Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I was a relatively late inductee into the Lutheran tradition, and the particular room of the Lutheran house that I entered through didn't do much with saints' commemorations. At the same time, as the *Lutheran Service Book* quotes the Augsburg Confession, our churches "teach that the remembrance of the saints is to be commended in order that we may imitate their faith and good works according to our calling" (art. 21).

Such commemoration is only possible, and only makes sense, in the light of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the founder and perfecter — the original saint — of our faith (Hebrews 12:2). Lutheran remembrance of the saints isn't necessarily complicated or formal, although that's also appropriate. But it's a way of recognizing that we live our Christian lives not as hermetically-sealed-off individuals but as part of a communion that embraces countries and centuries — "spread out through all time and space and rooted in eternity, terrible as an army with banners," in C. S. Lewis's formulation (*The Screwtape Letters*, letter 2).

And who wouldn't be excited, looking over the traditional commemorations for July and August — some of which, by the way, we share with Roman Catholics? There are the usual suspects, great Biblical figures and — sometimes we forget — actual people: the siblings of Bethany, Mary and Martha and Lazarus (July 29); James the apostle (July 25); Joseph of Arimathea (July 31); Mary the mother of the Lord (August 15). And then there are those whose obedient reflection and reflective obedience shaped by the word of God still echo where the church pays attention to its own history: Augustine of Hippo (August 28) and his mother Monica (August 27); Bernard of Clairvaux (August 19); and — how cool is this? — the great Lutheran theologian Johann Sebastian Bach (July 28).

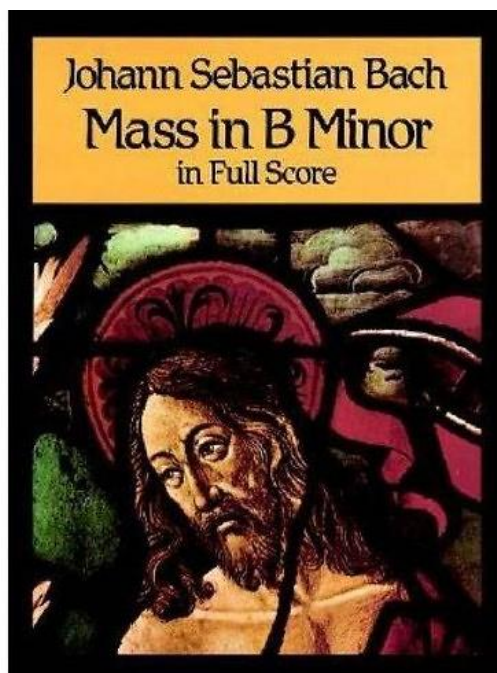

I like to tell a story that I originally heard from the Yale historian Jaroslav Pelikan on the old public radio show "Speaking of Faith." Pelikan was a friend of the prominent Harvard paleontologist, evolution popularizer, and agnostic (or perhaps atheist) Stephen Jay Gould. They were apparently both once involved in an interview about contact with extraterrestrial civilizations. Gould was asked (Pelikan said) "about communication with other planets and other worlds, and how should we try to reach people who don't know our language or anything else. And he [Gould] said: 'We should play the Bach B Minor Mass and say, in as many languages as we can, "This is the best we have ever done, and we would like you to hear it, and we'd like to hear the best you have ever done.'" And so he would want blaring across our solar system and beyond the B Minor Mass, including *Credo in unum Deum*."

The Mass in B Minor may be the best humanity has ever done — it wouldn't take much to convince me — but we Lutherans will remember that every composition of Bach's was signed off, so to speak, with the inscription "S.D.G.": *solī Deo gloria*, glory to God alone. Our recognition of our fellow saints should always be similarly directed.

