May the Lord bless all of you and give you peace.



Prayers News of December, 2021



Our return to Congo from eye treatment in Nairobi, Kenya

From November 30th to December 20 we spent a challenged moment in Nairobi Kenya in relation to my health condition, but it was also a good opportunity to be with Drs. William and Margaret Obaga. They served as our host in Nairobi and took us to all the appointments we had in various places. This also enabled us to have a sight of the city of Nairobi. Even though my expectation was to lift my drooping left eyelid as recommended by my eye surgeons from the USA, a team of doctors in Nairobi arrived at different view. Consequently, the surgery was not done. They used other methods to improve my eye situation. We are so pleased that we saw the intervention of God in each of the steps taken for three weeks.

On the first week of arrival in Nairobi, we found time to partially attend two conferences organized by the All African Churches Conferences (AACC) at its Nairobi headquarters. The two conferences addressed by African scholars and ecumenical church leaders were 1. Symposium on Misleading Theologies, and, 2. Theological Education for Sustainable Growth in Churches and Society in Relation to Agenda 2063. Agenda 2063 is an African Union project on the process of acting and monitoring one century of postcolonial Africa's political and economic progress (1963-2063). The church's role is to be aware to guide Christians on social changes happening in African societies and also to mirror and evaluate its own progress and social influence in the continent during the same period (1963-2063). These themes were very rich in terms of how to engage with churches in Africa and to develop an effective theological curriculum and programs, like ours in Tshela, to help shape future theologians and church leaders who are effective for the church and impactful to African societies.

Visiting Theovision Offices in Nairobi

We also had a chance to visit Theovision offices in Nairobi on the day when WMPL and Theovision signed a memorandum of understanding for partnership in mission. We met with Helen Etyan, the director of Theovision-Kenya director and Pastor Bethuel Koskei, the missions director and it was an eye-opener and exciting as we learned about Theovision's programs and work in Africa. We realized that we need to partner with Theovision in order to have an audio-recording of the entire Bible in the Kikongo language, which is the main language of Congo Central where we serve. We made the connection with a plan that in August/September 2022 we will host a Theovision team from Nairobi who will visit Kongo Central (in the DRC) for the project of recording the Old Testament in Kikongo. We found out that Theovision had already audio-recorded the New Testament in the Kikongo. This is an exciting partnership and we look forward to this visit.

Women in abuse situations and orphans who are in our program were invited to worship with us on Sunday after the Christmas service. This was one way of fellowshipping and thanking God who kept us safe during the year 2021 in spite of Covid-19 that took many lives. Before the worship service at Sanzi, a strong whirlwind swept all the palm branches that we use as a shelter against the sunshine. Some rainfall followed the whirlwind and forced everyone to find refuge. After the wind and rain, we were able to return to worship, now in the open air. We worshipped God and celebrated the birth of Jesus. Our service included the Holy Communion given for the first time at this new site. Over 120 participants gathered, of whom 40 came from Boma and the rest from the local community. We praise the Lord that in few months this mission site will become a full congregation.

After the worship service we shared meals to celebrate the Christmas Day. We also donated school uniforms and shoes to our orphans who already attend school. Pray that God may stir the hearts of more people around Sanzi and that in the future people might be able to worship under a secure roof. Pray that the members joining this congregation may be able to build a church for themselves with available local materials.

204 Bibles for China!


That is how many Bibles your November contributions to Bibles for China will purchase through Asia Harvest for our brothers and sisters in China who are longing to hold and read The Word.



A Reborn Home for Homeless Single Women and Their Children



Many of you were familiar with Wayne Hall, the Sunday Breakfast Rescue Mission (SBRM) home for homeless single mothers and their children. Sadly, that shelter was closed in 2019 when SBRM had financial struggles.

Many were deeply disheartened about this closure and have worked tirelessly to reopen this Wayne Avenue home. Through the immense generosi-

ty of an Abington donor who purchased Wayne Hall from SBRM in 2021, this once vital ministry is reopening under new auspices. Now known as **Life Turning Point of Philadelphia**, this Christian ministry is hard at work as many volunteers help prepare the facilities to receive homeless women and their children in the months ahead.

Unfortunately, before the property was acquired, all mattresses, sofa and chair cushions, dining tables and chairs, office furniture, and infant and children's equipment and supplies were stripped out of the building which fell into some disrepair.

Under a new board of directors and returning Founder and Executive Director Rita Whitaker, Life Turning Point of Philadelphia has applied for 501(c)(3) status. The need is great for contributions to fully re-outfit the home right down to such items as linens and kitchen supplies. The women and children who come to Life Turning Point will have an opportunity to turn around their lives in ways based on biblical principles. They will be guided in taking responsibilities for maintaining the home, parenting their children in healthy ways, and securing education and/or jobs so that they can live independently. Their time at Life Turning Point will also include regular Bible studies.

Holy Trinity was set to support this new mission two years ago. However, securing the property took longer than anticipated, and during that time, the mission commitment fund was dissolved.

If you would like to provide support to help re-outfit this vital mission to return homeless women to productive society where they can provide a secure home for their children, please consider a contribution. While Life Turning Point of Philadelphia, an existing corporation, awaits receipt of their 501(c)(3), they are operating under the fiduciary cover of Philadelphia Leadership Foundation that is processing contributions on behalf of Life Turning Point. (The Philadelphia Leadership Foundation, run by former Mayor Wilson Goode, assists start-up non-profits.)


