From the Pastor,

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

Recently I was provoked by a comment from Irish theologian and pastor William J. Abraham (1947–2021), who lived in the United States for most of his professional career:

"It is surely one of the enduring puzzles of the contemporary American church that so many people wander in and out of its communities and buildings without ever finding their feet as healthy disciples of Jesus Christ" ("On making disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ," in *Marks of the Body of Christ* [ed. Carl E. Braaten and Robert W. Jenson; Eerdmans, 1999], 151).

If that really is the case, Abraham goes on to say, then perhaps a church in which people are not being formed and trained as disciples of Jesus *should not be called a church at all*.

Strong language. Was Abraham speaking the truth? He clarifies: "I am thinking of discipleship here ... in terms of taking up one's cross and following Jesus Christ. The disciple ... is one who suffers in a way that echoes the suffering of the Lord." And (although Abraham was not a Lutheran) he finds support for this line of thinking in Martin Luther himself. In 1539 Luther wrote:

"The holy Christian people are externally recognized by the holy possession of the sacred cross. They must endure every misfortune and persecution, all kinds of trials and evil ... by inward sadness, timidity, fear, outward poverty, contempt, illness, and weakness, in order to become like their head, Christ. ... Wherever you see or hear this, you may know that the holy Christian church is there" (*On the Councils and the Church*).

The suffering, the cross, of discipleship to Jesus will no doubt look different in different contexts. We in this country — unlike many of our fellow believers elsewhere — are not (yet) in a widespread situation of having our lives, livelihoods, or indeed even comfort threatened because of our allegiance to Christ and to his gospel. Some might say that precisely that — not being persecuted — has simply made our problem — not being disciples — worse. But neither is our unfamiliarity with such suffering really new. Recall what an anonymous pastor wrote to his congregation almost 2000 years ago:

"In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood. ... Therefore lift your drooping hands and strengthen your weak knees, and make straight paths for your feet. ... Let us be grateful for receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, and let us offer to God acceptable worship, with reverence and awe" (Hebrews 12:4, 12–13, 28).

We're not to go looking for persecution. What we're to go looking for is *Jesus*. Hardship may be — it must be — a mark of our being disciples, but only because we're disciples of Jesus, Jesus who was crucified. In this season of Lent we have, as God's family, the opportunity once again to learn the cross, to come under the tutelage of scripture, to discover who we're meant to be in obedience, to worship the living God with reverence and awe. Let's continue to read our Bibles, pray for one another and the world, serve our neighbors, and come together as Christ's pilgrim people.


Thanks to our volunteers Marilynn Murphy, Steph Templeton, Noreen Weld and Ann Frey for their dedication and energy in organizing this event!

On behalf of all the staff at Christ's Home, we want to thank you for your ongoing support in purchasing items for the Children who live on our campus. There are so many ways in which your donations have directly helped our children this past year:



Weighted Teddy Bears: The weighted teddy bears bring together several things that have a soothing effect on a child's mind and body. Weighted, cozy objects apply deep pressure to the body and can help a child feel calm and organized. Additionally, plush toys offer kids comfort, companionship, and a sense of security. This is a pretty powerful 'toy' that can enhance a child's well-being.



Educational Games: The Runio Hero stacking game for example helps develop fine motor skills and eye-hand coordination, concentration and attention span, kinesthetic awareness, social integration, and group/family bonding.



Clothing/Other Apparel: Adolescents' self-concept is most strongly linked to their sense of physical attractiveness and body image. Although designer clothes such as Calvin Klein jeans may not be necessary, it builds confidence with our young people so when they attend school they fit in with their peers and feel good about their appearance.

As you can see, you are making a difference in the lives of our children in many ways. More importantly, you are helping them along their journey of healing and wholeness. We cannot thank you enough for your commitment and outpouring of generosity to Christ's Home.



March Update

Can You Sponsor the Education Of An Orphan or A Seminarian?

Bless you Holy Trinity for the many sponsorships that have been given. As of February 22, we have received 12 sponsorships for elementary students, 5 sponsorships for middle/high school students, and 2 for seminarians.

We have also received generous, undesignated funds.



These children should be in school, learning so that they have a chance to grow and develop like our own children.

These funds are sent from Holy Trinity to World Mission Prayer League where they are disbursed to our missionaries Didi and Seraphina Panzo in the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

It requires \$120 to sponsor an orphan to attend primary school for one year and \$150 to sponsor a student to attend middle or high school for one year. That amount includes school fees, uniforms, and supplies.

It costs \$150 a semester to sponsor a seminarian who feels God's call to study and spread the Gospel.

If you feel God laying either or both of these sponsorship opportunities on your heart, then you will be asked to commit to one entire year at a time for the children and one semester at a time for the seminarians. Didi is providing names and photos of children and seminarians through Rosemary Hinkle.






