From the Pastor

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

Are we living in the end times?

The typical reactions to that question remind me of something C. S. Lewis wrote in the preface to *The Screwtape Letters* (1941):

"There are two equal and opposite errors into which our race can fall about the devils. One is to disbelieve in their existence. The other is to believe, and to feel an excessive and unhealthy interest in them."

Much the same, I think, could be said of talk about "the end times."

A number of Christians, looking at what's going on in the world — and, to be fair, what's going on the world, the way it's typically reported, can often seem pretty "apocalyptic" (in the degraded sense of that term) — try to correlate that with the results of reading Biblical prophecy in certain crude ways. The conclusion of many is that, within the next few years, according to a certain fixed schedule, believers must disappear en masse from earth, the one-world government must take over, and the great tribulation must begin, before Christ returns to bring history to its close.

This is what I would call an excessive and unhealthy interest in "the end." Similar fevers have gripped Christian groups many, many times in the past — around the year 1000, for example, and at other times of disaster, war, and widespread social and economic disorder. To repudiate such "apocalypticism" run amok is humbly Biblical. "Concerning that day and hour no one knows" (Matthew 24:36). "The Lord is patient, wishing, not that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance" (2 Peter 3:9).

However, *there is another* — *equal and opposite* — *error*. And that is not to be interested at all in "the end."

Many Christians, including many Lutherans, seem to be content to live as though there were no Biblical teaching about where history is going, what the creation is meant for, who and what the goal is of all God's ways and works. Their only concern — one formed more by secularism, ironically, than by scripture — is "going to heaven when I die." But, besides being unbiblical, that has nothing to do with the end.

When the Bible speaks of the end — for example: "Then comes the end, when he delivers the kingdom to God the Father after destroying every rule and every authority and power" (1 Corinthians 15:24) — it means the fulfillment and culmination, in Christ, and in the Father's good time, of God's whole project of creation, election, redemption, and renewal, and it has to do with the entirety of what God made: heaven and earth, all things visible and invisible.

That's the point of the Bible; that's the meaning of salvation; that's what's anticipated in our worship; that's the claim made by the gospel; that's the horizon that gives health and hope to Christian living, loving, obeying, and serving.

We *are* living in the end times. Because in these times — perilous for many, who need our prayers, and a temptation to complacency for others, who need repentance — God is showing us what he means to accomplish in Jesus, and is shaping us by it.

The Asia Bible Fund is our key need. We have printings in the Lisu, Lahu, Akha, Karen and Wa languages of northern Myanmar (Burma) coming up soon, but are lacking funds so any help would be greatly appreciated. Each full Bible costs an average of \$3.00.







Convocation Recap

Saint Paul Lutheran, York, PA

October 13 & 14, 2023

Seventy-eight disciples of the Atlantic Mission Region gathered over two days at Saint Paul's Lutheran Church, York, PA on October 13 & 14, 2023 for the annual regional Convocation. The theme for this year was "Lifeto-Life Discipleship in Action." Seventy-six gathered in person and six attended virtually.

Presentations were made by the General Secretary of the NALC, the **Rev. Dr. Amy Little,** who lead a plenary session about the NALC's Life to Life Disciples process and how we can instruct the young and old in becoming disciples of the faith using the Small and Large Catechisms of Luther. **The Rev. Ray Scheck** led the assembly in demonstrating how to lead a discipleship Bible study.

The 2024 Ministry Spending Plan was approved. The assembly approved the \$63,950 Ministry Plan as presented.

Lutheran Lay Renewal was the spotlight Ministry Partner this year. Bill Oehlschlager, Executive Director if LLR and Pastor Raymond Kaija, Lutheran Church of Uganda (LCoU) spoke to the assembly about LLR and the work they do with the LCoU. The group has helped raise funds to enable churches to buy land, fund health clinics, and support missionary and ministry training programs. There are indeed good works and discipleship happening with LLR and LCoU.

Financial gifts were given to the Lutheran Lay Renewal (\$1400) and Disaster Response (\$1400). The NALC also received \$500 from the AMR as an honorarium for the work done at this Convocation by our General Secretary the Rev. Dr. Amy Little.

We heard a presentation entitled **Our Journey through Life to Life Discipleship – What Worked... and What Didn't,** which was led by members of Emanuel Lutheran, Elmer, NJ; Holy Cross, Nazareth, PA; St Matthew, Middle River, MD; and Reformation, Lancaster, PA. The members shared their journey using Life to Life Discipleship and how it has helped members to be strong disciples of Jesus Christ.

Stuff the Truck for NALC Disaster Response! The truck was filled with health kits, school kits, flood buckets, blankets, Bibles, rakes, shovels, and gift cards. THANK YOU! All donations were taken to the warehouse in Elmer, NJ. Thanks to Wayne Knerr for towing the trailer and all who helped to load the donations.

Worship: We opened the Convocation with a traditional Eucharist with the Rev Paul & Rev Sally Gausmann presiding and our assistant to the Bishop, the Rev. Dr. Bill White, preaching. The Rev. Brett Jenkins led us in Compline on Friday evening. We opened Saturday with a contemporary Eucharist with the Rev Paul & Rev Sally Gausmann presiding and the Rev. Dr. Amy Little preaching.

Mission District Meetings: The assembly broke into Mission Districts on Friday night and enjoyed fellowship with each other.

Fellowship! There were plenty of opportunities for fellowship at this year's Convocation. There was scheduled free time for networking and to visit the Ministry Partner and vendor displays. We also enjoyed a cupcake social on Friday evening where we celebrated the Rev. Steve Shipman, our AMR Regional Dean's 50th anniversary of ordination.

Informal Bible Study: Mr. Bill Oehlschlager from Lutheran Lay Renewal led an informal Bible study on Friday morning for anyone interested in attending before the Convocation began.

Women's Conference: The Women of Atlantic Mission Region held their fifth Women's Conference on Friday morning in which they worked together to assemble 234 health kits for NALC Disaster Response. They also had sharing time, worship, and a Bible study led by the Rev. Dr. Amy Little.

The 2024 AMR Convocation will be held on October 18-19 at St Luke's Lutheran Church in Bloomsburg, PA. A **Women's Conference** is also being planned for October 18 prior to the Convocation. Mark your calendars!







James and John - The Sons of Thunder

"Just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." (Matthew 20:28)

There is much the Bible doesn't tell us about this second set of fishermen siblings. Some people suspect James may have been the older of the two, since James is usually listed before John. Other people speculate that because James and John could afford to hire workers to help them in their fishing business, they must have been a prosperous family (Mark 1:20). This month we'll leave speculation for the experts and look instead at what the Bible reveals about these men: in particular, the transformation that took place in the brothers who Jesus nicknamed the "Sons of Thunder."
