gospel and love of Jesus to children throughout the world through our annual shoebox project.

- 1. Come help pack shoeboxes for boys and girls ages 2-14 on Saturday, October 9 (rain date October 16) outside on the church lawn. We will begin setup at 9:00 AM and start packing sometime after 9:45. This is a good service project for middle and high school students, so invite young people to participate and experience how God and Holy Trinity serve throughout the world. We will especially need some strong arms first thing to help move supplies and tables outside.
- 2. Holy Trinity will once again be an area receiving church for shoeboxes from other churches and individuals. We will have daily hours—some afternoons, some evenings—from Monday, November 15 through Monday, November 22. There are a variety of jobs to fill.

If you can serve in any of the above ways, please contact Rosemary Hinkle or Nancy Ischinger.

3. Samaritan's Purse askes for a contribution of \$9/box to help defray shipping costs as shoeboxes are trucked to a packing center and are then placed on cargo planes to be flown to over 100 countries. Once there, they typically travel by some combination of boats/canoes, trucks, animals (horses, camels, elephants), and human heft to their distinctions. In addition to the personal boxes you pack, we hope to pack at least 240 boxes at our packing party and currently do not have enough money to cover the shipping contribution, so we ask for your generosity.

Last year, Holy Trinity packed 400 boxes...our highest number to date. This year, the need is greater as so many boxes were not packed last year. In fact, the number decreased to the 2013 level, and now church partners throughout Africa, Asia, South America, and both the Pacific and Caribbean Islands are begging for boxes. PLEASE consider asking family, friends, and neighbors to pack shoeboxes. You might take one of the boxes from the narthex and present it to someone to pack. Each box contains information about this project and a Follow Your Box label.