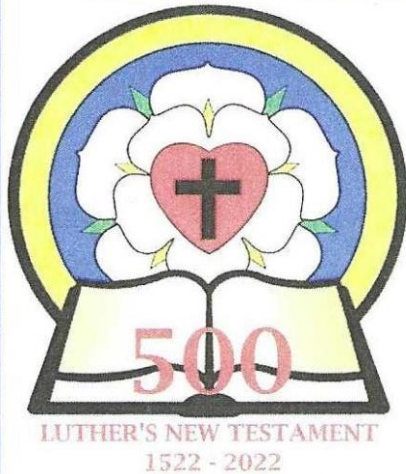

CELEBRATE THE 500TH ANNIVERSARY OF LUTHER'S NEW TESTAMENT TRANSLATION!

Following the Diet of Worms in 1521, Luther's territorial ruler, Frederick the Wise, had Luther hidden away for safekeeping in the castle at Wartburg. Luther settled down and translated Erasmus's Greek New Testament in only eleven weeks! This is a phenomenal feat under any circumstances, but Luther contended with darkened days, poor lighting, and his own generally poor health.

Das Neue Testament Deutzsch was published in September 1522. A typographical masterpiece, containing woodcuts from Lucas Cranach's workshop and selections from Albrecht Durer's famous Apocalypse series, the *September Bibel* sold an estimated five thousand copies in the first two months alone.

This would become the **FIRST SERIOUS TRANSLATION OF GOD'S WORD** from the original Greek text into the common language of the people since St. Jerome's Latin Vulgate a 1,000 years earlier. This German Bible helped solidify the Reformation for it not only promoted literacy among the populace, but enlightened the laity with the direct saving Gospel message of God's Word in Jesus Christ. The rest of the complete Bible translation including the Old Testament from the Hebrew was published in 1534, preceding the King James English translation by more than 75 years.

Let us celebrate this 500th anniversary year of Luther's New Testament translation by reading through the New Testament this year, for if you have a Bible that you can read in your own native tongue that is God's gift through the impact of the Reformation! Also, encourage others - family, friends, and strangers to do the same by gifting them a copy of the Bible - free Bibles are available in the Narthex - please take one to share!

