Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

Certain things slow down, in a sense, for churches — at least for our church, traditionally — during the summer. Our cornucopia of Sunday school classes takes a break; our longstanding women's circles go on a sort of vacation; our council suspends its monthly meeting schedule until September; and so forth. Not everything stops, of course; we have plenty of activities and ministries that either keep going or actually come into their own in the summer. But the overall rhythm of church life feels a little different, perhaps a bit less hectic.

There's something appropriate about that change, I think. It's an expression, at a larger scale, of the cycle of work and rest practiced throughout both our days — no one could or should work literally around the clock — and our weeks the rush of business yielding regularly to the respite of being "off." As is well known (or ought to be well known!), this weekly rhythm harks back to the movement between six days and Sabbath, which, according to the scriptures, is a matter not of mere human convention but of primordial divine institution, not suggested but commanded to the chosen people.

The mandated break, the Sabbath, is not purposeless. It's not for "doing nothing." The Sabbath is for *God*: for worshipping God, for hearing God, for knowing God. This means, in the case of us Christians, that, because Jesus is the completion of the Sabbath commandment, as he is the completion of all the law, the vision of reality embedded in the commandment remains intensely relevant. In the *Large Catechism*, Luther insisted:

"At whatever time God's Word is taught, preached, heard, read, or pondered, there the person, the day, and the work is hallowed, not on account of the work but on account of the Word.... I constantly repeat that all our life and work must be based on God's Word if they are to be God-pleasing or holy. Where that happens the commandment is in force and is fulfilled."

To the extent that the summer season represents a kind of break from the usual pace and (potentially) from what is, too often, the misdirectedness of our worldly lives to that extent summer is a time for *more* worship, for *more* prayer, for *more* scripture, not for less. That doesn't necessarily translate to showing up at church constantly, as if under some classroom-style requirement. (Although you're always welcome!) But it does translate to drawing near in faith, holding fast to our hope, and stirring one another to love, not neglecting our regular gathering in the light of the final day (Hebrews 10:22–25).

A high government official recently proposed that, more than just one month of "Pride," Americans should celebrate a whole summer of "Pride." In clear, complete, and uncompromising contradiction to such insanity, Christians should instead celebrate a summer of humility, of obedience, of self-giving, of turning from the arrogance and narcissism taught by our age to the worship and the service of the true God who gives himself to us in Jesus Christ and who has made us partakers of his Holy Spirit.




beautifully framed and inscribed photo of my family playing music with me. Everything was just so perfect and special and I am still feeling overwhelmed by it.





Maybe These Were One of Your Shoeboxes!

Chief Says No to Jesus



In a village in Benin where voodoo statues prevailed, Samaritan's Purse tried to distribute shoeboxes but the chief said, "We don't want your Jesus here." So for the next year, church leaders prayed regularly. The following year, Samaritan's Purse came again with the shoeboxes and this time the chief allowed them to distribute the gifts to the children in his village. His 5-year-old grandson received a box containing a pair of size 13 shoes, the chief's size. These shoes so thrilled him that he announced that the workers could now bring Jesus. It is notable that no one in the processing center, where shoeboxes are inspected before leaving the country, changed **the age.**

As Bombs Explode Around Ukrainian Church

During a shelling in one area, families had to shelter in a church basement for 15 days. Shoeboxes had arrived early but had not yet been given out. The boxes were opened, and the children discovered toothbrushes and flashlights as well as school supplies that enabled them to continue to learn in their underground shelter. Especially remarkable, one box contained a tool that was used to fix the generator as bombs went off around the church.

Dirt Road Divides Muslims and Christians

In an African village with one dirt road in and out, Christians live on one side and Muslims on the other side. For years, neither group spoke to one another. Then Samaritan's Purse came with two cartons full of shoeboxes and decided to open them in the middle of the road. Children came from both sides and received their boxes. They went home and told their parents about Jesus who had been shared with them at the shoebox distribution. Next, something amazing happened. The children started gathering to pray together with their shoeboxes, and that made the adults realize it was time to make changes. The Muslims opened a well for the Christians to use and allowed the Christians to build a church on their side.

Notable

- There are places in the Middle East where the only way Jesus can be shared is by giving the children shoeboxes.
- Currently, there are an estimated 960 million children between the ages of two and 14 in the receiving world. In 2022, 10.5 million shoeboxes were sent from the United States, the U.K, Germany, Korea, Australia, and New Zealand.
- Every person who has packed shoeboxes enabled Samaritan's Purse to reach 100 million children in their first 17 years of ministry. Ten years later, they had given out 200 million shoeboxes. That is 200 million Gospel opportunities, but the number of those reached is even greater as shoebox gifts bring entire families to Jesus.


