From the Pastor,

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

A book on my shelves, *Marks of the Body of Christ*, an excellent ecumenical collection of lectures edited by Carl E. Braaten and Robert W. Jenson (Eerdmans, 1999), has, at the beginning, something amusingly called "In Place of a Preface." The idea is that the editors, instead of writing their own original introduction to the collection, have put in another author's work. (It's not plagiarism, because they identify who wrote it and where it came from.)

I've once before done something similar for this space in the *Echoes*. And now, again, since I was recently reflecting with our Council on the same work that Braaten and Jenson put in front of *Marks of the Body of Christ*, I'll slurp part of that in here, with gratitude:

The Children's Creed teaches us that a Christian holy people is to be and to remain on earth until the end of the world. But how can a poor confused person tell where such Christian holy people are to be found in this world?

First, the holy Christian people are recognized by their possession of the holy word of God. This is the principal item, and the holiest of holy possessions, by reason of which the Christian people are called holy; for God's word is holy and sanctifies everything it touches.

Second, the Christian holy people are recognized by the holy sacrament of baptism, wherever it is taught, believed, and administered correctly according to Christ's ordinance. That too is a public sign and a precious, holy possession by which God's people are sanctified.

Third, the Christian holy people are recognized by the holy sacrament of the altar, wherever it is rightly administered, believed, and received, according to Christ's institution. This too is a public sign and a precious, holy possession left behind by Christ by which his people are sanctified so that they also exercise themselves in faith and openly confess that they are Christian.

Fourth, the holy Christian people are recognized by the office of the keys exercised publicly. That is, as Christ decrees, if a Christian sins, he should be reproved; and if he does not mend his ways, he should be bound in his sin and cast out. If he does mend his ways, he should be absolved.

Fifth, the church is recognized externally by the fact that it consecrates or calls ministers, or has offices that it is to administer. There must be bishops, pastors, or preachers, who publicly and privately give, administer, and use the aforementioned four things or holy possessions in behalf of and in the name of the church.

Sixth, the holy Christian people are externally recognized by prayer, public praise, and thanksgiving to God. Where you see and hear the Lord's Prayer prayed and taught; or psalms or other spiritual songs sung, in accordance with the word of God and the true faith; also the creed, the Ten Commandments, and the catechism used in public, you may rest assured that a holy Christian people of God are present.

Seventh, the holy Christian people are externally recognized by the holy possession of the sacred cross. They must endure every misfortune and persecution, all kinds of trials and evil from the devil, the world, and the flesh, by inward sadness, timidity, fear, outward poverty, contempt, illness, and weakness, in order to become like their head, Christ.

South Asia Travels

Dear Friends,

My wife, Lois, and I are concluding a trip to South Asia as I write this. We're in the car in a police convoy of armored vehicles, and police with automatic weapons, in open pickups escorting us back to safer places. Fortunately, our security is in God alone.

We've just attended the board meeting of Christian Hospital Tank (CHT), an organization in Pakistan that WMPL has partnered with for many years.

It had been twenty-one years since I last attended a board meeting there, and it was nice to meet the hospital director/CEO, Dr. Nadeem Masih. It's lovely to see how Dr. Nadeem's competence as an administrator has helped the organization develop its ability to meet its financial and non-financial management obligations.

Tank, Pakistan, located in the Western part of the country in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Province, is an insecure, remote, and hot location, away from the conveniences of life that many local and expatriate staff come from. Staff make sacrifices to be there, and as a staff member shared with me: you can't be there and tolerate the environment unless you recognize God's calling to be there. I thanked them for all they were doing to enable those treated at the hospital to experience the love of Jesus Christ.

I shared a brief message with the CHT board, management, and staff. I encouraged them to continue loving patients and forgiving each other as work tensions generally rise in such a challenging environment.

While there, I played the national sport of cricket one evening, after the board meeting, with one of the CHT doctors and several staff children. It's an excellent way to connect!

During this trip to South Asia, Lois and I had the chance to visit several WMPL partners in Kathmandu, Nepal, India, and Pakistan. Everywhere we went, dedicated workers shared the Good News and reached out to those who had never heard it.

Thank you for your gifts that bring Jesus's love in very tangible ways to people around the world. Please let us know if you have a skill or gift that the Lord might use to expand his kingdom. There are some fantastic opportunities for workers to become involved.

Thank you for giving, praying, and being the light that Jesus calls us to be.


Templeton Project

Builders of the Church: The Women of Romans 16

"And now, friends, we ask you to honor those leaders who work so hard for you, who have been given the responsibility of urging and guiding you along in your obedience. Overwhelm them with appreciation and love!" (1 Thessalonians 5:12-13)

The book of Romans contains some interesting information on the formation and growth of the early church. Romans 16 gives us a window to see the early congregational leadership - and nearly a third of those leaders are women! Paul takes time in his letter to add his own "shout-outs" to important people. He personally names several women who played important roles as ministers, apostles, missionaries, preachers and patrons. At least one was even a prisoner for the gospel. These women worked in partnership with men serving in roles to influence their communities with God's love and salvation through Jesus Christ. Each name represents the life of a unique person and her efforts over many years to support Paul's work to spread the gospel. 