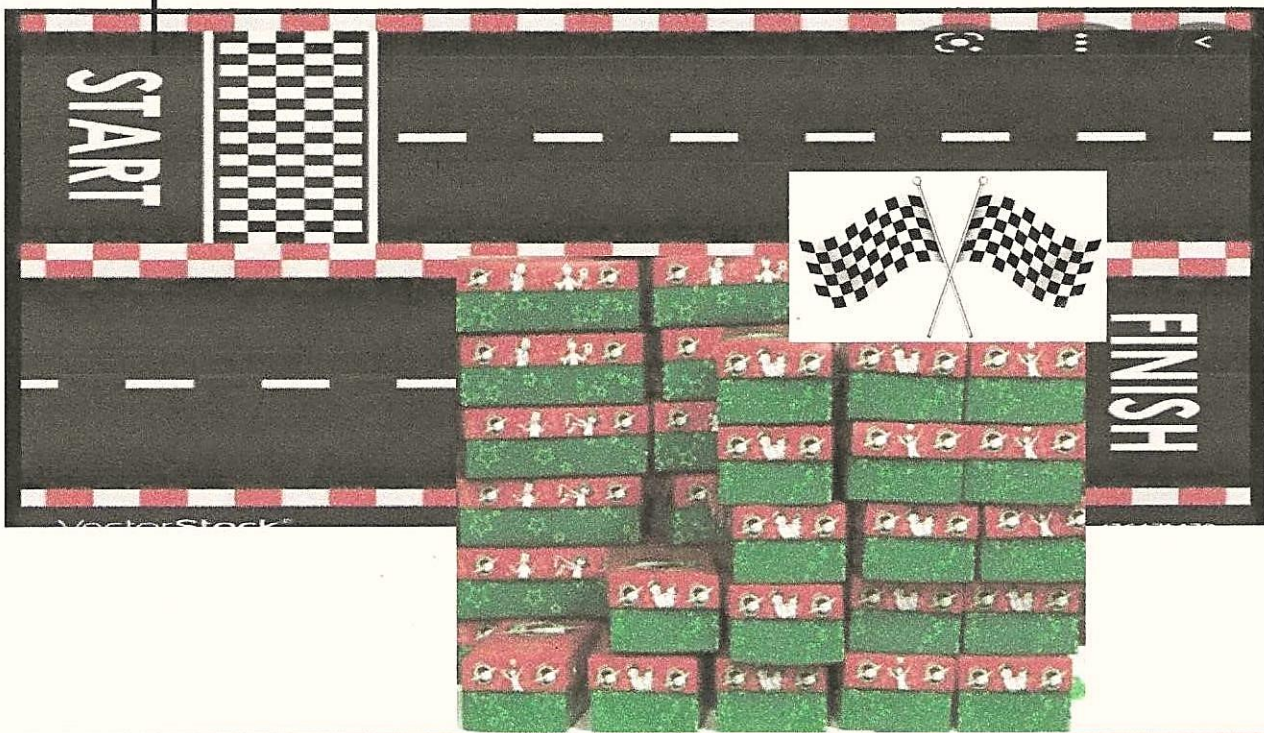

We Need You To Pack Individual Shoeboxes In addition to our October church packing party

When you pack a shoebox, don't see a box. See the face of each child who will be given your box. First "your children" will experience such happiness at receiving gifts they have never before had, and this physical experience will help



make the love of God palpable for them. They will always remember and treasure the bar of soap and washcloth they no longer have to share, the actual cars and trucks instead of pretending with stones and bricks, the actual dolls or stuffed animals instead of making them from wrapped leaves.

Next, they will be offered *The Greatest Journey* course where they will learn about the love of God and Jesus through the Gospel stories. Family members will become curious about this God who made it possible for their children to receive gifts and will want to come to church with their children and learn more.



Packing shoeboxes blesses both YOU to become a world missionary right from Holy Trinity AND the children and their families who are brought to the feet of Jesus.

IF you have filled shoeboxes in the past, PLEASE keep doing so this year.

- you have not filled shoeboxes, may this be your first joyful year of helping to bring children to Jesus.
- you packed boxes in the past, please consider doubling or tripling your efforts this year.
- you love this ministry, ask family, friends, and neighbors to pack boxes too!

Coming to our Narthex Soon: A supply of shoeboxes with informative brochures tucked inside. As you pick up boxes for yourselves, consider taking extras and asking others to participate.

As you shop for your shoeboxes, consider both Quality and Quantity:

Please FILL boxes (but not overflowing) so that volunteers at processing/inspection centers will not have to search for appropriate filler gifts.

About Quality, if it is not good enough for your children, then don't include it. For example, no plastic water bottles with BPA.

Include a WOW item in every box you pack, such as a special doll with clothes, a larger stuffed animal, a deflated soccer ball and inflation needle, a jewelry making kit, a top to pump and spin, a Lego kit or a backpack.

