From the Pastor

Dear Ambassadors,

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation ... Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God." (2 Cor. 5:17-20)

"Happy New Year!" is a phrase that by now, you have said and heard so many times, you might be getting tired of it. "Yea, sure, happy new year," you might say with a smug, "another new year with COVID and politics, and still no new pastor and . . .

Life can be discouraging, even as we face a new year. Yet, we are people of the New Covenant. We are people of New Life, we are people of the New Creation in Christ. 





The first item of business will be the adoption of Rules of Procedure. This adoption of Rules of Procedure has always been done at the outset of every denominational or synodical convocation (LCA, ELCA, or NALC).

This adoption needs only a simple majority and is done to make the meeting run smoothly. Among other things, The Rules of Procedure say that Holy Trinity's Annual Meeting will be governed by Robert's Rules of Order, that all speeches will be limited to three minutes, and that anyone can present a resolution but that this resolution must be presented in writing to the Committee on Reference and Counsel **by 3:00 p.m**. on the Monday immediately prior the Annual Meeting, **Monday, January 24th.** At the time each resolution is presented to the Annual Meeting, Reference and Counsel will advise the Annual Meeting as to whether or not the resolution should be adopted.

Copies of these Rules of Procedure & Forms for Resolutions are available in the Narthex.

Living Liturgy

The Peace

living **liturgy**

In the liturgy, the peace is a bridge between the Word and the Sacrament of the Altar. As the *Lutheran Book of Worship notes on the Liturgy* state, "The peace which enables people to live in unity and the spirit of mutual forgiveness comes only from Christ, whose Word has been proclaimed. Without the intention to live in such unity, participation in the sacramental celebration is a mockery. (Mt. 5:23-24; 1 Cor. 11)."

Since the time of the early church, the peace has been shared after the intercessory prayers, before the offering. The peace is thus both a response to the Word which has been proclaimed, and a preparation for the Eucharistic meal which will now be shared. The reconciliation and mutual forgiveness expressed in the peace are vital as we prepare to receive the body and blood of our Lord.

In the Service Book and Hymnal (1958), the sharing of the peace was simply between the pastor and people. The Pastor says: "The peace of the Lord be with you always," to which the people responded: "and with thy spirit." This was followed immediately by the Agnus Dei (Lamb of God).

With the LBW (1978), at the time of "The Peace" the rubrics state: "*The ministers and congregation may greet one another in the name of the Lord.*" Sharing the peace is therefore not really a time to engage in ordinary conversation and pleasantries – it is a time to extend God's peace to one another in the name of our Lord. Nor is it a time to walk away from your place in the pew to greet a fellow worshiper across the aisle or several pews in front or behind. It is not to be a disruptive social time of the worship.

Before the pandemic, people were accustomed to shaking hands. The Pandemic put an end to this. Currently, worshipers simply turn to each other and express the peace of the Lord. Many of the folk wave to each other with a smile. These are all appropriate ways of expressing the Peace of the Lord.

As we face the future, we might be sensitive about shaking hands at "the peace" and even after the Divine Service is concluded. Because of this, we might refrain from offering the hand at this time.

As we share the Peace of the Lord with each other in the Divine Service, let us remember that in Christ, we are people of the Peace of the Lord and let us live in peace with our families, our neighbors, co-students and co-workers, as we live out the days of the week ahead of us.

On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, **"Peace be with you."** John 20:19



"Take...the sword of the spirit, which is the word of God. And pray in the Spirit on all occasions." (Ephesians 6:17-18)

In spiritual warfare, Christians are armed not with "the weapons of the world" (2 Corinthians 10:4), but with weapons that God has given us, which have "divine power to demolish strongholds."
