From the Pastor

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

The difference between the liturgical or "church" year, which begins on the first Sunday of Advent, and the Gregorian or "civil" year, which begins on January 1, can feel a bit confusing. (Not as confusing as the yearly determination of the date of Easter, but that's another topic entirely.) By the time a new civil year comes into view — with fireworks and resolutions and new wall calendars — we've already been celebrating a new church year for at least a month — anticipation has risen high and been met; Jesus has been born of Mary; and now we're waiting for wise men from pagan nations to show up, that they might bow before the King of the Jews.

This difference — what some call the distinction between "sacred" and "secular" time — is a good thing. The way the church tells time, the way the church tracks the changes of days and weeks and seasons, is not the same as the secular culture's (even if we also have to use secular rhythms and live in the secular world). Despite the church's minority status in society, and despite the pervasive dominance of non-Christian and indeed anti-Christian thinking, the church year is not a subset or a servant of the civil year. The civil year is an empty container, a bare skeleton, meaningless in itself, to which meanings must be attached: deadlines, goals, momentous beginnings (like birthdays) and endings (like death days), and so forth, the patterns unique to each person and group. But the church year invites us into a drama with unfathomable depth and with universal significance: one that did not originate with us who share in it, one that isn't simply made up as we go along, one that doesn't fade away into a forgotten past, one that is directly relevant to every person everywhere, and yet one with a specific, describable plot: the drama of Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with his Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.



In an 1938 essay, "The Greatest Drama Ever Staged is the Official Creed of Christendom," British novelist Dorothy Sayers wrote:

"The Christian faith is the most exciting drama that ever staggered the imagination of man — and the dogma is the drama. ... That God should play the tyrant over man is a dismal story of unrelieved oppression; that man should play the tyrant over man is the usual dreary record of human futility; but that man should play the tyrant over God and find Him a better man than himself is an astonishing drama indeed. Any journalist, hearing of it for the first time, would recognise it as News; those who did hear it for the first time actually called it News, and good news at that" (*The Greatest Drama Ever Staged* [Hodder & Stoughton, 1938]).

It's true (thank God) that "staging" that drama by way of the liturgical year, from Advent 1 through Christ the King, is not a requirement of faith. The church calendar is not a Biblical commandment or program. Quite the opposite: the church calendar is a way of being led back to the Bible, of being reimmersed in the scriptures, of being shaped as worshippers and as believers and as truth-tellers by the word of God. And what a gift that such a thing may happen to us together.




Holy Trinity Family,

The first item of business will be the adoption of Rules of Procedure. This adoption of Rules of Procedure has always been done at the outset of every denominational or synodical convocation (LCA, ELCA, or NALC).

This adoption needs only a simple majority and is done to make the meeting run smoothly. Among other things, The Rules of Procedure say that Holy Trinity's Annual Meeting will be governed by Robert's Rules of Order, that all speeches will be limited to three minutes, and that anyone can present a resolution but that this resolution must be presented in writing to the Committee on Reference and Counsel by 3:00 p.m. on the Monday immediately prior the Annual Meeting, Monday, January 16th. At the time each resolution is presented to the Annual Meeting, Reference and Counsel will advise the Annual Meeting as to whether or not the resolution should be adopted.

"Whoever is slow to anger is better than the mighty, and he who rules his spirit than he who takes a city." Proverbs 16:32

In 2 Timothy 3, the apostle Paul defined some of the characteristics that would be true of society as the world gets closer to the time of the return of Christ. One of those characteristics is "without self-control." In much the same way as our society lacks persistence, it also lacks the ability to say no. And that is precisely what self-control is; knowing when to say no. It is the strength to not act on impulse or not to indulge when you know you should not.

In this month's study we will look at four areas in which we need to exercise selfcontrol; of our appetites; of our tongues, of our tempers; and of our thoughts.