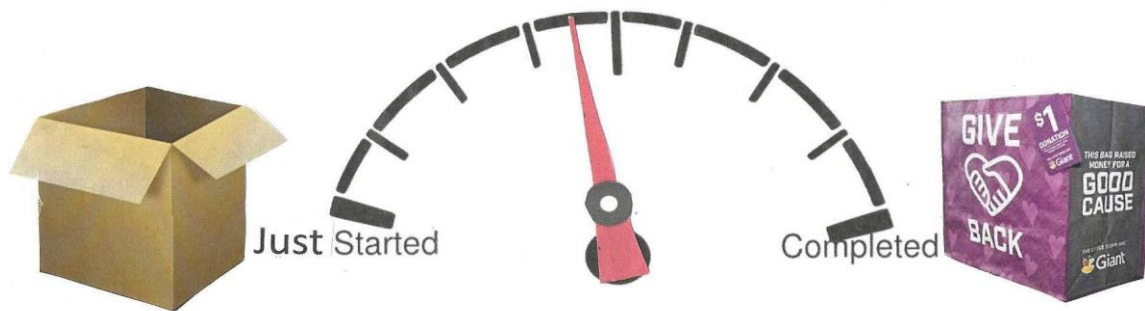

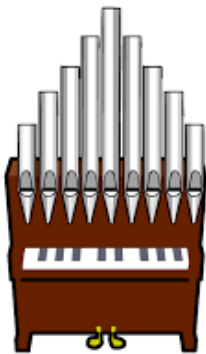

CHURCH COUNCIL

The church council at the June meeting voted to approve the construction of a handicapped ramp connecting the front entrance of the sanctuary with the parking lot. The council also approved concrete pavement work in the Bread of Heaven area and sunken pavement in the front sidewalk. A copy of the detailed motion is in the Narthex. The ramp project includes the reverent and respectful relocation of soil containing cremains from one area of the Memorial Garden to other areas of the Garden. The property committee and council have studied all aspects of the project for at least one year and believe this particular design option is the best one under our circumstances.

★ HANDICAPPED ACCESS PROJECT ★

A model and line drawings depicting the new ramp providing access from the parking lot to the church's portico doors will be on display **after Sunday worship on July 10th in fellowship hall.** Jim Necker will be there to answer questions about the plan.



The re-leathering of the reservoirs of our pipe organ is scheduled to begin the week of June 27th. Over the course of the next weeks and months our organ builder will refurbish these critical components of the organ that have worn out and require attention. We should have some ranks of the organ working during the project unless some presently unforeseen problem occurs.

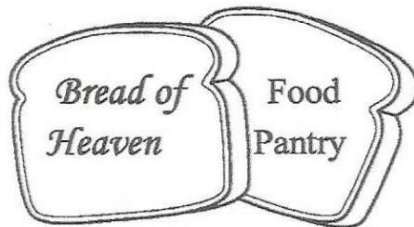

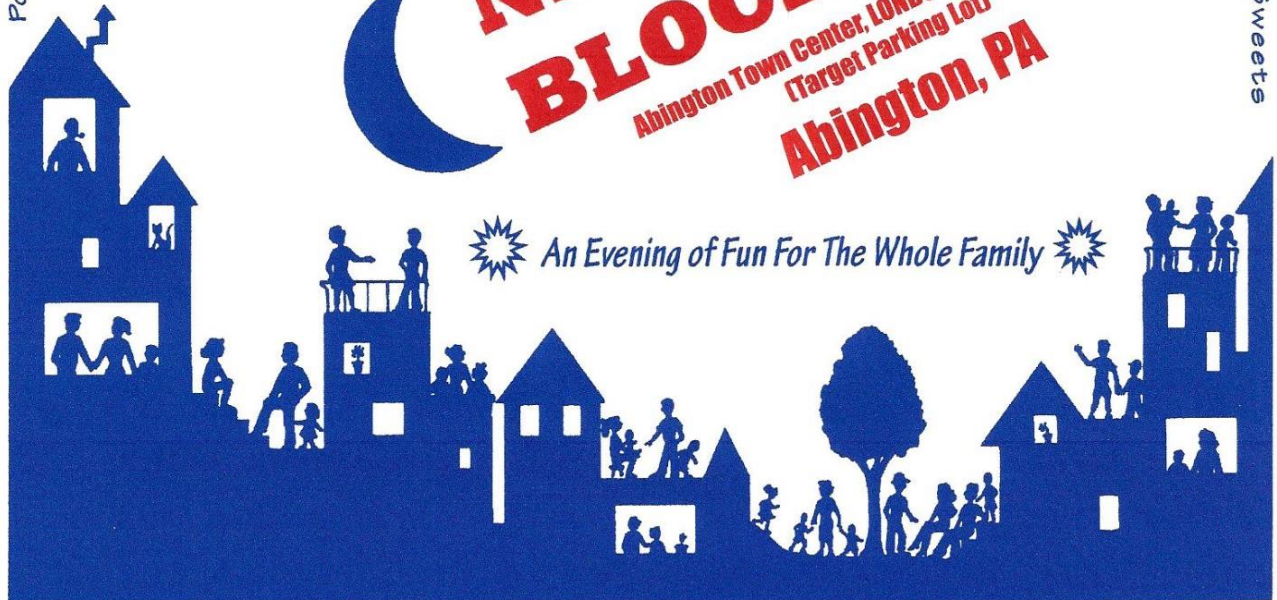
