#### From the Pastor,

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

I'm writing this exactly two weeks before Maundy Thursday, the day during Holy Week especially given to recalling the momentous commandments and actions accompanying Jesus' establishment of his Supper.

The chief such commandment is of course recorded in the Gospel of John: "As I have loved you, so you are to love one another" (13:34). One of the most important theologians of the twentieth century, the late Pope Benedict XVI, described the Lord's Supper in terms of this far-reaching instruction:

"The breaking of bread is a gesture of hospitality, through which the stranger is welcomed into table fellowship. In the sacrament of the Eucharist we enjoy the hospitality of God, who gives himself to us in Jesus Christ, crucified and risen. Thus *caritas*, care for the other, is not an additional sector of Christianity alongside worship; rather, it is rooted in it and forms part of it. The horizontal and the vertical are inseparably linked in the Eucharist, in the breaking of bread" (*Jesus of Nazareth, Part Two* [Ignatius Press, 2011], 129–130).

How strange — how incomprehensible — and yet how life-changing that, in this meal by which God gives himself, in the body and blood of the Son, to us, we should also be given to one another, to make up that very same body. "We who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread" (1 Corinthians 10:17).

Coming to church and participating in worship isn't a matter of "what we can get out of it": learning something from the sermon, getting uplifted by the music, enjoying forgiveness for the past week's sins. Such things may indeed happen. But even if they do, they are strictly secondary to what's really going on: we're being made, again and again, and more and more, into servants of the living God, and therefore into friends and supporters of one another.

The secular culture can only scoff at such foolishness. The real way to get things done, it will say, the way to make *progress*, is to use human inventions: power politics, threats of violence, "smart" technology, programs of self-improvement. Invoking a spectral deity and repeating a dumb little ceremony with bread and wine — look up the probable origin of the phrase "hocus pocus" — is childish fantasizing at best, playacting in place of behaving like actual enlightened adults.

We can see, in our contemporary social and international situation, where "adult" behavior has gotten us! In any case, the value judgments placed by secular authorities on the church generally and on the Eucharist in particular are of very little significance. (The more Christians *worry* about what the world is thinking, the less distinguishable we become from the world.) Our call is instead to hear the word and to live it, to do what Jesus told us in obedient remembrance, to tell the truth about God and his love for his creation, to worship the Lord as we were designed to — and all of this together.

In this season, may we be led by the Spirit along that way of life ... and resurrection.



Weighted Teddy Bears: The weighted teddy bears bring together several things that have a soothing effect on a child's mind and body. Weighted, cozy objects apply deep pressure to the body and can help a child feel calm and organized. Additionally, plush toys offer kids comfort, companionship, and a sense of security. This is a pretty powerful 'toy' that can enhance a child's well-being.



**Educational Games:** The Runio Hero stacking game for example helps develop fine motor skills and eye-hand coordination, concentration and attention span, kinesthetic awareness, social integration, and group/family bonding.



Clothing/Other Apparel: Adolescents' self-concept is most strongly linked to their sense of physical attractiveness and body image. Although designer clothes such as Calvin Klein jeans may not be necessary, it builds confidence with our young people so when they attend school they fit in with their peers and feel good about their appearance.

#### Topic: Pearls from Proverbs: The Pearl of Wholesome Speech

"Those who guard their mouths preserve their lives; those who open wide their lips come to ruin." Proverbs 13:3 NRSV

"Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words will never hurt me." The idea behind this recitation was to deflect another child's angry words, pretending that they were of no concern at all. But was it true? Probably even the children knew it

was not. Words may not break bones, but they certainly have the power to crush

one's spirit, lower one's self-esteem, and break one's heart.

But words can also encourage, build up, and give life. Words can be used to rouse people to action, to comfort people who grieve, to instruct people in right ways. Perhaps no other single subject receives as much attention in Proverbs as our speech. To better understand what Proverbs teaches about speech, we will look first at the unwholesome use of words and then at the wholesome use of words. We will delve into scripture for examples of gracious words so that our words are like beautiful gold apples in silver settings, honoring to God.

  one at a time to learn the countries where each box has been delivered.


It appears so far that some of those destinations include Cameroon, Dominican Republic, Madagascar, Paraguay, Ukraine, and even Hard to Reach Areas.



#### Penn State Abington Jubilee Report 2023

From Ray Wiesen, Coalition of Christian Outreach at Penn State Abington



27 students attended Jubilee and of that number, twelve students were not following the Lord. Some students came because they are seeking, while others came because their friends invited them. Students loved their gift bags from Holy Trinity and are so thankful for the letters they received and the prayers! The bus broke down for two hours on the way to Pittsburgh, so students had fun playing with their card games, crossword puzzles, and Mad Libs. The snacks especially helped students who could not afford such treats over the weekend. So far, I have been able to connect with four students who are not Christians and talk with them about their Jubilee weekend. One student, Trevor, is starting to read the Bible to learn more

about Jesus. He grew up in the church but his faith has never been his own. Over the weekend, he heard about Jesus in a new way and he now intends to grow more in his faith.

Another student who is not a Christian, Matthew, wanted to go to Jubilee because his experience with Christianity has been pretty negative until he met our group last semester. After he that, he realized that we are not hateful and judgmental and started attending a bible study where he asked questions that led to him coming to Jubilee. While at Jubilee, Matthew learned that Christians are actually really nice and that God is loving and kind. Matthew said he wants to learn more about Jesus. Although he is very skeptical, he is interested, so please keep him in your prayers.

Boris, another student who is not a Christian, grew up in China and came to America for high school. He is now here for college and came to Jubilee because most of his mentors since he got to America have been Christian and he thinks that religion is important. He just does not know enough to make a decision or even if he believes. For him, Jubilee was helpful to experience what it looks like to be a Christian since he met a lot of Christians but has never really been to church or a worship session.

Nana grew up in an African home where she felt Christianity had been forced on her since birth. She has been fighting Christianity because she never had the chance to choose God on her own. When Nana got invited to Jubilee, she jumped on the opportunity and at Jubilee, her faith was solidified. She said she finally felt like her faith became her own and not her family's and it was just more natural rather than forced.

Deo, who is the president of our group and from Indonesia, has never been to a conference like Jubilee because less than five percent of Indonesia has ever heard the gospel and it is dangerous to share it there. Deo loved being able to worship with thousands of believers from all around the world and from all different races and backgrounds. He learned that his faith and relationship with the Lord is more important than education and his career. Deo grew up in a very academic-focused home, so it has been all he cared about. But from going to Jubilee, he is learning that all those things matter, but they are not the only things that matter. Deo hopes to use his degree in computer science to bring people to Christ, and that was not really a thought before attending Jubilee.

These are just some of the stories. I will be connecting with more students in the weeks to come as they process the weekend.
