Pastor Maurice Y. Lee Biography

Pastor Maurice Y. Lee lives in Lompac, California with his wife Beth. He was born in Central New Jersey while his father was working toward his doctoral degree at Rutgers University. Pastor Maurice moved around the country with his family from New Jersey to upstate New York, North Carolina, and then California, where he graduated from high school. Pastor Maurice attended Wheaton College, in Wheaton, Illinois where he graduated in 1987, with a Bachelor of Science degree in mathematics. He and Beth met at Wheaton. He moved to Pasadena, California where he attended the California Institute of Technology and graduated in 1996 with a Master of Science degree in computational neuroscience. From 1995 to 1998 he worked full-time as a technical writer for a software company.

Pastor Maurice and Beth have been married for 33 years. As a couple they became deeply involved in college age ministry and he felt the call to attend Fuller Theological Seminary where he earned a Master of Arts degree in Biblical studies and theology in 1998. Pastor Maurice and Beth moved to Connecticut where he pursued a doctoral degree in religious studies at Yale University, graduating in 21006. They moved to Massachusetts where he pursued post-doctoral theological studies at Harvard University.

Pastor Maurice and Beth moved to Santa Barbara, California, where from 2008 to 2015 he was an assistant professor of religious studies at Westmont College. In 2013, they played a leading role in establishing Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, an NALC mission congregation meeting on the Westmont campus. Pastor Maurice was ordained an NALC pastor in 2016. He has also been an adjunct professor of theology at the North American Lutheran Seminary since 2016. He will continue teaching NALS students online and will continue his work on various NALC committees.

CHOOSE WHOM YOU WILL SERVE



"Now therefore, fear the LORD and serve Him in sincerity and in faithfulness. Put away the gods that your fathers served beyond the River and in Egypt, and serve the LORD. ...Choose this day whom you will serve...But as for me and my house, we will serve the LORD!" Joshua 24: 15

You won't find any mention of making financial pledges in Joshua, chapter 24. Joshua doesn't speak of being a cheerful giver or even an uncheerful one. He simply asks, "whom will you serve?"

We kick off our Stewardship Season with those verses to encourage you to consider how and where you will serve our Lord at Holy Trinity. Because stewardship is about our lives, not just our money.

Joshua's last words to the nation of Israel recount their history. He reminds them how God won the battles against their enemies and helped them secure the Promised Land. Can you hear Joshua relaying the historical accounts of their battles? Like a soldier swapping stories with his buddies, Joshua might have said, "Remember the escape from Egypt? That was awesome! And remember that time when hornets attacked the Amorite kings?! How cool was that? How could you forget the hornets?!"

By recounting God's hand in their history, Joshua reminds the people of God's faithfulness. He tells the Israelites *who* they are and *whose* they are. Then he poses the question: "how will you now live? Who are you going to serve? Will you serve the **other** gods of this world, or will you serve the **living** God who brought you this far by faith?"

I ask the same of you today. It's more a question that if we believe in the ministry of this congregation, then we will find ways of investing in it. Stewardship is an expression of our commitment to serving the God who has called us, in Christ, to serve in this place.

Spiritual Gifts Packets are being sent out by email but hard copies will also be available in the Narthex. You can review the ministry teams and service opportunities. Mark the worksheet where you'd like to serve and place it in the Jehoiada chest during the **Spiritual Gifts Commitment Weekend of May 14 & 15**.

Back to the question at hand. Joshua challenges the gathered Israelites, "Choose this day whom you will serve!" We ask the same of you. As for me and my house...

This year marks 25 years of ministry at the *Cradle of Hope*!

The *Cradle of Hope* provides housing and support services for mothers and children who are facing homelessness. Currently we have two homes and six mothers with their babies. During their stay at the Cradle, we help

to provide financial aid for education and job training so that they will be able to obtain employment that provides a living wage. Our goal is that the women will be able to support themselves and their babies when they graduate from our program. We have weekly classes on budgeting, parenting, life skills, as well as a Bible study. Over the past 25 years, we have had **109 mothers and 114 children (some twins)** come through our doors. In the past three years, 79% are employed and living in their own permanent housing. God continues to work in our midst to empower & encourage these young mothers in the midst of their difficult circumstances.
