From the Pastor,

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

As I write this, it's not even February (I'm late, Deb, but not *that* late). We're still almost a month away from the season of Lent, and, of course, further still from Holy Week and Easter. But, having recently participated in a meeting of the Worship & Music Committee, I've been reminded of our liturgical traditions — and not just ours — in those most sacred times of Holy Trinity's life together.

One of those traditions is the Easter Vigil — as our Roman Catholic friends call it, the *Easter Vigil in the Holy Night*, or, as our Eastern Orthodox friends call it, the *Paschal Vigil* — celebrated during the evening, or even deep in the night, before Easter Sunday morning.

This extraordinary worship service has a history that goes back to ancient times. The great African bishop and theologian Augustine was preaching about it, and preaching at it, more than 1600 years ago. In one of those Vigil sermons he said:

"Human thought, contemplating the reality [of Christ's death and resurrection], confesses to the Lord. Meanwhile, human memory does not cease to celebrate solemn anniversaries, so that thought will not be condemned as ungrateful. That's where the splendid and famous solemnity of this night fits in. Keeping vigil, it is as though we were re-enacting the Lord's resurrection by way of our memory, even if we know that it actually happened only once in history" (Sermon 220; cf. Edmund Hill's translation, *Sermons 184–229Z*, in The Works of Saint Augustine [New City Press, 1993]).

All Christian worship, of course, has its ground and meaning, not in the abstract fantasies of our imaginations — however pious those might be — but in God's mighty works in our earthly space and time, including the incarnation of the eternal Son, his proclamation of the promised kingdom, his unswerving obedience to his Father's will, his death for the sin of the world, his victorious, vindicating resurrection, and his giving of the Spirit of power to the church.

And the Easter Vigil is, we might say, a kind of liturgical distillation of *all* those works as an amazing, complex, coherent, directed unity — from the creation of the universe to its consummation, previewed in Jesus' rising to new life following his crucifixion.

If Christian worship is our participation, by God's grace, in a story which we did not originate, of which we are not the leaders, and in which we are not the main characters, but which, nevertheless, tells us who we are, why we're here, and what we're hoping for, then the Easter Vigil is the one service in which we're given a sense of the whole picture, the entire narrative; and given a sense not merely in terms of intellectual information — as great as that is — but in terms of living within it, living *because* of it, via word and sacrament. And when I characterize it in that way, I mean *even more than on Sunday morning*, without taking anything away from the beauty and importance of Sunday morning.

I will have more to say — not that I can say enough, or even that *saying* is what is called for most — about the Easter Vigil. But as we move from the glow of Christmas and Epiphany toward the depths and heights of Lent and Easter, it seemed appropriate at least to start discussing why and how we celebrate this service at Holy Trinity.





Can You Sponsor the Education Of An Orphan or A Seminarian?

Our missionaries to the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Didi and Seraphina Panzo, minister to orphans living in a nearby orphanage as well as some children living with grand-parents who cannot afford their care. They also connect with Lutheran seminarians who desire to serve the Lord but are struggling with insufficient funds to pay for their education.



These children should be in school, learning so that they have a chance to grow and develop like our own children.

It requires \$120 to sponsor an orphan to attend primary school for one year and \$150 to sponsor a student to attend middle or high school for one year. That amount includes school fees, uniforms, and supplies. It costs \$150 a semester to sponsor a seminarian who feels God's call to study and spread the Gospel.

To date, Holy Trinity has sponsored 7 students for a year and one seminarian for a semester.

3 2nd graders 2 7th graders

3 3rd graders 4 8th graders

5 4th graders 4 9th graders

9 5th graders

If you feel God laying either or both of these sponsorship opportunities on your heart, then you will be asked to commit to one entire year at a time for the children and one semester at a time for the seminarians. Didi will provide names and photos of children and seminarians and supervise the output of money to meet costs.

Special Prayer Request from Our Brother and Sister in India

The following is from Pastor Martin Luther in the state of Andhra Pradesh, India. Some may recall that Holy Trinity Women sent their thank offering to him several years ago to feed the hungry, including those relegated to a leper colony...yes, they still exist.



An anti-Conversion bill is scheduled to come before the Supreme Court on February 7th. The BJP (Bharatiya Janata Party) **Government is** completely Anti-Christian.

- 1. It has abolished and cancelled thousands of Christian organizations. Lakhs and millions of the poor beneficiaries were badly affected and went into hopelessness. (You may remember that Compassion International was kicked out, stranding 40,000 formerly supported poor children.)
- 2. The radical Hindu organizations are directly attacking Christian churches in many places, beating the Christians, pastors and their families, and destroying the church properties.
- 3. The Indian Hindu Government has finally decided to file a case in the Supreme Court against Christian conversions. If the bill is passed, the Christian Church throughout India will face many problems like never before. The Hindu Government under the Modi Administration is trying to bring out many laws against Christians, especially against Gospel work at the village and street level. We Christians in India are praying, I request you please pray for the judgement that is going to come up on February 7th.

We live for the sake of the Gospel. We are the poorer sections that are called Christians and mostly the servants of the Gospel of Christ in India. In many ways, we are targeted by the higher sections of Hinduism. We are restricted from enjoying the benefits that are provided by the government in terms of getting government jobs, educational opportunities, social acceptance, etc. We are vulnerable to easily face persecution because of the poor financial and social conditions of our communities. In such situations, your love, concern, and prayers are a great blessing, providing encouragement and strength for us.


