From the Pastor

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

Preparing for a discussion last month, I spent time with an article by the brilliant historian of Christianity Robert Louis Wilken. The whole article is worth reading — consider this, from the last paragraph: "The greatest gift [the church] can give our society is a glimpse, however fleeting, of another city. ... If someone who wanders in as we pray does not feel uncomfortable, something is terribly wrong" — but one of its most arresting aspects is simply the title: "With Angels and Archangels."

Wilken observes that the major Christian liturgies, drawing on scripture, make an astounding claim: "When we come before God to offer our praise and adoration, we do so in the company of angels and archangels and the whole company of heaven." He quotes the great hymn known as the Te Deum, but he could just as easily have used the words that we of Holy Trinity hear before singing "Holy, holy, holy" every Saturday and Sunday: "With all the choirs of angels, with the church on earth and the hosts of heaven, we praise you name and join their unending hymn...."

In our discussion, I asked something akin to: "What if this is really true?," and the looks I got were as much as to say: "Of course it's true! How could you doubt it?" But if it is true — if angels are not figments of our religious fantasizing, not our hyperactive readiness to find intelligence behind every rock and tree, but are, instead, invisibly present as our worshipping elder cousins and companions — then many of our secular habits of thinking and acting are in trouble.

Angels, perhaps surprisingly, are *not* behind every rock and tree in the Bible. They appear in the story relatively sparingly. But when they do appear, something incalculable and unpredictable is happening. For example: "Behold, you will conceive and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. ... He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end" (Luke 1:31–33). (This, naturally, is why it seems appropriate to bring up angels as we move into the season of Advent!)

One of the most remarkable features of Biblical angels is the energy they give to drawing attention *away* from themselves. The seraphim of Isaiah 6, the warrior Michael of Daniel, the heavenly host of Luke 2, the annunciators of Revelation who repeatedly tell John, "Don't worship me!": all are finite, dependent creatures; but their focus, by words and actions, is consistently outside and other than their own individual benefit. Their entire being, one might say, is in serving and exalting God. (Those who are interested only in themselves are called no longer angels, but demons.)

And that is why, as Wilken says, "the church has always known that when the people of God lift their voices to worship, they join a hymn that was going on before they opened their mouths and continues after the last echoes of their songs have given way to silence." The basic, natural, fulfilling "place" for angels is in worship — and in this they are leading the way and displaying the destiny of the rest of creation, including us humans.

We are not, of course, in the image of angels; we are being conformed to the image of Christ. But the angels, our cousins, clarify what that image means and where it's headed: the eternal worship of the triune God in the city not built by human hands, in the kingdom without end.



We discuss the common or "ordinary" parts of our Eucharistic liturgical order as an integrated, dramatic, formative unity.


The final session for the year is scheduled for Wednesday,

For the Annual Congregational Meeting, Sunday, January 28, 2024 immediately following worship.

At Annual Meeting this year, **Sunday, January 28, 2024** the first item of business will be the adoption of Rules of Procedure. This adoption of Rules of Procedure has always been done at the outset of every denominational or synodical convocation (LCA, ELCA, or NALC). This adoption needs only a simple majority and is done to make the meeting run smoothly. Among other things, The Rules of Procedure say that Holy Trinity's Annual Meeting will be governed by Roberts Rules of Order, that all speeches will be limited to three minutes, and that anyone can present a resolution but that this resolution must be presented in writing to the Committee on Reference and Counsel by 3:00 p.m. on the Monday immediately prior to Annual Meeting. At the time each resolution is presented to Annual Meeting, Reference and Counsel will advise the Annual Meeting as to whether or not the resolution should be adopted. Copies of these Rules of Procedure and Forms for Resolutions are available in the Narthex.




IN THE STUDY:


Starting Sunday November 26th


