From the Pastor,

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

Through the last seven months, we've been assisted in worship by a variety of visiting organists: musicians who will typically come on Sunday morning — occasionally having gotten familiar with our instrument earlier in the week — rehearse the choir, play the service, and then leave, usually not to come back, although a number of these colleagues have played for us multiple times.

I've often called these visitors *guest organists*. This isn't meant to be marketing-speak, as, for example, a department store might call its customers "guests" to divert attention from the coldly transactional nature of the relationship. It rather implies two things: first, that these contributors to our worship, since they *are* guests, are to be *treated* as guests, which is to say, with respect, appreciation, and hospitality, not as merely part of the "background" to our fellowship; and, second, that the Holy Trinity community of which we ("regulars") are members is indeed our home, in which together we have the privileges and responsibilities of being at home: mutual support, encouragement, and correction; joint prayer, service, and mission; suffering with those who suffer and rejoicing with those who rejoice; making sure that the place is clean, supplied, and livable; welcoming and witnessing to "outsiders."

We take our cue not from warm and fuzzy feelings — although I'm excited and in complete agreement when people speak of being "at home" here — but from the word of God, which calls the church of worshipping believers a *household* (e.g., Galatians 6:10, Ephesians 2:19, Hebrews 3:6). It is, those scriptures imply, precisely because we the church are a household, a home, that those things which can and should happen in a home can and should happen with us: honest and helpful judgment; faithful learning and service; upbuilding and unity.

And yet, in another and perhaps equally important sense, we are (like our visiting organists) guests. Because, although we are definitely "at home" as Holy Trinity Church, the home where we are is fundamentally and exclusively *God's*. Those same scriptures make it clear that it is God who — in Jesus Christ and by the power of the Holy Spirit — is the sole owner, builder, maintainer, defender, head, law-giver, life-giver, source, and goal of the household of faith. We are God's guests, which means that we are residents of God's home and members of God's household by invitation, by mercy, by the work of Christ and the Spirit rather than by our own merit, achievement, or initiative. And for that we may be, and we will be, eternally grateful participants in the ministry of God's house.

The 17th-century English poet George Herbert put it this way:

Love bade me welcome. Yet my soul drew back
Guilty of dust and sin.
But quick-eyed Love, observing me grow slack
From my first entrance in,
Drew nearer to me, sweetly questioning,
If I lacked any thing.

A guest, I answered, worthy to be here:
Love said, You shall be he.
I the unkind, ungrateful? Ah my dear,
I cannot look on thee.
Love took my hand, and smiling did reply,
Who made the eyes but I?

Truth Lord, but I have marred them: let my shame
Go where it doth deserve.
And know you not, says Love, who bore the blame?
My dear, then I will serve.
You must sit down, says Love, and taste my meat:
So I did sit and eat.
